

Did you know that federal grant monies may be used to help ensure that individual homes do not flood again? I didn't either. I learned about federal funding after we ended up with more than a foot of Thomas Creek inside our home...AGAIN. Like many families in Nassau County, my husband and I are still dealing with the aftermath of Hurricane Irma and the impact to our home from the flooding of Thomas Creek. We have been down this road before.

Flooding from Hurricane Irma, after previous floods, changes things for all of us. Mark your calendar for an important community meeting on Thursday, November 30 at 6 p.m. at the Ratliff Community Volunteer Fire Department building. During this meeting, we will discuss two options: the potential lifting of homes above the floodplain and the acquisition of homes and subsequent demolition/designation of the property as wetlands. If you have had flood damage, you need to be at this meeting.

Like many of you, we have flood insurance. It is required because we have a mortgage on our home. When Tropical Storm Fay came through in 2008, we were flooded. We utilized our flood insurance to repair our home. Since then, we have continued to make our flood insurance premiums, so Irma's flooding should just be another flood claim, Right? Maybe not.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) backs the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). It does not matter if you bought your flood policy from Nationwide Insurance or another insurance carrier, it is all part of the NFIP program. Many of us have received a letter from FEMA advising that our "building is at a high risk for flooding" and that our flood insurance premiums will "see rate increases of at least 5 percent, and up to 18 percent each year." It does not say when the premium increases will stop. If you hire someone to prepare a



Flood Elevation Certificate, which is rather like a survey of the property based on height above sea level, you can learn how many years you will see the premium increases. The Flood Elevation Certificate will not stop the premium increases; it will simply help calculate how many years will have increases in your premium. The premium increase notice does not impact your current, open flood claim, but it is something to keep in mind as you go through this process.

FEMA has two classifications that now apply to many of the homes flooded by Irma[.]

Repetitive Loss Structure: An NFIPinsured structure that has had at least two paid flood losses of more than \$1,000 each in any 10-year period since 1978. (If you flooded with Fay and then again with Irmaand your claims are more than \$1,000, you have a Repetitive Loss Structure)

Severe Repetitive Loss Property: Any building that has incurred flood damage for which four or more separate flood claim payments have been made where the amount of each claim exceeded \$5,000. and with the total amount of the four claims exceeded \$20,000; or at least two separate flood claims payments where the cumulative amount exceeds the fair market value of the insured building on the day

before each loss.

If a property is designated a Repetitive Loss Structure or a Severe Repetitive Loss Property, it may qualify for federal Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding to mitigate future flooding. A letter to all Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) Coordinators dated September 21, 2017 from the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management states, "The State of Florida received a Presidential Disaster Declaration (DR-4337-FL) on September 10, 2017 for Hurricane Irma, which impacted many counties in the State of Florida. Federal aid to supplement state and local hazard mitigation efforts, including the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), will be made available throughout the state and administered by the Florida Division of Emergency Management (Division).

HMGP provides funding for technically feasible, costeffective mitigation activities that reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from natural hazards and their effects...LMS works with local stakeholders to identify, prioritize, and select eligible mitigation activities to be submitted for funding consideration under the HGMP...."

On October 30, 2017, Michael Griffin, Building

Official with the Nassau County Building Department, sent a letter to property owners advising of the "50% Rule" associated with substantial damage to homes/structures. In the letter, Mr. Griffin states, "substantially damaged structures must be brought into compliance with Nassau County flood prevention regulations, including elevating the building to or above the 100-year flood elevation." The letter indicates that SBA loans may be an option to raise the home; but who can afford to take out a loan for \$100k - \$200K (or more) to raise a home already mortgaged? Many in our community cannot

Which brings us back to federal grant money! After doing considerable research about the grant programs and process to qualify and apply, I learned that Martha Oberdorfer chairs the LMS group for Nassau County. The LMS group meets quarterly with representation by several county officials. My husband, Ken, and I attended the October meeting. We learned that there is a formal process with specific project request forms that must be submitted and approved for accessing the federal HMGP funding. The project requests must be made by the county - we cannot submit project requests individually. Having Repetitive Loss, Severe Repetitive Loss or substantially



damaged homes lifted above the floodplain is a valid mitigation project and may qualify for federal grant money funding. Having Repetitive Loss or Severe Repetitive Loss homes acquired and demolished is also a valid mitigation project and may qualify for federal grant money funding.

Ms. Oberdorfer and members of the LMS team have agreed to a community

meeting Thursday, November 30th at 6 p.m. at the Ratliff Community Volunteer Fire Department building. Please join us as we discuss options and next steps. 

Update on Debris Removal

Debris removal on County maintained roads located within the unincorporated areas of Nassau County began on Monday, September 18. To date, 148,166 cubic yards of debris has been removed from the County rights-of-way. The contractor, Crowder Gulf, currently has 25 vegetative haul trucks in operation, a majority of which are working west of Amelia Island including the Yulee and Callahan areas. They have not yet reached the Hilliard or Bryceville areas.

The contractor has also placed 4 cut trucks in operation to clear "leaners and hangers" which are standing trees or hanging limbs in danger of falling. These trees and limbs must meet certain criteria issued by FEMA in order to be cleared. The debris from these trees and limbs are being placed in the rightof-way and will be removed by the contractor during the second sweep of those areas.

As a reminder, a drop off site is established for citizens who wish to

deliver their debris in lieu of waiting for a contractor, or for those residing on private roads. The site will accept vegetative debris free of charge with proof of residency. Neither bagged debris nor construction debris will be accepted at the site. Contractors are NOT authorized to use this site:

Hilliard Maintenance Yard 37356 Pea Farm Road, Hilliard Open Saturdays and Sundays from 7 a.m. - 7 p.m.

The contractor has NOT begun picking up construction debris in any zone as they are focusing on the widespread vegetative debris at this time. We will make announcements as soon as we are notified of when they will begin picking up the construction debris.

Lastly, the Debris Monitoring Company, Witt O'Brien, has established a debris monitoring hotline for citizen complaints and concerns. You may contact them directly at (904) 451-7609.


Therefore, if you do not receive your tax bill at your current billing address or if you are a new property owner and do not receive a tax bill, you must contact the Tax Collector's Office to confirm the amount of taxes due.

Discounts for early payment shall be: four percent in November; three percent in December; two percent in January; one percent in February; and zero percent during the month of March. If payment is made by U.S. Mail, discount amounts will be determined by postmark date. If a discount period ends on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the discount period extends to the next working day.
