The search for local mother Joleen Cummings continues. Nassau County Sheriff Bill Leeper alongside a FBI Agent announced Friday that a well-planned and organized search would begin this past Saturday at the Chesser Island Landfill east of Folkston, Georgia.

Joleen has been missing since May 12 the day before Mother's Day when

she failed to pick up her children that Saturday. Joleen's coworker, Kimberly Kessler is a prime suspect in the disappearance of the local mother. Kessler, who was identified through surveillance video parking Joleen's vehicle in a Home Depot parking lot in



Charles Spencer stated that a specially trained search team consisting 25 agents from offices in Jacksonville

as well as Atlanta, Boston, Tampa, Washington and the FBI Quantico lab will be searching a specific area of the landfill. The area being searched is the approximate size of a football field. They will be sifting through 2,700 tons of trash, searching for any clue as to where Joleen may be. Once again video surveillance viewed by law enforcement shows Kessler placing a white trash bag into a dumpster. Detectives, along with assistance of a local refuge company, narrowed down the area of the landfill where the trash from that particular dumpster was placed in the landfill.

The search will be conducted from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for seven days. Crews will be wearing protective clothing due to the known and unknown contaminates in the landfill. Cooling tents along with FBI medical units will be utilized for the searchers due to the extreme heat and toxic debris.

Monday a press conference was held to give an update on the progress of the search. The team has found a few objects with dates around the time so they are close to the area they want to



be. The team is looking for any kind of evidence to help in the case. The search will continue through Friday and the team will reevaluate if they need to continue longer.

Joleen's mother, Ann Johnson continues to express her confidence with the investigation and the Nassau County Sheriff's Department. Ann often expresses her emotions via social media. Her posts are that of a heart broken mother and a dedicated grandmother to Joleen's children. Her faith in God is portrayed in every message she posts. Please continue to pray for Joleen's children, her mother Ann, her siblings and the many friends that are heartbroken over this travesty.







Last week during the Fourth of July holiday our family took a family vacation. We knew that our oldest daughter would be home from Thailand for a couple of weeks so we made arrangements to rent a house that could accommodate all 14 of us. We had six children under the age of 10 and 8 adults. We had never been to this location or seen the house before, so it left many unanswered questions in our minds about how everything would work out (bedrooms, bathrooms, etc.). However, once we arrived all our fears were put to ease

concerning the accommodations, the house was perfect. Next was the concern of how well we would get along together in a confined area with five of the children being six and below (6, 5, 3, 2, 5 months). I love my grandchildren, but it's not that often that they all stay with us for several days in a row. Well the house was big enough and had a built-in swimming pool that helped to make our time very enjoyable. Every meal was great but one and it was the one we were all looking forward to. It was going to be our special meal for the trip. We had bought a beef tenderloin to cut it up into steaks for that night. Everyone was busy with the preparation for the meal, some were cooking potatoes, some were cooking up the vegetables and others were making the salad, while I was getting the grill ready and preparing to cut up the tenderloin into steaks. When I opened the package, the meat had spoiled and smelled rancid. Needless to say, we didn't have steak for dinner that night.

Later I began to think about our temporary disappointment over our dinner that night because of the meat that had spoiled. It reminded me of a story in Jeremiah 13. Jeremiah was instructed by the Lord to buy a linen belt, later he was told to hide the belt in the rocks by the Euphrates River. Sometime later the lord told him to go and find the belt again, but now it was ruined. Jeremiah 13:9–11 "This is what the Lord says: 'In the same way I will ruin the pride of Judah and the great pride of Jerusalem. These wicked people, who refuse to listen to my words, who follow the stubbornness of their hearts and go after other gods to serve and worship them, will be like this belt—completely useless! For as a belt is bound around a man's waist, so I bound the whole house of Israel and the whole house of Judah to me, 'declares the Lord, 'to be my people for my renown and praise and honor. But they have not listened." (NIV84)

I had to pay a great price for those steaks the other day and it made me sad to have to throw them all away because they had spoiled.

Take a moment and think about the great price that God had to pay for your salvation. He gave His best (Jesus Christ), His one and only son just for you. Be careful that you don't become like the children of Israel and Judah did during Jeremiah's day. Don't allow yourself to become a spoiled and rancid people by following after your own ways. Put God first in all your ways and follow the teaching of His word.

By the way, we had a smoked pork butt that was already cooked that we were able to eat that night in place of the steaks, so the meal turned out great even though the steak was bad. God is good! And no one got sick from the rotten meat.

HES Jump Rope Fundraiser





FFS Sends Firefighters to Battle Western Blazes

Commissioner Florida Agriculture Adam H. Putnam recently announced that the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Florida Forest Service deployed a Type 2 Initial Attack Hand-Crew of 20 people to battle the Winter Valley Fire in Oklahoma. In addition, 29 single resources have been assembled from around the state to assist with wildfire suppression in Colorado, Wyoming, Texas, Utah and New Mexico. Three local Florida Forest Service wildland firefighters were deployed including: 2 from Nassau County that went to Oklahoma as an Incident Commander Type 5 and a Feller Type 2; and 1 from Clay County went as a Heavy Equipment Boss to Colorado

"Our wildland firefighters are exceptionally well-trained, and we are ready to support suppression efforts out west in any way we can," said Commissioner of Agriculture Adam H. Putnam. "I applaud their selfless dedication to protecting our fellow

Americans."

Deployed wildland firefighters will fill a variety of roles including front-line firefighting, firefighter safety, incident management and more.

"With the recent rainfall and current low wildfire danger levels across Florida, we are able to lend support to other states for the protection of people, structures and natural resources," said Florida Forest Service Director and State Forester Jim Karels.

The Florida Forest Service, a division of the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, manages more than 1 million acres of state forests and provides forest management assistance on more than 17 million acres of private and community forests. The Florida Forest Service is also responsible for protecting homes, forestland and natural resources from the devastating effects of wildfire on more than 26 million acres. Hilliard Town News





NAEGLERIA HEALTH ALERT:

Naegleria is a dangerous parasite in lake and pond water. Naegleria is a big name for a tiny parasite (amoeba) that enters the body through the nose, making its way to the brain which causes an infection. This infection causes a rare, but life-threatening disease called Primary Amoebic Menigoencephalitis (PAM). Symptoms of PAM can start as quickly as 1 to 14 days after infection.

Symptoms include: headache, fever, nausea, vomiting and stiff neck. The disease moves very quickly into the brain causing swelling which leads to confusion, lack of attention, loss of balance, seizures and hallucinations. This disease usually results in death within 3 to 7 days.

As temperatures rise, so does your chance of becoming infected. The safest way to prevent infection is to not swim in warm, standing water such as lakes, ponds, poorly maintained swimming pools, storm water, holding areas or places that are posted 'No Swimming'. Wear nose clips, hold your nose closed or keep your head out of the water when swimming, jumping or diving in any freshwater. Do not dig or stir up the sand and silt while swimming in shallow water. This is where the parasites live. There is no cure for this infection, so prevention is important. Please take the time to research this and tell people about it. It could save a loved one or friend.

2018 Florida Forestry Teacher's Tour



The 2018 Florida Forestry Teacher's Tour was held June 19-22. Forty teachers from all over Florida convened in Fernandina Beach for this unique opportunity to look at the role Florida's forest industry plays in our everyday lives. Florida Forest Service Jacksonville District Manager Jennifer Hart explained "There are more than 5,000 products that come from Florida forests and the industry supports thousands of jobs and communities," said Hart. "Every part of the tree is utilized in some way and each year more trees are planted than harvested,

ensuring this valuable renewable resource will be available for future generations. We want educators to see that sustainability is the key to responsible forestry."

Tour stops were chosen to highlight the many facets of the forest industry from the small family tree farm to large industrial operations. In Clay County, teachers visited Jennings State Forest for a prescribed fire demonstration, a small family owned tree farm, and Camp Blanding to learn about ongoing conservation efforts. In Nassau County, teachers visited Rayonier Forest
