## FROM THE PASTOR

Sunday, August 3, 2025  
The 18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Bible, the Sacred Scripture, contains many gems of wisdom to enlighten the whole of human life and reveal its true purpose. Some of the Old Testament books especially Ecclesiastes and Proverbs, are rich with these precious gems. The Gospels, of course, are full of the words of Jesus, the Lord, and His abundant wisdom.

This weekend, we have for our reflection, some great “food for thought”. The common theme of this weekend’s readings is the futility of a focus on the acquisition of wealth and power because everything and everyone is “here today and gone tomorrow.” The meaning of life cannot be found in hoarding wealth and possessions, but only in using them for the glory of God and the good of our fellow man.

Ecclesiastes reminds us that the greedy acquisition and hording of material wealth is useless because when the hoarder dies, he goes to eternity empty-handed, and his heirs gain, and may even squander, his riches. St. Paul directs our attention to lasting, heavenly treasures and warns that greed for wealth and influence is idolatry. He advises, “Put to death, your parts that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry” (Col 3:5). Jesus, through the parable of the foolish rich man, warns us against all types of greed, because it takes our focus away from God and away from serving and loving Him in Himself and in other people.

Dr. Carl Menninger, the world-renowned psychiatrist, was talking on one occasion to an unhappy but wealthy patient. He asked the patient what he was going to do with so much money. The patient replied, “Just worry about it, I suppose.” Menninger asked, “Well, do you get that much pleasure from worrying about it?” “No,” responded the patient, “but I get terrified when I think of giving some of it to somebody else.” Then Dr. Menninger went on to say something quite profound. He said, “Generous people are rarely mentally ill.”

People who cannot share with others have deep-seated problems. If your level of giving to the work of God and the service of others requires no sacrifice, you may not be allowing Our Lord wholly into your life. Our possessions are merely lent to us by God, and we are accountable for their use. We must be generous in sharing our time, our treasure, and our talents in Christian stewardship. Let us continue to avoid the trap of greed, and continually grow richer in those ways God asks of us.




The Shrine was pleased to welcome youth from St. Patrick's Church and School in Providence for a day of prayer and retreat.


### **The Annual Shrine Anniversary Day**
