



A Word From the Publisher

Christmas is only a few days away and people are really getting crazy! Everyone's hustling around trying to get one more gift and just one more bargain. It can be a little crazy! Getting ready for Christmas can be trying at times...but it really doesn't have to be that way. I think it's all in the choices we make. Most of us have over and above what we actually need but those wants kick in and it's on!

I love hearing and reading the Christmas story and I've found out, once again, that I continue to learn things I've never thought of in the story. The Christmas Story of Jesus birth can be found in Luke 2: 1-7, "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and lineage of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

When reading this part of the story, just right off the bat I realize how blessed I am. In those days you had to go back to the town where you were born to register. If it were me, I would have to go to Homerville, Georgia. Homerville is about 73 miles (I Googled it) and would take me about 1 ½ hours to get there. Joseph and Mary had to travel about 70 miles and it took them about three days. They were on a donkey and walking on a dirt road. See how blessed we are. They didn't have Google, a car or a

cellphone to call ahead for a hotel.

Because everyone was traveling to their home towns, the inns were filled by the time they arrived. Let's don't forget the fact that Mary was nine months pregnant. Can you imagine how uncomfortable she was riding a donkey and walking for that long? She didn't have a doctor, nurse or her mom right beside her, just she and Joseph. Can you imagine giving birth in a stable with only your husband or fiancé? Also remember, Mary and Joseph were not married but engaged. God also intervened in that situation. He sent an angel to each of them months earlier telling them: "Do not be afraid. You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus.'

You know that must have been a long trip but both Mary and Joseph put their faith in God to direct them and keep them safe. Even making the trip was a law that they had to follow. God could have changed it so they didn't have to travel but they were just two normal people following the law.

I say all this to remind us that we are all normal people in our day to day routines. I think God actually stretches his hand down to me sometimes to smack me to remind me, He is in control, not me. Just as Mary and Joseph were normal people, so are we. At this wonderful time of Christmas, take time to thank God for the many blessings in our lives. I, for one, am so undeserving but thankful for the mercy and grace God provides in my everyday life. This story also reminds me that God can take any 'normal' person and do wonderful things with their life. God is watching and waiting for us to call on Him.

Want to help save water? Dear Editor,

When it comes to water, the past 12 months demonstrated that although Florida generally receives ample rainfall, it tends to arrive in large gulps. Effects from this spring's drought conditions followed by Hurricane Irma's statewide saturation have shown that, as stewards of Florida's water, we all must maintain an emphasis on both water conservation and water storage, even when the landscape seems saturated with water.

In the face of drought and abundance, the St. Johns River Water Management District works to strike a balance between the needs of people and the needs of the environment. During the rainy season, our local and regional flood protection projects help to mitigate flooding. As the weather cools and rain subsides, we are reminded of the need to conserve water.

With public water supply the largest category of water use, and irrigation accounting for a large part of residential water use, year-round watering restrictions help ensure efficient use of water. Current watering restrictions specify that watering should only occur one day a week before 10 a.m. or after

This year, during the cooler months of December through February, the district is asking everyone to skip every other week of watering their lawns. If everyone in our 18-county region participated this season, it

could save more than one billion gallons of water across north and east-central Florida.

Water conservation is a beneficial habit that each of us can practice, and it saves dollars too. So, I encourage everyone to skip a week! Be part of a sustainable water future for all Floridians by conserving water, as saving water is the simplest and least expensive way to protect our water resources and supplies. 1/2 cup butter, softened

2 teaspoons vanilla extract 1/4 teaspoon salt

Snickerdoodles

2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour 2 tablespoons white sugar

1 teaspoon baking soda

2 teaspoons cream of tartar 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

Preheat oven to 400°. Cream together butter, shortening, 1 1/2 cups sugar, the eggs and the vanilla. Blend in the flour, cream of tartar, soda and salt. Shape dough by rounded spoonfuls into balls. Mix the 2 tablespoons sugar and the cinnamon. Roll balls of dough in mixture. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake 8 to 10 minutes, or until set but not too hard. Remove immediately from baking sheets

Fish Talk

Sheepshead Fun!

Chris Cockerham. Reel Habit

Finally, a huge decrease in air temps. Now, what does that mean for Northeast Florida? Not much, this is Florida right? It's liable to be 80 degrees in the shade tomorrow. Temperatures aside, it's a time for herding, Sheepshead herding that is. Sheepshead are being caught from Jekyll Island to as far south as Vilano Beach. Offshore is on fire when weather permits. Several fish in the double digits and many upwards of 6 to 8 pounds have been caught and weighted locally. With surface temps being much cooler than bottom temps, look for these fish to be in the deeper holes around structure. Use fiddler crabs when available and tie on the lightest weight possible to match the flowing tide. I like using a Reel Habit Jig head because I can always stay in direct contact with my bait. As always, the idea is to start at or near the bottom and vertical jig up along the structure. Remember, if you chum they will come.

Next, you can find Trout in nearly every creek you encounter right now. Just pitch a popping cork tipped with a live shrimp and let the tide do the work. If you want to find the bigger fish, look for structure in deep water. Rock piles near fast moving current are a given. In the back creeks, look for trout to stack up near docks and oyster beds. Many times those trout will school over sand flats, so always keep that in mind. Many stud trout are just sitting in the slow moving currents waiting on unsuspecting baits to swim by.

Lastly, Redfish continue to bite consistently in the backwater. Fresh dead shrimp and cut Blue Crab have been the go-to baits. They are starting to follow their winter pattern and can be found in the deeper holes as well. Remember, just a couple feet can be the difference in a bite and absolutely nothing.

With that said, my hot spots will include, Pumpkin Hill Creek, Simpson Creek, Browns Creek and Dutton Island. If you're going offshore, make sure you drop a fiddler over the wrecks near KBY. You never know, that stud sheepshead may be waiting on you! Until next time, be safe out there and I hope to see you on the water! Merry Christmas everyone!



Keeping the Christmas Joy

When someone mentions "Christmas" to you what is your first thought? The picture that many people have is that Christmas is to be a time of joy and happiness. After all, it is the time to give and receive gifts, lots of good food, days off of work and pleasant time with family and friends. But let's face it; Christmas can be a very stressful time of shopping, extra activities and having to smile at family members with whom you have to put up with their actions and personality!

Last week a little boy looked up at me and very seriously asked, "What is Christmas?" We think, "Oh, everybody knows that answer!" Yet here was a little boy living in Nassau County who knew all about the fake news of Santa but had no idea about the true meaning of Christmas! Is it any wonder that in the midst of all the Christmas activity there is very little of true Christmas joy?

To find the true Christmas joy we go back to the source and meaning of Christmas. It is remembering the greatest event that has ever taken place. It is when Jesus Christ took on the form of man with the express purpose of dying to pay for your sin and mine. Christmas is the time that we remember and celebrate His birth to a virgin named Mary. Only God could bring about this miracle birth. We read: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel (which means "God with us")." Matthew 1:23 (NIV).

But it was for the salvation of all people that Christ came: "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." Luke 19:10 (NIV).

One heritage that I have is a Father and Mother that put Christ first. On Christmas morning before the presents were opened Dad would read the Christmas message from the Bible, we would pray together thanking the Lord for His blessings, sing "Happy Birthday" to Jesus – and then the gifts. Shoe Drop Made At Dayspring Village

The Nassau County Alliance for the Mentally Ill is a family and consumer support and advocacy group. For the last 26 years this non-proifit organization has been the primary sponsor behind the annual "Shoe Drop" for the mentally ill residents at Dayspring Village.

"This program is so important to the residents who call Dayspring Village their home. The fact is that many who struggle with mental illness, especially those with schizophrenia often will walk quite a bit as it helps alleviate, to some degree, the stress of the symptoms and the restlessness they often experience and side effects of the medications. The shoes they receive through this annual gift party are sometimes the only shoes they receive all year so it really is important to their health in so many ways," said Douglas Adkins, Executive Director.

This program began 26 years ago when then NAMI President, Hattie Morris, called

to ask about doing a Christmas Party for the residents. "What would the residents like to have?" she asked. I responded, "They need new shoes."

I told her while on the phone to take the shoelaces out of her shoes, walk around her house two times while we were on the phone. She did just that and came back to the phone and said Doug that is terrible! I felt so bad trying





to walk with no shoe laces. I explained to Hattie that when adults with mental illness go to the hospital for stabilization of symptoms as a precaution they will take away their shoelaces. Often on discharge they do not get the shoe laces back so they end up with these shoes and no shoelaces. To fix it Hattie went to Walmart and found shoes that required no shoe laces. That is how the NAMI Shoe Drop was born! This is the only "shoe drop" program in Florida and has impacted hundreds of adults with mental illness.

Dayspring Village, Inc. is a state licensed limited mental health assisted living facility that is located seven miles north of Hilliard. It is focused on caring for adults with Schizophrenia and Schizo affective Disorders.






