Application Deadline: To Be Announced

Amount: \$500.00 Award for two (2) students

The Lighthouse Center Advocating for Adolescence and Children, Inc.(TLCAAC) Scholarship Fund was created to provide career-minded individuals the opportunity to receive funding for \$500.00 to help purchase textbooks.

Eligibility

1. Be a high school senior who will be registered in a university or college for the 2022 Fall semester.
2. Be 18 years of age or older.
3. Applicants must be U.S. citizens.
4. Have a grade point average of 3.0 or better (on a 4.0 scale).
5. Complete an application and include a 500-word essay.

The Lighthouse Center AAC, Inc. Scholarship Awards are awarded without regard to race, sex, religion, age, national origin, or sexual orientation. The Lighthouse Center AAC, Inc. will not award scholarships to applicants who are not qualified and reserves the right not to award a scholarship in a given year.

The Lighthouse Center AAC, Inc. The Board of Directors will select the scholarship winner. No member of the Lighthouse Center AAC, Inc. Board, or their immediate family, shall be eligible for scholarship assistance during their tenure on the Lighthouse Center AAC, Inc. Board.

The Lighthouse Center AAC, Inc. shall notify the chosen scholarship recipient(s) of its decision. The recipients will meet and take photos with the Board of Directors. All scholarship checks will be made payable to the university for the student.

Incomplete scholarship applications will not be reviewed. Students will not be notified of incomplete applications. Making sure the application and all required information is complete is the responsibility of the student. Completed scholarship applications must be submitted no later than the posted due.
