Friends Group Assists in Many Ways

Walter Cronkite, the famous newsman, once said, "Whatever the cost of our libraries, the price is cheap compared to that of an ignorant nation."

There is a group of people here in Callahan committed to supporting the Callahan Library with their time and resources. The group is the Friends of the Callahan Library, led by President William Piel.

"Our Friends group is one of our most valuable assets," said Elizabeth McKibben-Nee, Librarian of the Callahan Library. "Not only do they provide resources, like magazines and programs, such as balloon artists,

through their fundraising efforts, but they also donate their time and energy in volunteer hours, manning tables at events and assisting with Library projects," she added.

Currently, the group's goals include continuing to provide monies for magazine and newspaper subscriptions, purchasing attractive storage for the Library's periodical collection, and funding children's programs, especially during the summer months and holidays.

This holiday season, for example, the Friends of the Callahan Library will help host the annual Family Holiday Festival. With local school choirs, holiday crafts, a balloon artist, face painting, and visits with Santa and Frosty the Snowman and more! The Festival is scheduled for Saturday, December 16, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. inside the multipurpose building at the Fairgrounds. Last year, the Festival drew more than 300 people into the Library. Because of the high turn-out, the Festival has moved to the larger location.





Over the summer, the Friends group held a Book Bonanza Book Fair inside the Callahan Library. People were able to purchase children's books for their home libraries. With the proceeds from the Book Fair, the Friends group donated 127 hardcover books to the Library's juvenile collection, according to McKibben-Nee.



Florida Power & Light Purchases Land in Crawford Diamond

According to reports, Florida Power & Light has purchased 1,310 acres of land from the Rayonier Corporation

at the Crawford Diamond location off of US 301. Florida Power & Light paid \$13.1 million for the land. As of



yet, FP&L has not announced any development plans for the site. A spokesperson for FP&L stated, "The company is always planning ahead to ensure we are prepared to meet the needs of our customers in the future."

The Crawford Diamond Industrial Park which is south of Callahan consisted of 1,814 acres which is owned by Rayonier Incorporated. This location is unique, in that two Class 1 railroad tracks intersect, Norfolk Southern tracks and CSX tracks cross one another creating a diamond shape at their intersection point, thus the name Crawford Diamond. It is extremely rare for two Class 1 railroad systems to cross one another. This combined with the short distance to two major interstate highways (I-95 and I-10), and within 30 miles of Fernandina and Jacksonville ports add to the uniqueness of this site.

The site received a megasite certification by McCallum Sweeney Consulting of Greenville, South Carolina which is considered a huge step in marketing the land.


Mailbox Decorating Class Held

Sugar Coated Pecans

1 tablespoon water

1 pound pecan halves

1 cup white sugar

3/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Preheat oven to 250°. Grease one baking sheet. In a mixing bowl, whip together the egg white and water until frothy. In a separate bowl, mix together sugar, salt, and cinnamon. Add pecans to egg whites, stir to coat the nuts evenly. Remove the nuts, and toss them in the sugar mixture until coated. Spread the nuts out on the prepared baking sheet. Bake at 250° for 1 hour. Stir every 15 minutes.

NCSO to Utilize Narcan Spray

Nassau County Sheriff's Office has expanded its use of Narcan, an opiate overdose counteragent. Deputies will carry the lifesaving medication thanks to a grant from the Florida Sheriff's Association.

"Our firefighters have administered Narcan for years, so we recognized the importance of putting this opiate antidote in the hands

of our deputies, who are often the first to arrive on scene," said Sheriff Bill Leeper.

The Florida Sheriffs Association initially provided 12 units of Narcan spray in a nasal pump applicator.

The nasal pump applicator is suitable for law enforcement and first responders who have a basic understanding of medical protocols. "What's good about this pump is if it's not an overdose [the spray] won't hurt anybody," continued Leeper. "It's a stop-gap measure. Narcan



also ensures the safety of deputies and canines in the event that they accidently come in contact with the synthetic opiates fentanyl and carfentanil. They're often mixed with heroin or used as a substitute. Synthetic fentanyl and particularly carfentanil, in very minute doses, can kill somebody."

NCSO responds to an average of 25 calls per month dealing with opiates, which includes overdoses and possession. "The opiate crisis is very real and very deadly," said Leeper.







Memories of Liberty University

Editor's note: Charles Hardage, who resides in Callahan, attended and graduated from Liberty University years ago. He was a part of one of the first football teams in the school's history. Charles returned to the campus for his 40th reunion. He wanted to share his experience as a young man and as an encouragement to us and students who may be leery of small colleges. Enjoy!

Charles Hardage

In the spring of 1973, my father, Sarge Hardage, took me on a road trip to 11 states and 15 colleges to seek out a college to attend and play football. These colleges had sent letters of intent to play football at their schools. When I arrived in Lynchburg, Virginia at Lynchburg Baptist College (now Liberty University), they had the least facilities of all the colleges I visited. Lynchburg was my last stop. I was so impressed by the players and their attitudes, demeanor and their way of life, I felt very strongly this is where I was supposed to be. These guys, some studying for the ministry, were hitting hard and playing tough, yet circled in prayer to end practice. I was impressed. I signed a letter with Coach Rock Royer and came back in August 1973. My life was changed forever by a little school with a little of nothing in the middle of nowhere. When I say a little of nothing of course I am referring to facilities equipment, etc. Our dorms were houses gutted with 18 bunkbeds, military style, 4-6 commodes,

no stalls, 4-6 shower heads, no stalls, very unique to say the least! But the schooling, teachers and all the staff were awesome! The Holy Spirit and Christian influence was an important drawing card for most of us.

Coach Rock Royer was the head coach of Lynchburg Baptist College. Coach Royer was a "Ball of Fire" 4'11" tall and loved the Lord big time! He was what I envisioned as a modern day Paul. I first met Coach Royer in the Tampa airport. Coach Rover stuck his hand out and said, "I am Rock Rover. Are you born again and started witnessing." Coach Royer was in a fatal plane crash in November 1973. I was devastated. I grew up in a Christian home and went to Christian schools most of my life. I had head knowledge of how Christianity works but not had a heart experience. September 30, 1973 that all changed as I accepted the Lord as my Savior while at Thomas Road Baptist Church in Lynchburg. This is where Liberty University was born by the great vision of the late Dr. Jerry Falwell. I feel

a great indebtedness to Liberty's football program and the church ministry.

I went back to Liberty University for our 40th Year Football Reunion. I was totally blown away by the growth and development of the University. I was blessed and fortunate to have my wife Kay and daughter Miranda Thompson to go with me. We had an awesome time. At the reunion Jerry Falwell, Jr. asked if any of us had some of the original memorabilia from the first team. I still had my helmet my dad bought for me from Charlie Coleman's Sport Shop, as we bought much of our own equipment but I didn't mention it at the time. I eventually sent the helmet to be placed into the Jerry Falwell Museum where hundreds of people could see part of our team history.

Jerry Falwell, Jr. invited Kay and I to be his guests at a home game and sit with him and his wife. We went to Liberty's 44th Homecoming game in October. We had the privilege of meeting the attorney who was instrumental in leading the path for Liberty to receive their FBS status in football as an independent football team. Liberty and only two other schools in NCAA history, BYU and Notre Dame, have ever received this. Liberty had upgraded not only the campus but the athletics all around. Liberty upset Baylor this year, the biggest win in school history! This was the trip of a lifetime. We plan on going back next September for our 45th Reunion!
