

If you have never been to the Callahan Christmas Parade, let me share with you that you are missing out on one of the many things that makes living on the west side of Nassau County great. This year's parade will have more floats than last year's. It's going to be a great event.

What really has me excited for this year is that a number of churches in our area are putting together a group of floats telling some of the Miracles of Jesus. The churches participating this year are: The Anchor Church of God,

Callahan Methodist Church, Crossroads Church/Sonshine Christian Academy, Friendship Alliance Church, Rivers Edge Church and True Life Christian Fellowship. Here is a sneak peek into the floats: the first float will have Pastors from the churches. The miracles will include: Jesus's birth (Luke 2:1-20, Anchor), the great haul of fish (Luke 5:1-11, Crossroads/Sonshine), Jesus heals a man at the pool of Bethesda (John 5:1-9 Friendship), Jesus walks on water (Mark 6:47-51, Rivers Edge), and Jesus rose from the dead (Luke 24:5-8, Methodist).

The purpose of these floats is two-fold: 1) To proclaim the Gospel. "And He said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." Mark 16:15, ESV. Jesus gives this clear instruction that we are to proclaim the Gospel (good news). That can happen in many ways. We can simply tell people the Good News of who Jesus is and what Jesus has done. We can display the Gospel during communion or baptism. We can find the Gospel written in the Bible, or acted out in a play or a movie, or we can tell the Good News on a float in a parade. 2) To work in unity with our brothers and sisters in Christ, each of these churches comes from different denominations or no denomination. Each of these churches has their own finer points of theology and practice. Each of these churches believes Jesus died for our sins and salvation is found in Jesus Christ. So, we work in unity to proclaim this good news. "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity," Psalm 133:1, ESV.

We hope to see you this Saturday at the parade. Look for the QR Code on the side of each of our floats that will take you to the Churches of West Nassau County Facebook page. There you will find more information on the group and how to get involved.




