Nicholas 'Nick' Reginald Brown, 34, departed this life on Tuesday, October 6, 2020, due to complications from a lifelong battle with Cystic Fibrosis.

Nicholas was born October 23, 1985 at NAS JAX in Jacksonville and grew up in Nassau County. He was a graduate of the Class of 2004 from West Nassau High School. He was diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis when he was one month old and eventually received a double lung transplant on March 9, 2013 at the age of 27. Nicholas never let Cystic Fibrosis stop him from living his life. He enjoyed woodworking, traveling and making others laugh. He also loved sports, especially football and baseball. His favorite teams were the Jacksonville Jaguars, Florida Gators and the Boston Red Sox. He was also quite active. He played baseball from the age of 5 until he was 14, even going on to coach his brother's baseball team when he was 20 years old.

He was preceded in death by his grandmother, the late Nola Gail Brown (1991); and his grandfather, the late Frank Sumner Stevens (1981).
