## Callahan Town News

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their final meeting of October. TaNasha Parker, representing the Nassau County Economic Development Board advised the council that the NCEDB celebrated Manufacturing Month in October. "Students from each of the high schools went on tours to different manufacturing companies in the county. In all, over 180 students went through the tours," said Parker. "Today, West Nassau and Hilliard schools first visited Florida Sun Printing, a manufacturing business in Callahan, before heading to Yulee and Fernandina."

"I just want to update the council about the Clean-Up Day on Saturday, November 16," said Mike Cole representing Keep Nassau Beautiful. "We will have the event at the Walter Junior Boatright County Building so we don't mess up the Hobos & Hot Rods Festival. I'll update again as the event gets closer."

The first order of business was the approval of three resolutions. The first, Resolution 2019-R22 concerned donating \$300 to the Girl Scouts for their Thanksgiving baskets for fire stations.

The next, Resolution 2019-R23 concerned donating \$500 to the Barnabas Center.

The final, Resolution 2019-R24 concerned donating \$500 to the Nassau County Relay for Life event that will be held in April 2020.

The next agenda item was the approval of the Design Criteria Package Bid received from GAI Consultants for the Crawford Diamond project. This package is a proposal for Professional Engineering Services for the preparation of a criteria package suitable for obtaining competitive bids from qualified design build teams to extend water and wastewater service to the Crawford Diamond Industrial Park. The total of the Design Criteria package is \$36,392; RFP package, \$22,000 and document services, \$5,000 for a total of \$68,392. The council also approved GAI for the grant administration at a cost of \$15,554. The council approved for Mayor Marty Fontes to sign and submit the package. The funding comes from the grant the town has received.

During the around the council table talk, Mayor Fontes advised the council that he wants them (the council) to consider making the Clerk and the Town Manager an employee position versus and elected position. "If that is agreed on, we need to add it to the November ballot and see what the citizen's want," said Fontes. "I just want you all (council) to be thinking about it and what you want to do."

## Students Enjoy Manufacturing Day

Students from West Nassau High School and Hilliard Middle-Senior High School enjoyed a day touring different manufacturing companies in Nassau County. The event, sponsored by the Nassau County Economic Development Board, scheduled tours for students from all four high schools throughout the month of October to celebrate Manufacturing Month.

The students from WNHS and HMSHS made their first stop at Florida Sun Printing in Callahan. Florida Sun Printing has been in business in Callahan for over 50 years. This manufacturing company is a web press that prints newspapers (Westside Journal), magazines, catalogs, tabloids, etc. They also have the capability to print business cards, letterheads, bulletins, brochures,

etc. They can not only print but can also mail the product.

Students enjoyed a tour throughout the entire plant, beginning in the computer plate room where the job begins. From the plates, the job is sent directly to the press. The students watched a sample of the Westside Journal being printed and

just how fast it can be done. They can print about 12,000 papers in about 45 minutes from start to finish. The tour continued into the paper room where all the huge rolls of different types of paper are stored. All the students were advised that they do take part-time workers and they were encouraged to pick up an application if they wanted to. Assistant Manager Brent Armstrong made sure to tell the students they had to be 18 years old to work around the press area.

After leaving the Florida Sun Printing, the students traveled to Yulee to Florida Machine Works; then to Amelia Toffee in Fernandina Beach and also Mooney's Custom Woodworking in Fernandina Beach. Over 180 students toured through different manufacturing businesses in Nassau County over the four days of field trips for each school.

### Hilliard Town News

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their final meeting of October. The first order of business was a discussion on whether to contract with Mark Anderson, a Governmental Consulting Lobbyist at a cost of \$25,000 per year. The council had a workshop the previous week to meet with Anderson and hear what he had to offer. "I think it would be very beneficial to have a lobbyist for our town in Tallahassee. I think we should be proactive," said Councilwoman Callie Bishop. "I make a motion to contract with Mark Anderson."

"I feel like \$25,000 is a lot of money for a gamble. We didn't budget for this so where would the money come from?" asked Councilman Jared Wollitz.

"The funding would come from cash carried forward from last year," advised Town Clerk Lisa Purvis.

"One concern I have is that Anderson told us that most projects have to be turned in by November 1," said Councilman Kenny Sims. "I don't see how we could have anything that big ready by then. I don't think it's a good idea for this year."

"I think he (Anderson) would put the time forward to make it work," said Mayor Floyd Vanzant. "I've had experience working with him when I

was a Commissioner. I think he could get things done."

"Honestly, I feel like I was blindsided with this at the workshop," added Wollitz. "I felt like the project was decided already and I really didn't know what it was all

After much discussion, the motion died for lack of a second.

The next item was to set workshops for the council for the Community Planning Technical Assistance Grant. The workshops were set for November 21 at 6 p.m.; January 16 at 6 p.m.; and February 17 at 6 p.m. with the council and Planning & Zoning Board.

Resolution 2019-16 was approved which concerned the Town of Hilliard recognizing City Government Week October 21-27 and encouraging all citizens to support the employees of the town. The third grade classes of Hilliard Elementary School will be providing essays in observance of the week. The winners will be announced at the next council meeting on Thursday, November 7 at 7 p.m.

The final item was added by Council President John Beasley who requested that an adjustment to be made on one of the employee's paycheck. The error was a human error and the council approved.

## Ignore at Your Own Peril

As a pastor, I absolutely love preaching through books of the Bible. Hands down, the most neglected book in the Bible is Song of Solomon. This neglect is unfortunate on so many levels. For starters, this is Solomon's finest song. I Kings 4:32 says that Solomon wrote 1,005 songs, but the Song of Solomon was his greatest hit. Solomon is a figure that is absolutely fascinating to me. I Kings 3, we see that God had granted him unprecedented wisdom. Solomon used his wisdom to rule the people of Israel and to write inspired books of the Bible. One of the many purposes of Proverbs is

to instruct his son about the type of woman to avoid and the type of woman to seek. In Ecclesiastes, Solomon wrote about his quest for meaning and fulfillment. One of his pleasure experiments included women and sexual liaisons. Solomon was notorious for his 700 wives and 300 concubines. These thousand women left him empty and unfilled. So when he picks up his writing utensil to record his great song, he is an aged man who has everything but he is envious of a young shepherd boy and a peasant girl.

As he reflects on their relationship, he sees how powerful real love is and he sees how devastating settling for an imitation of love is. Song of Solomon is a book that the church needs to recover, experience, and preach. The Song is a song about desires. The Song cautions us not to engage in love until the appropriate time, with the appropriate person, and the appropriate context. The Song gives us wisdom for enjoying the only institution that is still in existence that is a piece of paradise from Eden. The Song gives us the context in which we can be naked and unashamed again. The Song instructs us on how to enjoy intimacy in our marriages. The Song points us to the power of the love of God that we have been given in the Gospel. The Song is about struggle, pursuit, yearning, and burning with white hot passionate faithful covenant love for our spouse and for God.

In a world that writes more songs about love than any other topic, it only makes sense to read and live the greatest love song ever written. Listen to this beautiful reflection on the power of love from Song of Solomon 8:6-7: Place me like a seal over your heart, like a seal on your arm; for love is as strong as death, its jealousy unyielding as the grave. It burns like blazing fire, like a mighty flame. Many waters cannot quench love; rivers cannot sweep it away. If one were to give all the wealth of one's house for love, it would be utterly scorned. This love is the real thing that transcends anything in our hook-up culture.





Lee found the end zone when he bounced outside for a 5-yard touchdown run. After a successful extra point, the Flashes sprung out in front to an early 7-0 lead. But, the lead quickly evaporated when the Pirates used their aerial attack to launch a 46-yard touchdown pass.

After a successful extra point, the Flashes found themselves tied with the Pirates at 7 at the conclusion of the 1st quarter.

Things started to go downhill from there. After failing to convert on 3rd down, the Flashes were forced to punt, only to find out that the snap was low and blocked. The Pirates then used the big play from special teams and turned it into points courtesy of an 11-yard touchdown run. After a successful extra point, the Pirates took the lead away 14-7. While they were able to orchestrate a drive similar to the one they scored on, however, the Pirates rose up and prevented the Flashes from finding the end zone. It didn't take the Pirates long when they busted out a long 88-yard touchdown run. Suddenly, the Flashes found themselves in a deep hole, trailing their rivals 21-7 and needing an answer. They were able to do just that when Lyle Bennett found D.J. Coston for a 41-yard touchdown. A missed extra point later, the Flashes cut into the deficit 21-13. Once again, the Pirates were able to respond with a drive of their own, resulting in a 42-yard field goal and end the half with a 24-13 lead.

Looking to regain the momentum, the Flashes were to start the second half with the ball, but the Pirates recovered the onside kick. Needing to create a stop, the Flashes

defense stood tall and forced the Pirates to punt. No offense made any headway until the Pirates broke out with a 65-yard touchdown pass. After a failed extra point, the Pirates extend the lead 30-13. But the Bennett-to-Coston connection proved to be effective once again as the pair connected for a 52-yard touchdown pass. After a failed 2-point try, the Flashes continued to chip away at the deficit 30-19 at the end of the 3rd quarter.

The Pirates got the ground game going and chewed up the clock and finding the

end zone again. With the extra point good, the Pirates extended the lead 37-19. After the score, both offenses failed to generate any form of headway. That's when the Flashes came out in the wildcat with Lee at the helm. Lee bolted to freedom with a 72-yard run. One

Freshman quarterback Lyle Bennett went 15/22 for 275 yards and 3 touchdowns; Coston had 8 receptions for 204 yards and 3 touchdowns; Lee with 6 receptions for 56 yards; and Bright with 2 receptions for 14 yards.

Defensively, Seth O'Neil led the charge on defense with 8 tackles and a sack; Tanner Morgan had 5 tackles; Carson Newkirk and D.J. Coston had 4 tackles with Coston having a pass breakup; Cody Bright had 4 tackles; Kale Corbitt and Dylan Coston shared 3 tackles; Cameron Chavarria and Lyle Bennett both had a tackle.


