The 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"They who sailed the sea in ships ... saw the works of the Lord and His wonders in the abyss". Psalm 107 recounts that God is in charge of the whole creation whether the sea or the earth. God in His power would be "raising up a storm wind," then "hushing the storm to a gentle breeze."

The power of God in calming the storms of life both in the history of the Church and in the lives of Christians is the central theme of the readings for this Storm Sunday.

In the first reading, God addresses Job, questioning his right to challenge God's authority and leading Job deeper and deeper into the mystery of creation. Job's life was devastated by storms of the total loss of his possessions, the deaths of his dear ones, and a whole-body disease that left him in misery. "Out of the storm," God reminds Job that He is in control.

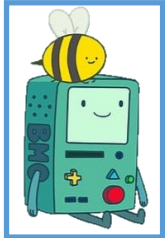
St. Paul, who "rode out the storm" also experienced storms of violent hostility from the Hebrews, his brothers and sisters in God's Chosen People, who refused to believe that Jesus was the promised Messiah. He explains that Jesus died for us to make us a "new creation." In the Gospel, St. Mark assures the first-century believers that nothing can harm the Church as long as the risen Lord is with them. He describes how, by a single commanding word, Jesus stilled a storm on the Sea of Galilee, returned the sea to its natural order, and saved the apostles from drowning.

This incident reminds us that we make a journey across the sea of time to the shore of eternity. It is natural that we will experience different types of violent storms in our lives: physical or emotional or spiritual storms. We face storms of sorrow, doubt, anxiety, worry, temptation and passion. The storms we encounter in life can either bring us closer to God and one another or they can alienate us from God and others. It is only Jesus who gives us real peace in the storms of pain, suffering and sorrow. When we are totally consumed by sorrow, Jesus assures us of the glory of the life to come. At the loss of our dear ones, Jesus consoles us with the assurance of eternal life for them in the Heavenly home of God, Our Father where we, too, can join Him. When the storms of doubt seek to uproot the foundations of our Faith, Jesus is there to still the storm, revealing to us his Divinity and the authority behind the words of the Holy Scripture. Let us always persist in our faith, and trust in Jesus who is always with us and captains the boat of our lives seeing to it that we do not sink.
