- Old Business
 - Vote to approve last meetings minutes approved
 - Events since last meeting:
 - Charleston Wrap fundraiser net \$3,800
 - Fall Fest
 - K-2nd grade parents came in for craft, local farm donated apples for snacks, parents were excited to come into the school and see kids
 - \$375 spent

■ Book Fair

- Week long Scholastic book fair, timed with Literacy Week and open on Literacy Night which worked well, great volunteers
- Net \$2,400 in cash plus an additional \$1,000 in Scholastic Dollars to fulfill teacher wish lists

■ Teacher Mini-grants

 Every year we put aside funds for teachers to apply for grants for classroom supplies and learning materials 13 teachers applied and all were fulfilled - school paid half and PTA paid half (PTA's portion \$1,456). (Thank you cards from teachers and their students shared at meeting)

- Week long event led by Morgan Maul, Julie Dantes & Meghann Salerno
- Net \$3,212 (similar to LY)
- Staff Appreciation Holiday Breakfast Tuesday before December break Jill Kubetz and Aleksandra Kardwell chaired the event, Ammirati's provided buffet breakfast, staff enjoyed opportunity to sit down together before holiday, timing worked well

Parent Workshop-Tech Talk and Book Club – Jan 9th w/ Dr. Kardaras

- 50 people attended, many purchased the book
- Parent book club afterwards on Feb 4th wasn't very well attended, busy time of year and many families were sick
- Should we do a version for students before summer?
- Explore another topic for the next parent workshop (ideas that have come up have been: anxiety in kids, and nutrition).

New Business

Community Family and Kid events:

- Open Gym Nights First one on Feb 14, well attended, kids played old school games like kickball, dodgeball and knock out; kids loved being in the High School, organized schedule by age, 40 kids attended, next one is this Friday, Feb 28
- Open Skate at Greenport Roller Rink March 9 includes all ages, free skate rentals
- Spirit Night at Urban Air March 21 (conference day) 20% of proceeds go to PTA, open to public no limit on attendees

o Fundraisers:

■ NoFo Neighbor cards (ongoing) - brought in half of projection so far, expire in June, recently promoted to Middle School and HS

- Square1 Art Fundraiser Is coming up run by Mr. Costello, students' art projects printed on mugs, keychains, etc; arrive before Mother's Day, flyers sent out in March
- No color run this year, many community races during this time of year (possibly next yr)
- June End of Year basket raffle is in the planning phase. Aleksandra Kardwell is spearheading.

School based events:

- Math Night Mar 25, 6-8pm PTA setting up a table with math games, providing refreshments, mini math-related basket raffles - one for younger kids, older kids, and family; each attendee gets a free ticket and additional tickets for sale
- STEAM night April 8 PTA will do a States of matter table and a Lego table,
 CE colored slime take-home. That night will also be the 3rd grade recorder show, Art Show and Science Fair
- Laser Light assembly March 14, space theme, need a dark space
- School Dance April 4 6th graders picked glow-party theme, all grades younger kids come early and older kids later, reserved DJ, PTA now has a popcorn machine and Molly has a cotton candy machine that can be used.
- Tuck Night Jr (5th and 6th grade) May, need parent volunteers, kids play games, ice cream party after
- Field day June 11 working on tshirt design, 6th graders select design and signatures go on back, PTA needs to place the full school order by May 1 so that the shirts arrive in time for field day.
- 6th grade luncheon June 25 usually planned and run by 6th grade parents, need volunteers
- 6th grade graduation June 25 at HS at night on the same day, reception usually run by 5th grade parents so they know what to expect for next year

• Treasurer's Report

- As of January 15 Checking account balance \$55,000
- \$30,000 in reserve is on target
- Budget moves
 - Accountant fees were paid and we took the \$350 surplus and moved to STEAM night
 - Color run budget was redeployed \$1,500 to basket raffle and \$1500 to year end party
 - \$250 left from discount card budget, \$45 left from Trunk or Treat and \$112 left from parent tech talk redeployed to Family night budget (WINGO, math night, open gym)
 - Student program budget was \$5,000 took \$1,000 and moved to Spring dance budget, \$1300 allocated to Laser light assembly, \$2,300 remaining if something comes up

- Mr. Connolly and Ms. Anderson from the Board in attendance
- Review challenges we are anticipating in the next few years
- All decisions are made in support of the mission
- Priorities
 - Fiscal responsibility anticipating cuts in State aid (Foundation Aid Cuts), we receive \$2M in state aid per year, anticipating losing \$1.3M per year soon due to election cycle and declining enrollment
 - Demographic shifts/Student needs
 - Enrollment Decline
 - Solution/Next Steps opportunity to do things differently
- Commitment to maintaining robust/diverse programs we are similar to other districts our size; our offerings are above and beyond what is required by law
 - 17 AP course offerings
 - 49 HS electives

- 8 support classes
- 39 sports teams 12 combined with other districts
- 36 secondary clubs
- Anticipated Foundation Aid cuts
 - Reserves are well funded but limited in what we can use
 - Exploring using reserves when state aid cuts occur
- Demographic Shifts/ Student needs
 - ENL: In 2012 we had 4% ENL students and we had 14% ENL in 2024
 - Hispanic population now 30%
 - Added specialized teachers and classes to support

■ Economically disadvantaged

- 2012 15% qualified and in 2024 30% are considered economically disadvantaged
- Supports food pantry, free lunch

■ Special Education

- 2012 14% and 2024 16% trend mirrors NYS
- AP results improving significantly
 - 2021 128 AP students, 75% scored 3+
 - 2024 140 AP students, 92% scored 3+
 - More Special Ed and ENL students in AP classes in the past which shows the strength of the supports offered
- Enrollment significant decrease in enrollment, will be difficult to maintain programs
 - Class sizes Kindergarten is currently 63 students and 12th grade is 91
 - District enrollment 2012 it was 1,481 and in 2032 it is projected to be 777
 - Secondary (7-12 grade) enrollment in 2012 was 837 and by 2032 it is projected to be 337
 - What is causing the decline?
 - Nationally People are getting married later and having fewer children
 - Local real estate prices risen dramatically difficult for young families or first-time homebuyers
- Opportunities

- Work with neighboring districts on adjustments and new efficiencies
 - Busing students for academic programs i.e. physics, however will lose academic time
 - Online/virtual class offerings
 - Sharing teachers Greenport and Southold share a music teacher, Our Physics teacher teaching 1.5 classes in Greenport
 - Merge secondary schools
 - Merge into one districts
 - Many benefits and challenges to each proposal. Examples:
 - Benefits shared resources, maintaining programs
 - Challenges sports teams, transportation time, legacy, school identities, fear of job security, no guarantee of additional state aid, mergers have never been undone

Next steps

- Board determines direction
- Investigate options for studies
- Explore partners
- Perform the study class offerings, facilities, staffing, transportation, tax rates, board structure
- Review and share findings with stakeholders
- Districts plan together
- All involved board vote on a plan
- All boards present to the plan to their communities for a vote
- Supervisor Petretti is sharing the information to start the conversation and is open to questions and discussion

- Bully Prevention Survey starts Thursday, we will be able to compare results to
 LY and the impact of having the curriculum in place
- Care Committee invite parents to join, we have community members and teachers but need more parents, next meeting is March 18

- Student Cares committee monthly during morning meeting on Thursday all ages, calling it the Kind Club which was a Kindergartener's idea
