Prior to the Callahan Town Council meeting Tuesday night, Town Attorney Jeb Branham and his family enjoyed a reception held in his honor. Council members and friends gathered to wish Branham farewell as he was recently appointed to a judgeship. Branham was appointed by Governor Ron DeSantis to fill a judicial vacancy. Branham will serve as a Circuit Judge in the Fourth Judicial Circuit, which encompasses Duval, Clay and Nassau Counties. His position will begin February 1, 2021.

The reception was held in the Fire Station meeting room. Branham was joined by his wife, Michelle and son Caylor (12).

"I leaned heavily on you back in the day. You came at a time when the town was not in very good shape," said former Mayor Shirley Graham. "We went through a lot of tough times but you helped me through. Thank you for all the guidance you gave me "

About a week ago we drove from Hilliard to Clermont, Florida pulling a trailer. It was an uneventful trip. As we were ready to drive back to Hilliard I glanced over the hitch and noticed a problem. The lock on the pin that holds the hitch to the car was missing! I must have not checked carefully that it was locked on the pin. I looked again and noticed that the chain hook had shifted enough that it kept the pin from coming out and thus the trailer coming loose from the car. Who was in control? Not us! It was God who kept us safe.

Many years ago we were traveling along a narrow winding two lane road at night in Papua, Indonesia. The driver was driving a little fast for our comfort. Suddenly, there was a big clump of grass and weeds in the middle of the road. This was the normal warning sign that there is a hazard in the road ahead. Sure enough, immediately, there was stalled dump truck in the middle of our lane with the mountain on one side and a drop off on the other side of road. The driver swerved to go around the truck only to face an oncoming vehicle. Somehow, three vehicles passed each other with not a scratch! Who was in control? None of us! It was God who protected us.

Stop and look around. There are many situations and circumstances that we are living through today that we do not understand. There are events that have or are taking place every day that we want to shout out "Why?" Many speculate on what the future is going to hold for jobs, investments, travel, and our daily way of life.

At this point it is easy for us to feel like everything is spinning out of control. Because of happenings in politics, in your home, at the job and other issues how do we get our feet planted firmly again? First, we must establish in whom we put our faith and confidence. This weekend's forecast doesn't look very promising. No rain is expected but the winds are going to be blowing, yet again. As discouraging as this can be, many of my best trips have come from the worst weather days. There are other options for wetting a line. One of my favorite fish to target on days like these is striper. So, don't let the weather discourage you in the least. Let's get to the fishing.

We haven't touched on striped bass in quite some time. None the less, there has been a great bite going on behind the scenes. While everyone targets the typical inshore species, our brackish waters have been firing off. Where to look? What kind of baits should I throw and what are the best tides? Well, just like most predatory fish, you need tidal movement. I actually love the outgoing the best while targeting striper. Funnels, rip rap, tree tops and rubble of any sort is key. Pay attention for the slightest flickering of bait and look for fleeing bait fish as the tide recedes the grass when the water's moving out. All of these items are huge in being successful for catching what I call the Ghost Fish of Northeast Florida, Striper can be on the surface one minute and gone before you make your next cast.

As far as lures go, I typically target them with hard baits and a variety of plastics. Rapala skitter walks, Bomber Pro Long As and Spook Jrs are fantastic search baits. Whether it be top water or sub surface you can't go wrong as long as you adjust to the conditions. During low light, I will use bright colors. As the day progresses and the sun begins to peak, I will switch to large paddle tails to get down deep. Weighted jig heads will need to be switched out to compensate for the tidal current you're fishing.

Lastly, where are we catching striper? Well, because they move so much, the best starting points always seem to be at our bridges. This could be Highway 17 on the Nassau River, I-95 at the St. Marys River and the Buckman Bridge on the St. Johns River. All of these waterways provide great fisheries for striper. Make sure to stay focused, get into the mindset of really searching for them. If you can focus on the hunt, you will be surprised of the outcome.

Hope you all have the opportunity to enjoy your weekend! Until next time, be safe out there and I hope to see you on the water!


