Christmas Parade Fun!

If you have never been to the Callahan Christmas Parade, let me share with you that you are missing out on one of the many things that makes living on the west side of Nassau County great. This year's parade will have more floats than last year's. It's going to be a great event.

What really has me excited for this year is that a number of churches in our area are putting together a group of floats telling some of the Miracles of Jesus. The churches participating this year are: The Anchor Church of God, Callahan Methodist Church, Crossroads Church/Sonshine Christian Academy, Friendship Alliance Church, Rivers Edge Church and True Life Christian Fellowship. Here is a sneak peek into the floats: the first float will have Pastors from the churches. The miracles will include: Jesus's birth (Luke 2:1-20, Anchor), the great haul of fish (Luke 5:1-11, Crossroads/Sonshine), Jesus heals a man at the pool of Bethesda (John 5:1-9 Friendship), Jesus walks on water (Mark 6:47-51, Rivers Edge), and Jesus rose from the dead (Luke 24:5-8, Methodist).

The purpose of these floats is two-fold: 1) To proclaim the Gospel. "And He said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." Mark 16:15, ESV. Jesus gives this clear instruction that we are to proclaim the Gospel (good news). That can happen in many ways. We can simply tell people the Good News of who Jesus is and what Jesus has done. We can display the Gospel during communion or baptism. We can find the Gospel written in the Bible, or acted out in a play or a movie, or we can tell the Good News on a float in a parade. 2) To work in unity with our brothers and sisters in Christ, each of these churches comes from different denominations or no denomination. Each of these churches has their own finer points of theology and practice. Each of these churches believes Jesus died for our sins and salvation is found in Jesus Christ. So, we work in unity to proclaim this good news. "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity," Psalm 133:1, ESV.

We hope to see you this Saturday at the parade. Look for the QR Code on the side of each of our floats that will take you to the Churches of West Nassau County Facebook page. There you will find more information on the group and how to get involved.

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first meeting in December and final meeting for 2024. The first order of business was for Council President and Councilman Ken Bass to step down from his position. Ken has served as a councilman in Callahan for 10 years. Following, Councilwoman Janet Shaw moved to the Council President seat.

Callahan Mayor Randy Knagge announced to the council that he will now swear in the three council persons: Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming, Councilman Matt Davis and newcomer Wendi Williams, who was appointed to the final council seat, as no one ran for the seat.

The next order of business was for the council to choose who will be the council president. Councilwoman Fleming made a motion for Janet Shaw, and Councilman Matt Davis seconded the motion. The council approved for Councilwoman Shaw to also serve as

Council President, which she humbly accepted. “I appreciate your vote of confidence in me,” said Shaw. “It’s pretty cool to be the first lady president of the council.”

The next order of business was the assignment of departments. Current council members were all satisfied with their assignments and wished to keep them. The assignments are: Water Commissioner Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming; Street

Commissioner Councilwoman Ashton Vargas; Fire Commissioner Councilwoman Wendi Williams; Planning & Zoning Commissioner Councilman Matt Davis; and Parks & Recreation Commissioner Council President Councilwoman Janet Shaw.

The final order of business was the approval of Ordinance 2024-004 on Second and Final Reading. The ordinance concerned Amending Chapter 66 in the Town Code to allow Alcoholic Beverages to be sold in the Callahan Town limits at 7 a.m. on Sundays. The council approved the Ordinance by a vote of 4 – 1, with Council President Janet Shaw voting no.

In closing comments, Mayor Knagge reminded the council of the Callahan Christmas Parade this Saturday at 10:45 a.m.

Councilwoman Ashton Vargas advised the council that she was included in a webinar with FDOT and questioned when the traffic light, that has been approved, will be placed at Mickler Street and US 301. The response she received was once the funding was in it should be as soon as 2029.

Ken Bass advised the council and thanked them for being so supportive of him and he was so proud of the work that they had done. “It has been an honor and pleasure to serve,” said Bass.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday, January 6, 2025 at 7 p.m.


