Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday marks the conclusion of the liturgical Christmas Season with the Solemnity of the Lord's Baptism. (Although traditionally, Christmastide lasts until February 2nd, concluding with the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord.) Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River signifies the beginning of His public ministry. On this feast the Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation, or epiphany, as Jesus descended into the river to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget children of God. This feast also reminds us of the power of Baptism and the responsibility it bestows on each one of us to live our Catholic Faith!!

As we begin a new year, there are some ongoing concerns and changes to mention regarding our parishes. Firstly, the long time sexton/building and grounds manager Ken Garrepy submitted his resignation to me before Christmas. We thank Ken for his more than 28 years of service at Our Lady of Good Help and since 2015, at St. Theresa Shrine and Cemetery. Ken accepted a new position at St. Thomas More Parish in Narragansett. Please join me in wishing Ken well in his future endeavors. In the meantime, there are a few temporary replacements in place to fill the void. However, in the near future, we will begin the search for a more permanent replacement to manage our parish properties, including St. Patrick's in Harrisville.

Secondly, as we begin a New Year, it is apparent that the burden to sustain multiple churches is becoming more challenging pastorally and financially. The ongoing pandemic, inflation and the lack of overall support complicates the situation. For instance, the Christmas offertory at St. Patrick's did not break \$1,000. (The cost of heating the church building alone runs close to that amount every few weeks!) In the weeks and months ahead, I will be meeting with officials of the Diocese of Providence to discuss implementing a more comprehensive plan for the church in Northern Rhode Island. As I have stated on many occasions, we must continue to be proactive in order to further the mission of the Church. In the interest of transparency, I will keep you posted on further developments as needed. God bless,

STATEMENT BY BISHOP TOBIN REGARDING NEW COVID "MANDATES" IMPOSED BY THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND.

As it has from the beginning of the pandemic, the Diocese of Providence will continue to cooperate fully with state directives regarding the response to the pandemic.

Accordingly, I encourage Catholics of the Diocese of Providence to follow state guidelines and to wear a mask whenever they are attending Holy Mass, and other church services or public programs.

At the same time, no individual should be turned away from Mass or singled out if they choose not to wear a mask. Such individuals may have good and substantive reasons for not doing so. In addition, in keeping with our approved policies, liturgical ministers, (e.g. priests, deacons, ministers of Holy Communion, altar servers, cantors, choir members,) are not expected to wear masks while actively participating in the liturgy.

As I have done on multiple previous occasions, I strongly urge all Catholics of the Diocese of Providence (clergy, religious and laity) to receive approved vaccines as soon as they are eligible to do so. Being vaccinated is a commitment to the common good, an act of charity for our brothers and sisters, and an expression of our respect for the dignity of human life.

As we prepare to celebrate the special hope and joy of the Christmas Season, let us renew our fervent prayers that Almighty God will lift this terrible pandemic from our midst and will give healing, comfort and peace to all.

STATEMENT BY FATHER McMAHON, PASTOR OF OUR LADY OF GOOD HELP PARISH/ST. THERESA SHRINE, & ADMINSTRATOR OF ST. PATRICK'S HARRISVILLE, RI.
