## Dr. Dennis Pallan



Dr. Dennis Pallan, of Fernandina Beach, passed away on July 28, 2022, peacefully in his home. He was born in 1946 in Pittsburgh, PA, the son of the late Bertha May. Also preceding him in death are his infant son Mark Pallan; his sister Patricia May; and his former

wife Ethel Pallan (mother of his children).
