

Paws for Thought...Focus on Foster

Adopting a shelter animal is truly rewarding! But maybe adoption is not possible for you right now. How about considering the flexibility of fostering a shelter animal? Here are some reasons why fostering a shelter pet can be the best thing in the world!

10. Some animal rescue/welfare organizations depend entirely on foster homes because they do not have physical shelters of their own. Opening your home and heart is the "shelter" that these

organizations depend on to continue functioning to help animals in need.

9. You are saving an animal's life. A space is opened up in a shelter or rescue allowing the staff to save the life of one more animal.

8. Fostering is a way to help without spending money. If you do not have the money to donate to shelters, donating your time to fostering is as valuable as donating your money...maybe more so. Some programs cover food, a crate, medical

- 6. You can give the proper attention to animals recovering from injuries or illness, especially during heartworm treatment when being quiet is important to their recuperation.
- 5. Dogs need routine, healthy exercise which may not be happening at the shelters. Fostering can provide a backyard exercise space or regular walks which are vital for behavioral as well as physical health.
 - 4. Since you get to know the animal,

you can offer valuable insight to potential adopters. Adopters can observe how the animal behaves in a home environment. Often shelters do not have staff or time to assess the behavior of an animal, which can mean a mismatch for adopters and animal.

3. The animal gets to live with your family rather than in a shelter. Your home offers the animal experience socializing with humans, better preparing it for its forever home. You have the ability to show and teach your foster what his or her life

should be...removing the stress, anxiety and kennel craziness that many animals suffer in shelters without enrichment proper decreasing chances for adoption.

2. You will ensure the shelter animal learns that they too can be loved.

Maybe not so settled at first, but you get the joy of watching them transform, knowing that they are safe. Rain is Coming!

Mike's Weather Page is calling for rain on Thanksgiving and Black Friday! So far it's looking clear for the weekend. Our water temps are holding in the mid to lower 60's and from the looks of the forecast we could see a gradual drop over the next week or two. With that said, the Sheepshead are stacking up in the river and Jetties are holding decent numbers. Good reports of pitching live fiddler crabs into the rocks on jig heads are producing nice keeper fish. Find the cuts, eddies and white wash then focus on those areas. Chances are you'll find black drum mixed in as well. When fishing for sheepshead, I cannot stress enough, move until you find the fish. Usually your bigger fish will be the first caught so if you're catching a bunch of males, try another spot. Areas to fish will include, Mayport Jetties, St. Mary's Inlet, White Shell and the Nassau Sounds Bridge.

Moving on, trout are continuing to trickle in, I haven't targeted them since the last cold front but I expect a dramatic increase in the coming weeks. A good bite is going on right now in Chicopit and decent numbers are being caught in Mill Cove as well. The top water bite is happening early in the morning and can sometimes be found later in the day during overcast conditions. When the top water isn't working, start using your search baits to find where these fish are holding. Bigger trout are being caught on Balsa Rigs while floating live shrimp and at times plastics are producing just as well. If you find the bite to be slower, tie on a slow suspending lure such as the MR17. Present these baits with a slow retrieval and minimal twitching. Many times you'll pick up those pesky fish that tend to give you the short strikes with faster moving baits.

Lastly, redfish are eating several types of cut bait in and around structure. While oysters in all the back creeks are an excellent choice for finding good fish. Docks, rocks and fallen trees are holding larger numbers. Simpson's Creek continues to produce and the last time I was there, I hooked up with a red or two in nearly every feeder creek. My hot spots include, Brown's Creek, Sisters Creek and Chicopit. As of right now, the incoming tide seems to be a good choice for targeting all these species with the top of the incoming and first of the outgoing being better for the trout. Be patient and fish thoroughly, don't give up on the spots you've had much success with. Be safe out there, keep those lines tight and I hope to see you on the water!

I would like to start this article out by drawing your attention to three short, but powerful verses of Scripture. At the end of I Thessalonians, Paul tells us, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (I Thess. 4:16-18).

The will of God is an issue that causes many Christians to stress out. A lot of times when people think about the will of God, they automatically assume that living in the will of God is something spectacular. They erroneously conclude

that the will of God is hidden and it is something that you have to discover. Let me take some pressure off of you. The will of God is not a secret that you have to discover. The will of God is revealed to us so that we can live according to the will of God. God isn't a prankster who wants to keep us in the dark. He is a kind Father who wants us to know Him.

In our passage, we learn that the will of God for our lives is spectacularly ordinary. The mundane language behind Paul's command makes some of us want to yawn and think that there has to be more. Nothing could be further from the truth. It takes the supernatural work of God in our lives in order to make us rejoice continually, pray continually, and to be thankful for everything. How is this supernatural? I'm glad you asked. It takes a supernatural work of grace in our hearts for us to be so infatuated with God that we'll rejoice continually. It takes a supernatural work of God for us to be dependent on God in prayer about everything. It takes a supernatural work of God for us to be thankful in all circumstances.

As we enter the holiday season, don't cry and moan about your circumstances, rejoice in them. Don't act like you are the Messiah and you have to fix everything, be prayerfully dependent on the only one that can ultimately fix anything. Whatever your circumstances are, give thanks. Giving thanks in all circumstances gives us the assurance that we really have conquered the world because of faith in Christ!





Spotlight on Nassau Gardens

Becky Altman is a native Floridian growing up in the town of Hilliard. Twenty years ago, when she bought her property, the lot was nearly empty with few flowers or plants however, Becky could see the potential for greatness. It is amazing how many beautiful and interesting flower beds she has designed incorporating both native and exotic shrubs and flowers. Her yard has been expanded and if you



peek under the "Lady Margaret" passion flower vine, you will see it from a special view point. Becky loves butterflies and she had made a special point of adding flowers to attract



different species of butterflies. She planted a sago palm, and a lemon tree along with several camellia and rose bushes. Quite interesting is the Night Blooming Cereus plant, also called Queen of the Night, which belongs in the cactus family. The weeping bottlebrush with red flowers is a striking tree which attracts sulfur butterflies in the late summer and fall. The native Beautyberry shrub with its purple berries is an important plant for local birds. The Passion vine with interesting purple or red flowers paired with the pink flowers of the Plumeria go well together. Cherries Jubilee, Allamanda, and the Plumeria need to be protected if winter temperatures drop to in the thirties. Becky's angel trumpet has spectacular hanging flowers always a show stopper.

Cabbage Program Awards Scholarships!

In 1996 Bonnie Plants initiated the 3rd Grade Cabbage Program in and around headquarters in Union Springs, Alabama, with a mission to inspire a love of vegetable gardening in young people and grow our next generation of gardeners. By 2002, the program grew to become a national endeavor, including the 48 contiguous states. Each year, Bonnie trucks more than one million free O.S. Cross, or "oversized" cabbage plants to 3rd Grade classrooms across the country, whose teachers have signed



up for the program here. If nurtured and cared for, kids can cultivate, nurture and grow giant cabbages, some bigger than a basketball, tipping the scales, often over 40 pounds!

The program awards a \$1,000 scholarship to one student in each participating state. At the end of the season, teachers from each 3rd grade participating

class select the student who has grown the "best" cabbage, based on size and appearance. A digital image of the cabbage and student is submitted online and that student's name is then entered in a random statewide drawing. State winners are randomly selected by the Commission of Agriculture, in each of 48 participating states.



The Nassau County Farm Bureau staff went to each Nassau County Elementary School last Thursday and dropped off the cabbage plants. They informed all of the 3rd graders (and their teachers) about Agriculture and how to grow their own cabbage in hopes to win



the \$1,000.00 scholarship.

Ethan Jones from Yulee Elementary School won the \$1,000 scholarship in the state of Florida for last year and received the check from the Bonnie Cabbage Program last Thursday!



DEA and IRS Present NCSO a Check

The Nassau County Sheriff's Office, Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) worked together on a case that originally began in 2011 involving a doctor at a pain clinic in Clay County. As a member of the DEA Task Force, NCSO became involved in the case in 2014. It was determined through the investigation that Doctor Russell H. Sachs was operating a "pill mill" at the Physician Pain Management Clinic in Green Cove Springs and was over prescribing medication, such as Oxycodone, Methadone and Hydrocodone, to his patients, as well as money laundering.

A Federal Arrest Warrant was issued for Sachs on March 11, 2015. On March 13, 2015, DEA, IRS, FBI and NCSO executed a search warrant at the residence of Sachs. A variety of miscellaneous precious gold metals were seized, \$393,622 in value, which was determined to be purchased by Sachs with U.S. Currency earned from Unlawful Dispensing of a Controlled Substance.

In January, 2017, Sachs was sentenced to 24 months at the United States Bureau of Prisons followed by 36 months of supervised release (Federal Probation) after pleading guilty to the charge of Unlawful Dispensing of a Controlled Substance. Dr. Sachs also surrendered his medical license for life, as part of his plea agreement.

NCSO was awarded a portion of the seized funds from DEA and IRS in the amount of \$104,617.01. Representatives of DEA and the IRS presented NCSO Sheriff Bill Leeper the check last Friday.


