I know He is always working but His presence has surely been felt recently as He has moved in my life and in the lives of people right here in our community. This is a story of selfless giving and returning all the glory to God.

The story began several years ago when two men, Jim Mangold and John Rodgers met each other at a church clean-up day. Both the men and their families are members of the First United Methodist Church Callahan. They knew of each other but had never really talked. On this day, the men talked about their families and shared stories and from that point became great friends. One day, John noticed a sign on the back of Jim's truck that read, "Need a kidney. Please help. Call 845-7424." John did some investigating and found out that Jim has had serious kidney issues since 1998 and is currently on dialysis.

John just couldn't get his friend off of his mind. "I'm a healthy man. I've never had any health problems and don't take any medications, for that I am blessed," thought John. "Maybe I could help Jim by donating one of my kidneys to him!"

After discussing the possibility of donating a kidney with his wife and family, they all agreed that it would be a wonderful gift to give someone else a better quality of life. With that being said, John told Jim he would donate his kidney to him! This was three years ago. John never gave up. He continued to beg Jim to let him be the donor but Jim was hesitant. As Jim's health continued to decline. John continued to offer. One day, Jim approached John with news. Jim transferred his health care from UF Health Gainesville to the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville. The men knew already that they didn't have the same blood type, which was a problem. God



program. This is where the donor can be matched up with someone else, which means you would give your kidney to someone else with your blood type," said Jim. "I would also be matched up with someone else and still get a kidney. I hate to ask you to give someone else your kidney."

John's response, "I don't care who gets my kidney as long as you also get one"

John began a series of complete medical testing and work-up to make sure he was physically ready. After three days of testing, Mayo called John one evening and canceled the remaining appointments telling him they had found a spot on one of his kidneys. John and his wife, Dawn, went in to talk with the doctor. "The spot on your kidney is a cancerous tumor and we need to remove

it soon," said the doctor.

"Wow! Those words hit strong," said John. "I know that cancer is in my body but not in my soul! I continue to thank God for His direction in my life. Had I not followed my heart to be a donor, I may have never found this cancer. I know God has me in the palm of His hand. I'm so thankful!"

As it turns out Jim has saved John's life by agreeing to have him donate his kidney. Jim also has another donor. God is good all the time!

As John prepares for surgery on June 25 his church family has rallied around him with his friend Jim spearheading the campaign. John has a fulltime job and has been at his company for many years. He doesn't have health coverage because of the expense. He will be out of work for 6-8 weeks after the surgery. John is a hometown Callahan man who is a 1981 graduate of West Nassau.

Cummings Investigation Continues

Friday, June 1, Nassau County Sheriff Bill Leeper held another press conference with updates on the investigation of the disappearance of Joleen Cummings.


Following is a portion of the press conference: As we continue our investigation into the disappearance of Joleen Cummings, we have uncovered a lot of evidence and information that have lead investigators in many different directions, as well as the mysterious past of Kimberly Kessler (if that is her real name) also known as Jennifer Marie Sybert and the numerous names she has used in several different states. We have discovered that our suspect, Kessler, has gone by at least 18 different names and lived in at least 33 cities in 14 different states since 1996. She has held jobs as a truck driver, in restaurants, at temporary



employment agencies and as a hairdresser. Names She Has Used: 1. Kimberly L. Kessler; 2. Christina Melissa Brook (also spelled middle name Malissa); 3. Christina Young; 4. Pamela Kleiber; 5. Minneapolis, MN; St Augustine, FL; Asheville, NC; Fernandina Beach, FL; Clearwater Beach, FL; St. Petersburg, FL; Little Rock, AR; Oviedo, FL; Waco, TX; Aurora, CO; Pittsburgh, PA; and she also spent some time in Vermont.

She has had Driver Licenses in at least five different states under different names in Pennsylvania, Kansas, Tennessee, Florida and Virginia. As you can see this is very strange. NCSO is not quite sure why all of the disguises or if she has been involved in the disappearance of anyone else before, but it seems she has definitely been running from something.

As we continue to gather more and more evidence and facts, we have learned that this case is very unusual and one that I'm not sure we have ever seen in Nassau County before. All of this evidence that we have will be coming out in due time as we move forward and when any additional charges are filed, but at this time we are not ready to release them so we won't jeopardize any part of the case. Someone out there may know some of these details and if they do we want to know who they are. I will say this, when we do provide all the details, I believe our community will be shocked.

NCSO Investigators have been working long hours with little sleep around the clock on this investigation. In addition to developing a solid criminal case against our suspect, we continue to be focused on trying to find Joleen's Investigators have reviewed hundreds of hours of video surveillance from businesses and have been searching through phone records to find any clues as to where Joleen might be.

We have actively searched close to 40

areas within Nassau County so far where we know our suspect had been, as well as tips we have received by our investigators and through First Coast Crime Stoppers. None of these tips have been beneficial to our investigation as of yet in finding Joleen, but we continue to hope that there is someone out there who knows something and will come forward with some helpful information. In these searches we have utilized vehicles, ATV's, boats, been on foot, with canines, horses, and helicopters and airplanes. We know our suspect was in Nassau County, Duval County and St. Johns County at various times after May 12th, the last day Joleen was seen. So Joleen could be almost anywhere.

If anyone has rented a storage unit to our suspect within the past year or two please let us know. If anyone has known her to drive any other types of vehicles other than the black 2016 Kia Soul, please let us know. You can contact investigators directly at 904-548-4005 or call First Coast Crime Stoppers.

I know there are people out there who would like to volunteer or do something to help search for Joleen. All I can say is if we do discover a very large area where we have a strong possibility where Joleen may be and we do not have enough help to search, we certainly would reach out for volunteers, but we are not to that point just yet. Those who want to help are welcomed to look around their area, keep the information out in the public and assist the family in any way they can.

We ask that you please continue to keep Joleen and her family in your prayers in hopes that she is able to be located soon in order to bring closure for her family.

We have some giant pecan trees on our church property. They are about almost 3 feet in diameter. They stand over 70' tall. They have huge branches, the biggest under 2 feet in diameter. They have withstood many storms. But they stand alone and will fall alone.

On the western slopes of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, grow a forest of giant Sequoia. They are almost 3 times the size of our church's pecan trees. They stand over 250' tall, with a diameter at the base of 30 plus feet. Their largest

branches can be over 5 feet in diameter. They are monstrous!

But these Sequoias have no taproots like the pecan. Their roots spread over the granite surface of the Sierras. Each tree's roots will cover an acre of ground. But they still grow close to each other so their roots entwine, providing an amazing support system that one pecan tree could never match!



Property Values Show Increase

The Nassau County Property Appraiser's Office released the 2018 estimated preliminary market values showing an increase once again for all taxing authorities. According to Property Appraiser Mike Hickox, the real estate market continued another year of property value increase for Nassau County, reflecting a solid year for the local real estate market. Hickox said, "The total market value for the County is now at a new record high and the taxable value is also at a new record for Nassau County. This reflects what we have seen as a sign that more people, business and construction is flowing into our County and the demand for real estate is still strong."

The increase is due to a significant amount of new construction completed last year, at its highest level in over a decade, adding over \$220 million to the countywide taxable value. The 2018 total market value for Nassau County is now a record \$12.5 billion, up over 7% from the previous year. The market value includes all property before any exemptions, classification reductions, or capped assessments.

Hickox presented the 2018 estimated values to the taxing authorities on May 29th, so they can begin their budget process using actual values in place of the less accurate State Revenue Estimating Conference figures. They will use the values to help determine their tax rate for the property owners in Nassau County later this summer. If taxing authorities do not roll-back their

millage rate from last year, property owners will be paying higher taxes.

Although taxable values have increased countywide, property owners are protected by the Save Our Homes (SOH) amendment which caps the amount the assessed value can increase. "Homestead properties can increase no more than 3%, or the consumer price index (CPI), whichever is lower," said Hickox. "Based on the CPI used for 2018, previously homesteaded properties will increase no more than 2.1% again this year." Non-homesteaded properties are capped at 10%.

In 2018, Nassau County's taxable value is estimated to be about \$8.4 billion, up over 8.25% compared to last year. The City of Fernandina is projected to see an increase of over 7.5%, bringing their taxable value to almost \$2.2 billion. The Town of Callahan is estimated to have an increase in their taxable value to over \$93 million, up by over 11.3% from last year. The Town of Hilliard is expected to see about a 6% increase in taxable value, bringing their taxable value to slightly over \$91 million.

The official preliminary tax roll is expected to be released to the taxing authorities and the Department of Revenue by July 1st. Property owners are encouraged to visit the property appraiser's website, www.nassauflpa.com, in mid-July to view their property values.
