During the years following his discharge from the Army, he worked in construction; earned two Bachelors Degrees from Arlington Baptist University, Arlington, TX; pastored Gospel Light Baptist Church in Waycross; taught Jr. High Bible at Trinity Christian Academy in Jacksonville; and teamed with his wife as a long haul trucker.

He was a much beloved member of Liberty Baptist Church of Callahan, where he served as the Sunday school teacher for the Lighthouse Bible Class for the past 20 years. His most cherished profession was as a preacher of the gospel of Jesus Christ. During his retirement, he provided pulpit fill for various churches and pastors in South Georgia and North Florida. John loved the Lord, his family, his church, gospel music, sharing his faith, and making new friends. He will be deeply missed.

In addition to his parents; he was preceded in death by his sister Martha Jones; daughter Shon Allen; and great-grandson Wyatt Bernal.
