Callahan Purchases Railroad Property

The Town of Callahan met Monday night for their final meeting of March. The first order of business was the approval of the minutes of a special meeting held February 26, 2018 concerning CSX property.

The next agenda item was a discussion concerning a Department of Environmental Protection grant loan. "We (the town) actually applied for a drinking water grant loan in January and this is part of it. This is a 50/50 grant," said Town Manager and Public Works Director Mike Williams. "We can get the loan at 1 to 1.5% for 20 years, which is a good rate. The design portion is \$86,000. This will be the four new water lines that will be installed either

out US 1 north or out Lem Turner Road. You (council) will decide which way we go with the new lines. You (council) need to decide if you want to continue the process or not."

The council approved to go through with the application and design process.

In other business, Attorney Jeb Branham advised the council that the town was able to buy the railroad property (old railroad bed) in a deed sale. They were able to purchase the 2.353 acres for \$43,000. The town has invested around \$50,000 in the property which includes the purchase, soil testing, survey and taxes. Shari Graham of G & H Land is here tonight to purchase Parcel A of the property for \$25,000. They (G & H) recently purchased the former Ashley Plumbing building and Parcel A runs beside the building on the Brandies Avenue side. Parcel B is the property in front of Brandies Ace Hardware and has been for years and is currently used for parking for Brandies. "You (council) actually have two parts of this property to discuss," said Branham. "First, now that Parcel B is owned by the town we need to set up a lease agreement with Brandies. Example: \$100 a year. The

second decision you (council) have is to approve or not, whether to sell Parcel A to G & H Land for a price of \$25,000."

The council agreed to present a lease in the amount of \$100 per year to Brandies Ace Hardware owner Raymond Fachko for Parcel B.

The council also agreed to sell Parcel A to G & H Land for \$25,000.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday, April 2 at 7 p.m.

Right now, I am reading one of the best books that I have read in a long time. The book is entitled Happiness, by Randy Alcorn. If you know me, you know that I am a laid back guy who likes to have a good time. When it comes to the scriptures, I want to be careful in how I handle the word of God and I want to be careful in what I teach to others. In part of my desire to be faithful to the Bible, I have said and preached some really dumb things in the past. One of the dumbest things that I have ever said was something that I heard communicated quite often: "God does not care about your happiness; God cares about your holiness."

What is wrong with that statement? Let me answer that question for you. The aforementioned statement leads you to believe that holiness and happiness cannot coexist with each other. That assumption is dead wrong. In fact, the Bible literally says in Revelation 20:6 that the one who shares in the first resurrection is happy and holy. Christians are to be the happiest people on the planet. I will go one step further Christians are the only people who can be truly happy in the world. Christians are commanded to be happy in God. In Joel 2:23, the children of Zion are commanded to rejoice and be happy in God. That is a commandment that we should all want to obey! 

We often lead people to believe that if you convert to Christianity, your fun and happiness will come to a screeching halt. Nothing could be further from the truth. Getting into a relationship with Jesus will give you the only real and lasting happiness that you could ever have. The average person only laughs 14 times per day. The average child laughs 400 times per day. Our happiness in God is something to be celebrated. David says in Psalm 16:11, "You reveal the path of life to me; in Your presence is abundant joy; in Your right hand are eternal pleasures."

The gospel was heralded as good news and great joy at Jesus' first coming. It is still the good news of great joy (Luke 2:10). Psalm 32:1 says, happy is the one whose sins are forgiven. Take God up on His offer of joy through the Good News of the Gospel. This is the only path to being really happy.

Aaron Bell

Hello, my name is Aaron Bell. I am a fighter and survivor of cancer. On February 27, 2013 I was diagnosed with Chronic Myeloid Leukemia with the Philadelphia Chromosome. I am a very active person and always have been. I never imagined my life or my family's life changing the way did at the age of 45. My wife Dana and I have been married for 21 years and we have a son, Zachary. I have my own business, Aaron's Equipment Repair, and life was going well!

My cancer story started when I went to the doctor because I was not feeling well and hadn't been for quite some time. My family doctor diagnosed me



with the flu. I was given medication and felt a little better for a couple of days. I was running a fever, took medications and the fever would go away. However, I had chills and would be wet with sweat. On the third day, I went back to my doctor and she ordered blood work. It was the blood work that found the cancer.

In the days following, I was sent to

St. Vincent's Hospital where I stayed for the next six days. While in the hospital they gave me some type of pills/medication to get my white count down. When I was diagnosed, my white count was 386,000. Once I was admitted to the hospital, my white count was over 420,000 and my spleen was swollen. To put that into perspective, the normal white cell range is between 4,500 - 10,000. They could not get an accurate count on my platelets because they were stuck together. I was told my platelets were so stuck together, I only had 1-2 weeks and my heart would have stopped in my sleep. I was put on a chemotherapy pill every day which I am still taking. I might not ever be completely cancer free as there is still a trace amount of cells in my blood. However, I was told two years ago, as of July 2, that I am almost cancer free. The cells in my blood were extremely low but still there. I am learning to live a "new normal."

My goal since becoming sick has

changed. Instead of working for the money, that is no longer my focus. The trip I took to the hospital five years ago could have easily been my last. My focus now is to enjoy life to the fullest. I enjoy going on vacations, go kart-dirt track racing, and other stuff with my family and friends. This experience has shown me the real value of life. My faith has seen me through. I know, no matter what, I owe everything to God.

I race go karts on dirt tracks and really enjoy it. On the back of all of my equipment I have John 3:16. In the US Nationals in Arizona, I ranked 8th in the nation. I finished 4th in the Unlimited All Stars in the state. I believe that I am still here to tell my story. I still go to the doctors at Cancer Specialist of North Florida every 6 weeks for blood work and checkup. When I go, I always speak with different people about my experience. I believe that is why I am still here and maybe it can help someone else. I am blessed beyond measure!







THE BEAUTY OF THE TAX FILING EXTENSION

Many taxpayers do not fully or altogether as yet understand that when you file for an automatic extension to file a return that the additional time is **granted only for them to file a final tax return...**

- But it is not an extension of time to pay the actual taxes you owe, and
- If indeed you owe money to the IRS and fail to make a fairly-accurate estimated payment with the extension then you still will be assessed

(1) Interest on the debt owed;

- (2) 5% each month (or part thereof... even one day late) of the tax due penalty for the first 5 months (5 x 5% = 25%) for delay of payment;
- (3) And additional kinds and types of non-deductible penalties for failure to file and/or for failure to pay by or before the first due date of your tax return if you actually owe IRS money

The bottom line: Extensions only grant you an addition time to file your final return .. it does not grant you more time to pay the taxes you owe as of Tuesday, April 17, 2018.

WHAT IF YOU DO NOT OWE MONEY TO THE IRS?

- 1. You can still file for an automatic extension just in case you suspect that you might still do owe money...kind of a "fail safe" thing.
- 2. You can file later (one day later ... and more) without penalty (but remember, if you take too much time (3 years maximum) to file then you lose the refund(s) you might otherwise care to get).
- 3. You can simply file for an extension, then relax and use the additional time to see your tax pro and get the chore accomplished when the rest of the taxpayers that owe take up his or her time before April 17, 2018.
