The 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

People wonder sometimes about the life after death. Those who believe in Jesus expect and hope for a glorious eternal life, after our death. Common to many religions is the idea of life after death and the need to live in a good, loving, caring way informed by belief in a supernatural power, what we call God. Among those who believe, the most important questions are related to who will take part in the afterlife; all people, an elect few people, only those who believe certain things? And, of course, what happens to those who do not believe?

On his final journey to Jerusalem, where Jesus faced his suffering, sacrificial death and resurrection, someone raises this question, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" Jesus does not answer the question directly, but shifts focus to the unasked and more important question, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough". Instead of asking how many might be saved, Jesus wants us to ask ourselves, "Am I prepared to be saved, choosing the narrow gate of sacrificial agape love and so loving others as He loves them? How best does one enter into salvation and how urgent is it that one strive to enter NOW, before the Master closes the door?" Jesus clearly explains that anyone who follows him through the narrow gate of sacrificial service and sharing love will be saved.

He admonishes His followers to concentrate on their own salvation in self-discipline rather than worrying about how many will be saved. St. Paul explains that "the narrow gate" of Jesus means our acceptance of pain and suffering as the loving discipline God gives His children, as the consequences of Christian commitment.

Salvation is a continuous action, a past, present, and future event. We were saved from the bondage of sin when we were baptized as children or adults. We are being saved at present, when we cooperate with God's grace by loving others as Jesus did, by sharing our blessings with the needy, and by being reconciled with God daily, asking His forgiveness for our sins. We will be eternally saved if we heed the invitation from Jesus, the Judge, at the moment of our death and on the day of the Last Judgment: "Good and faithful servant, you were faithful in little things, now enter into the joy of your Master."

Let's choose the narrow way and the narrow gate of self-discipline and self-control of our evil tendencies, evil habits, and addictions; and by loving others and sharing our blessings with them; and by obtaining the daily strength through the guidance of the Holy Spirit in daily prayer, in Bible reading, and in the reception of the Sacraments.


This week's second collection is for fuel. September 2nd collections will be 9/7– Maintenance, 9/21– Priests Retirement Fund, and 9/28– Fuel
