



# **B&V** Timber to Celebrate 25 Years in Business

I was called last week by Vicki Cribb concerning their company's upcoming anniversary. She advised me that their company, B&V Timber, in Hilliard, will celebrate 25 years in business on January 2, 2025, and she knew the last issue of the Westside Journal would be before the anniversary. "First of all, congratulations and next, I'll be happy to write an article about it!" I responded.

Anyone who lives here, knows the timber business is big and serious business. Bubba and Vicki Cribb, of Hilliard, decided early in their lives that would be their business. Bubba had worked in the logging business for a

larger company. He recalled being out on the property cutting timber and later being asked by a neighbor, "I have about 5 acres that I would like to have cut. Can you give me a price?"

Bubba went back to his higher ups and told them of the person's request. "We don't cut small plots, only

the large ones," he was told. After a couple of times of that happening, Bubba had made up his mind that he wanted to start his own business and take on some of these small properties himself. With that in mind, he had his wife Vicki and a toddler son, Austin,

at home to agree to this plan. The name was easy to come up with B (Bubba) & V (Vicki) Timber, pretty simple! It was with much prayer they made the decision to buy a small truck to haul timber and used a farm tractor to pull the timber out of the woods. Trees were cut by hand. Vicki would drive the

tractor and once they loaded the truck,

it was off to the mill. Bubba decided early on that he didn't want to work for a brokerage firm. "That probably made the work even tougher, as it was just me and Vicki, but it worked," said Bubba. "They focused on private tracks



of land, walked the property and gave a price. Within the next few days, we were doing another job...and another. In the timber industry it's either 20

loads a day or four, there's nowhere in

the middle."

We Buy Timber

The focus of B&V Timber continues to be small tracks to work with. With the knowledge of properties in our area that Bubba has, he is a God send for many new homeowners. Most people that move in our area, are not from the country, mostly from the city. Their first goal is to cut all the trees. With one quick call to Bubba to come out to the property and help direct them as the best way to preserve some trees but still have the look the owner wants. Now, Bubba has turned into a Property

Manager. "My goal has always been to treat each customer as fairly as I would want to be treated," added Bubba. "Probably 75% of the people that buy property in our area start with a plat of land. That's when I am called, as the project starts with me. Vicki and I like to ride around and look at properties we worked on and see the finished product. It's so rewarding to know we helped to make that place look nice!"

Bubba and Vicki are happy to report that they typically have enough work in our local area to keep them busy. Their operation includes two guys in the woods loading and a driver hauling to the mill. They have recently purchased some earthmoving equipment that will be helpful in clean-ups once they have

Board member Gail Cook, Sheriff Bill Leeper and the Honorable Judge Jenny Higginbotham, in the Fourth Judicial Circuit.


