FROM THE PASTOR

This week we have two important dates of celebration/commemoration: The All Saints' Day on November 1st, and All Souls Day on November 2nd. Both these days help us to focus on the end times, our own death, and hence the need to always focus on a transforming life, through repentance, forgiveness and watchfulness.

Communion of Saints is a basic concept of Christian belief, especially of our Catholic faith. When we speak of communion of Saints, we think of the Church as having three parts or three levels/stages: The Victorious or Triumphant Church, The Suffering Church, and The Pilgrim or Militant Church. The Victorious or Triumphant Church consists of those who lived a holy life and after their death are already in heaven enjoying the Eternal bliss being with God. The souls already completed their penitential suffering time in purgatory are also part of this Triumphant Church. The members of this level/stage of Church we call saints, though only a few of them are canonized officially by the Church on earth for their veneration on the altar. We all aspire and look forward to be part of this triumphant body in heaven.

The second group, the Suffering Church is consisted of those souls who are to be perfected to have the vision of God and need a cleansing through penitential suffering. This Suffering Church is what we call the souls in Purgatory. The third group, the Pilgrim or Militant Church is the living faithful on earth. We are all part of this body of Church. It is called pilgrim Church, because we are all journeying to reach our Eternal home, the heaven, and we do not have a permanent home while on earth. An inevitable day will come when we have to leave whatever home or possession we have here on earth. It's also known as militant Church, because we are all on constant battle with the dark, evil, unGodly powers of this world to remain pure, holy and worthy of God.

We call it Communion of Saints, because, all these three different levels of Church are in continuous and constant relationship. We the Pilgrim Church seek the intercession of the Saints, all those in heaven. Also, we and the those in heaven intercede for the souls suffering in Purgatory since those souls cannot do anything other than suffering to get rid of all that block their entry into heaven for the vision of God. We help them through our prayers, penitential acts and offering Holy Masses for them.

On the "All Saints' Day" as we celebrate the saints who lived heroically the Christian faith and virtues here on earth and triumphantly entered heaven, let us intercede for their help on our journey of faith, and renew our baptismal promises striving to live a life of holiness. On November 2nd, as we commemorate the "All Souls Day", let us pray for those who have died and gone from our families and friendship circles, and all the souls in Purgatory, that the Lord forgive them their sins and grand then Eternal Rest, Peace and bliss.

He anticipates his own Passover when he will offer himself on the cross, willingly out of love. Jesus' passing over from life to death to new life in God is at the center of the gift of the Eucharist.
