Kristen Poppell earned her Master's in 2015 from the University of Florida and moved forward to work in Nassau County's 4-H Program, coordinating many of the County Extension Office's youth outreach programs, youth day camps and resident camps, and was the leader of the 4-H County Council teaching teens, among much more. She taught them about citizenship and community service, leading many programs such as the YUM (Youth Understanding MyPlate) Program and the Youth Leadership Nassau Program. Kristen made quite a mark in the lives of the children she worked with. They absolutely adored her. The parents of these students had nothing but praise of the sweet and kind person she was. For this dedication, among many others, she was awarded the Young Professional Award in 2018 from UF by her peers and colleagues.
