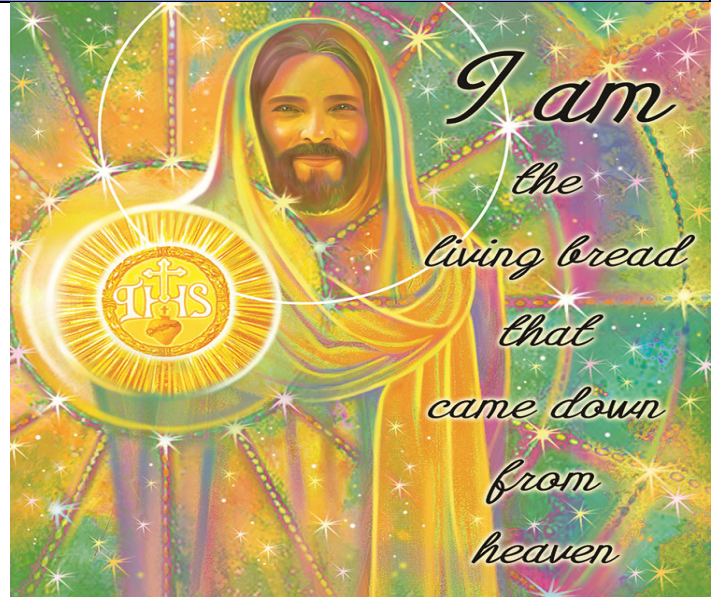

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the beautiful Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that: *"The Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life.' The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself."* (1324).

The Eucharist constitutes *"the Church's entire spiritual wealth, that is, Christ Himself, our Passover and living bread. It is the "Sacrament of Sacraments" and through it "the work of our redemption is accomplished."* Jesus Christ who is the "living bread that came down from heaven" assures us that *"whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink."*

This year, Corpus Christi may have a more profound meaning in our lives. With the pandemic and the recent shutdown of public Masses, many of us were unable to receive the Eucharist. It created within us a spiritual hunger, a reminder of how easily we can take this gift for granted.

As we celebrate this feast, let us approach Our Lord with great faith, devotion and solemnity. When we attend Mass, we are not attending a banquet or any mere public gathering. Rather, we are present at the real sacrifice of Christ at Calvary, receiving his body and blood which provides nourishment to our souls and the spiritual food that prepares us for Heaven! What a great privilege indeed!

- **The Annual St. Theresa Shrine Feast Day** scheduled for August has been canceled due to restrictions on public gatherings.

Reminders about reopening the parish for public Mass.....

(1.) For now, we are only permitted to allow 25% of fire code capacity at each church building. This means no more than 100 people at OLGH and 70 at St. Theresa’s Church buildings respectively.

(2.) The “six foot rule” is being implemented regarding seating and the reception of Holy Communion. Pews are cordoned off with tape accordingly.

(3.) The obligation to attend Mass has been suspended. If you are vulnerable or uneasy about attending a public Mass, you are advised not to come! If you are experiencing any symptoms of this illness, you must not enter the building. One Mass will be streamed and made available for viewing online on our YouTube Channel, “Shrine of the Little Flower” every Sundays.

(4.) Anyone entering the church must sanitize their hands. Physical contact must not happen (hand shaking, etc.) Masks are highly encouraged to be worn, but not during the reception of Holy Communion. Thank you for your kind cooperation!
