He also loved playing the guitar and singing. Although he never sang or played professionally, he never turned down the opportunity to play or sing before a group. It was said of him, "he was a pretty good hobby class singer and guitar player." In addition to his parents; he was predeceased by a nephew Phillip Godwin.
