## Crumbling Westside Roads

Dear Editor,

OK Nassau County, enough is enough! County Road 115/ Dixie Highway has been passed over for widening and repaving for too many years now. The condition of this two lane road from Bypass Road to Henry Smith Road continues to deteriorate and fall apart at an increasing rate. There are thousands of potholes on this stretch of highway that are becoming dangerous to drivers. I constantly meet oncoming drivers swerving around these deep holes. That in itself can be very dangerous. Hitting a large pothole in a car, truck or SUV can cause damage, or loss of control. But, for those of us (like me) who also ride a motorcycle...it can be deadly.

The Westside Journal in Issue #33 on Feb. 15, 2018 (Update on Westside Roads) reported that CR 115 Widening and Resurfacing was to be completed Winter 2019. Winter 2019? It is not even winter 2018 yet, so we here on the neglected west side must wait another year and a half before we see any improvement? That timeline is unacceptable.

In July of 2017, our 5 County Commissioners failed to agree in principle and pass a gas tax that would have increased the available funding for our county roads. Now, we are seeing the result of that vote. Perhaps a vote like that should be left up to

the Nassau County voters and not to 5 County Commissioners with their own interests in their appointed districts. We all know what part of the county seems to get the funding.

Election time is coming up for some. Perhaps we need to rethink how Nassau County is being managed by our elected officials and make some changes for our future here on the west side of Nassau County. We have a year and a half before it gets any better unless changes are made now. That's a long time to watch our roads fall apart.

|------------------------------|----------------------------------|
| 1 cup shortening             | 1 teaspoon baking soda           |
| 3/4 cup packed brown sugar   | 1 teaspoon salt                  |
| 3/4 cup white sugar          | 2 cups rolled oats               |
| 2 eggs                       | 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips |
| 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour |                                  |

Preheat oven to 350°. In a large bowl cream shortening, brown sugar and granulated sugar. Add eggs and mix thoroughly. Combine the baking soda, salt and flour and stir into creamed mixture. Add oatmeal and chocolate chips and stir until well blended. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto greased cookie sheet. Bake for 15 minutes.

# Hilliard Town News

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their final meeting of July. The first order of business was the adoption of Resolution 2018-09 which concerned honoring 50 Years of Municipal Home Rule in the Florida Constitution.

In other business, Mayor Cris McConnell recommended approval to hire three new employees for the Public Works Department. "All the applicants have been interviewed and approved," said McConnell. "The department has some big issues going on and we need help. These applicants, one that is a former employee, I feel are going to be great in the department and a great help." The council approved the request. The next agenda item also concerned the Public Works Department. The town clerk recently received information that Public Works Director David Thompson has completed paperwork for the FMLA (Family Medical Leave Act) and will be out until further notice. "I have talked with two employees, Mr. Grooms and Mr. Rowe, concerning being in the supervisor positions until we can see what's going on," said McConnell. "Both have consented and feel comfortable with the responsibility. I just wanted you (the council) to know what was going on."

The next item concerned setting budget workshop dates. The council agreed on July 24, 30 and 31 at 6 p.m. for budget workshop meetings.

Parks & Recreation Director Kyle Malucci advised the council that he had

bids on lane markers for the pool for the two swim teams that will be using them. Mayor McConnell asked, "Do the quotes include take up reels and storage reels for the markers?"

"They do not," added Malucci.

The council requested for Malucci to get quotes on the two items and add that to the final quotes.

During closing comments, John Hendricks, representing the West Nassau Historical Society advised the council that the Society is one of six Florida organizations selected to host the Smithsonian Institute's traveling exhibit called Crossroads: Change in Rural America. The exhibit will be on display at the depot in Callahan for 6 weeks beginning October 27. Hendricks would like members of the council to attend one of those evenings and talk about Hilliard history (Cornwall Hilliard) and share some old photos. Hendricks will get some dates to present to the council for them to attend.

Former mayor David Buchanan addressed the council to 'thank' David Thompson for his tireless years of service to the town. He also thanked the Mayor for stepping in and taking over some of the responsibility of the Public Works Department during this time. "I think those two men should be compensated for the extra time and responsibility they are putting in," said Buchanan. "Also, our infrastructure is crumbling in Hilliard. The only way to fix that is more money. Just a thought."

The next meeting of the council will be Thursday, August 2 at 7 p.m.

## Fahlgren Chosen as Outstanding Student

Caleb Fahlgren, a 2018 graduate from West Nassau High School, became the first Nassau County student to be named the Outstanding Secondary Career Education Student by the Florida Association of Career and Technical Education (FACTE). Caleb is the son of Judge Steven and Dr. Kimberly Fahlgren of Hilliard. He was chosen based on his entire high school resume and honored this week at the FACTE ceremony in Orlando. Fahlgren's trail-blazing approach to high school distinguished him in several ways and he will be reaping rewards for quite some time.

The Nassau County School District offers several options for high school students. While most students choose one program or a standard college-prep track, Fahlgren took a different approach. He viewed each class as an opportunity to explore careers and obtain credentials. While a standard college-prep high school diploma leaves roughly 4 to 5 classes for career preparation, West Nassau's block schedule allows for 12 to 13. Fahlgren didn't stop there; he enrolled in an early morning Drafting/AutoCAD course, began the Digital Forensics Technical Certificate at FSCJ through early admissions and worked on his own to work towards additional industry certifications such as Linux and IT Security +. By the time he graduated, he had earned 7 industry credentials, multiple college credit hours, 6 college scholarships and knew exactly what career field would allow him to achieve his financial goals.

While college tuition has increased significantly in recent decades, a four-year college degree is no longer a guarantee to higher wages. Now more than ever, students need to consider the marketability of specific degrees and evaluate education as a financial investment. With a maturity and foresight beyond his years, Fahlgren understood this and explained the process during a recent conversation how the school

district's career education program offerings made a difference for him. "I wanted to go into college knowing exactly what I wanted to do, and the way to do that was to take as many different classes as you can. I wanted to use my four years in college taking exactly what I needed, not exploring," he explained.

In the four years spanning 8th grade to 11th grade, Fahlgren took courses in six different career education programs. This gave him exposure to marketing, finance, engineering and computer science among other things. He settled with a combination of the final two, wireless engineering.

"In 8th grade I wanted to be a computer programmer. I didn't discover the security side until working in the Java course my junior year of high school. Cyber security is such a growing field. Remember the Target data breach and the huge impact it made on their business? I wanted to be on the cutting edge of that."

Having a narrowed career goal allowed him to proceed with a very deliberate process of vetting college programs and planning his future. As he explored colleges with strong computer science and engineering programs, he zeroed in on the four Florida universities (UCF, UF, Florida Polytechnic University, and UNF) and Auburn University. "Polytech, UCF, and Auburn were my finalists. Polytech was smaller and offered more scholarship opportunities, but there were more employers around UCF and Auburn," said Fahlgren. "Auburn won out because they had a great cybersecurity program and were really focusing on engineering by building a new \$40M facility." He was also impressed by their support of students working on



personal projects and their placement rates.

Choosing an out-of-state school means additional expense, so seeking out scholarships would be key. He approached this with the same sort of focus as he did his career exploration. Regarding winning scholarships, Fahlgren had this to say: "It was less about AP courses and grades and more about being involved and well-rounded. Having participated in activities such as 4-H, FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America), the University of U.S. and the Jacksonville Bitcoin Club really mattered. Having a part-time job and industry credentials on my resume helped too. Clubs plus school plus job showed I could handle it all! SAT Scores helped a lot too, of course."

He ended up with 7 scholarships totaling \$39K for his freshmen year of college. This includes the FACTE award which garnered him \$1,000 courtesy of the D. C. Jaeger Corporation. The two largest awards Fahlgren received total over \$30K,

are specific to Auburn's programs and can be renewed yearly. Problem solved – he won't have to take on debt to fund his education. Last month, Fahlgren started his program at Auburn. Why wait until the fall when you intend to accomplish so much in your life! While his college experience is just beginning, he is already seeing other advantages from having chosen career education courses over additional AP or academic courses.

"AutoCAD help me a lot. I used AutoCAD in a bridge design project in my first college class. It allowed me to build a prototype with the computer so I could be sure everything was exact. Other students that are just starting engineering may have struggled with the project, but I knew that by using AUTOCAD I could get everything exact. My CompTIA A+ certification prep helped me know where the computer industry is heading," added Fahlgren. "The Java program was my favorite because I loved the real-world projects and team group projects. I think that one of the best ways to learn is through real world projects. Video Game Design was a close second because you could bring your own knowledge and creativity into those projects."

For younger students hoping to achieve great things including landing scholarships and promising jobs, Fahlgren offered some parting advice. "Being well-rounded is so important. People get caught up on being valedictorian, but everyone applying for these awards has good grades. You have to make yourself unique by having projects or experiences that not everyone else has. Colleges want a diverse atmosphere; they want to see how you are different from the rest of the pack and how you are going to contribute to that atmosphere. They want to know you'll be involved in their extra-curricular activities and may even do research with professors."

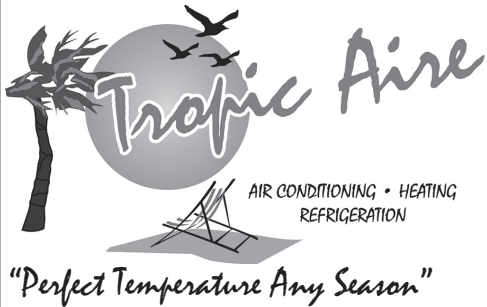

### Fatal Accident Saturday Night



Two people lost their lives Saturday night on US 301 near Bryceville. Shortly after 11 p.m. Saturday night, Bailey McKnight, 22, of Bryceville, and Ryan Kennedy, 21, of Jacksonville were heading northbound in the left northbound lane in a Honda Civic. A Ford F-250 driven by Shawn Blitchington, 45, was traveling south in the left northbound lane of US 301 with no headlights on. The two vehicles collided head-on. According to the Florida Highway Patrol, the driver of the F-250 fled the scene on foot prior to law enforcements arrival. Kennedy and McKnight, who was eight months pregnant, were pronounced deceased at the scene.

Nassau County deputies searched the area and found Blitchington not far from the crash site. Blitchington was placed under arrest by FHP. He is charged with leaving the scene of a crash involving death. Other charges are pending.

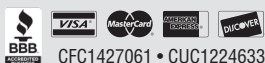

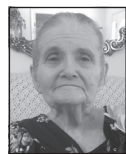



# Smithsonian Traveling Exhibit Coming Soon

The West Nassau Historical Society is one of six Florida organizations selected to host the Smithsonian Institute's traveling exhibit called Crossroads: Change in Rural America. This is a national project designed to showcase the historic aspects of America's rural yet diverse population and its slowly changing landscape. The history-oriented show will run from Saturday, October 27, through Saturday, December 8, inside the historic Callahan Train Depot located at 45383 Dixie Avenue in the heart of rural Nassau County. The grand opening is set for Saturday, October 27 at 7 p.m. with a reception and refreshments. The event is free and open to the public but donations are kindly accepted.

The all-volunteer nonprofit recently received a Community Project grant of \$5,000 from the Florida Humanities Council who is helping the Smithsonian Institute coordinate the extensive show on the state level. These funds will allow the West Nassau Historical Society to promote the exhibit and augment the show with extra displays and lectures presented by various local groups and businesses. The historic 1881 Callahan train station venue will be open from Wednesday through Sunday for the entire 6 weeks the traveling exhibit is in town. The Historical Society will end the show on Saturday, December 8, with a final reception open to the public.

This project would not be possible without the support of the Florida

Humanities Council, the nonprofit statewide partner of the National Endowment for the Humanities that each year awards federal funds to community organizations to create a variety of cultural resources and hundreds of free public programs across the state. These programs and resources help preserve Florida's heritage, promote civic engagement, and foster connections among humanities scholars, cultural organizations, and community groups across the state. Florida Humanities grants also leverage thousands of dollars annually in local matching funds from non-profit agencies.

This fall marks the 30th anniversary of the renovation of the 1881 late-Victorian-style train depot that will be the venue for the Crossroads exhibit. It is also the 10th anniversary of the opening of the West Nassau Museum of History located inside the quaint wooden railroad station. The West Nassau Historical Society will mark both occasions during Crossroads' six week stay in Callahan.

The 501c3 nonprofit is dedicated to the discovery and celebration of the rich and diverse tapestry that is Nassau County history.
