

The 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Father's Day

The concept of the Kingdom of God and reign of God in our lives is a great mystery. In the Scripture, we see this in the teachings of Jesus as He uses different parables to explain it to us. These parables focus our attention on the birth and growth of the reign or rule of God, the Kingdom of God, in our lives and on the growth of the Church from its very humble beginnings. These periods of growth are at times slow and mysterious, guided by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus compares the growth of the Kingdom of God to the germination of a wheat seed and that of a tiny mustard seed. Both have exceedingly small beginnings. The wheat seeds, by gradual but steady growth, can give the farmer a bumper crop. In the same way, the life principle in a tiny mustard seed enables it to grow into a large bush. The reign of God in human hearts and the growth of the Church in the world also have small beginnings. But the Source of all life, God the Holy Spirit, gives to both a steady, persistent, and gigantic growth, provided we, the members of the Church, ask for and cooperate with God's grace.

This gradual, steady growth can be seen both in the history of the Chosen People, and that of the Church. The mighty Israelites of the OT, originated from an old man Abram and his wife Sarah who was barren and of advanced age. God called Abram with the promise of making him the father of nations with descendants in great numbers, like stars in the sky or sand on the sea shore. Thus Abram became Abraham, and the father of nations.

Jesus, born in a manger, raised in the household of a poor carpenter, founded his Church with twelve poor disciples, and He himself was rejected, abandoned, accused, condemned and crucified. The Church then grew facing unbelievably brutal persecution for almost four centuries, followed by varied and sustained persecution down through the centuries.


The growth of faith and God's reign in our lives, that is, the Kingdom of God, is the growth of God's rule in human hearts that occurs when man does the will of God and surrenders his life to God. The seed of Faith lies dormant within each of us. When we permit the Holy Spirit to nurture it with tender loving care and commitment, it grows miraculously to gigantic proportions. The growth is slow and microscopic in the beginning, but the seed grows with the power of the Holy Spirit, given to us in the Word of God, the Holy Mass, the Sacraments, and prayer.

Let us also sow tiny seeds in the form of words of love, acts of encouragement, deeds of charity, mercy and forgiveness.
