Friday night, prior to the West Nassau football game, West Nassau Athletic Director Randalyn Bryant along with Assistant Principal Richard Pearce, presented awards to the new members of the West Nassau High School Hall of Fame. This year inductees were: Ms. Hilda Alderman, Coach Johnnie Green, Don Reynolds, Coach Jim Stearn and Howard Kendrick.

The late Don Reynolds award was accepted by his wife, Kay Reynolds and daughters. Mr. Reynolds served as a Band Director in Nassau County for 35 years. Reynolds' bands achieved Superior Rank for 21 years in a row, 28 overall. He served as the FBA Chairman and adjudicator for the State of Florida, and received the Otto J. Kraushaar Award for 2 perfect seasons at District and State. He was a teacher to the lucky ones, mentor to many and a friend to all.

Ms. Hilda Alderman accepted her

award with her family by her side. Ms. Alderman taught at West Nassau for 33 years and was responsible for organizing female sports at West Nassau High School. She served as Head Coach for girls Basketball, Track and Volleyball and was Assistant Softball Coach from 1973-2000. While coaching, the team achieved winning Volleyball Districts & Sectionals in 1997, and went to State in Track in 2000. She was a mentor to many students at West Nassau, at church and in the community.

Coach Johnnie Green accepted his award with his wife Yvonne and his family by his side. Coach Green retired after serving 30 years in education and is also a Vietnam Veteran. He coached football, baseball, track and basketball and was the first African American Athletic Director in Nassau County. He was also selected as 1998 Teacher of the Year. Coach Green is also an ordained Minister serving as Pastor at St. James

### What Can We Do?

After over 75 years of service in the Dinsmore community, the questions members of Kings Road Baptist Church ask themselves are, "How can we continue to serve? What can we do to reach the under-served? What unique method could we employ to reach people in both physical and spiritual senses?" Our membership is aging. Concerns over the pandemic and all that goes with it are constraining. "What can we do?"

The men of the church formed a group known as "The Armory." With the help of Bro. Lee Whitaker, Pastor of Kings Road Baptist Church for over 30 years, The Armory reached out to Bro. Bill Clayton, Pastor of He Said Go Ministries, Inc. Bro. Bill pastors the homeless in the Riverside area of Jacksonville. His ministry provides many of their needs including food, clothing, and bicycles. BICYCLES!

It turns out...a reliable bicycle, much like an automobile, can be very important not only for basic transportation, but it can provide an opportunity for employment. Many of Jacksonville's homeless rely on day labor or casual employment as their only means of support. Getting hired means having to be where the employer is and being there in time to be selected for work. Competition for these jobs can be stiff. Walking to the hiring location, or waiting on a bus can mean missing an opportunity and possibly going hungry



one more day.

With this understanding, The Armory of Kings Road Baptist Church went to work, collecting bicycles to provide to the Homeless by way of He Said Go Ministries.

The Armory accepts donations of working adult bicycles, or bikes that need only minor repairs, such as new tubes/tires, new seats or kick stands. The men clean the bikes, make the repairs, and deliver them, along with cable locks for security, to Bro. Bill Clayton of He Said Go Ministries, where they are distributed according to need. One can easily see that these bicycles are eagerly and enthusiastically received.

In order to continue this outreach. The Armory welcomes donations of adult bicycles. 
## FDOH Encourages Getting Flu Shot

County health departments in Florida are urging residents to contact their health care provider or pharmacy to get vaccinated against the flu as soon as possible. Once vaccinated, it takes about two weeks to offer protection. Getting the flu shot each year is important but reducing illness and hospitalization from flu is even more critical this year to protect frontline health care workers and hospital systems who will continue to care for people with COVID-19 and other illnesses. The flu and



COVID-19 are respiratory illnesses, but until there is a steady vaccine supply against COVID19, the way to prevent these two viruses from circulating at the same time is to get your flu vaccine now. Lives are saved when less virus is circulating.

Additionally, there will be less spread of the flu and COVID-19 if everyone continues to: Stay home if you're sick; Cover coughs and sneezes; Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly; Wear a face covering when around others or if social distancing isn't possible.



Daycares and Hospitality businesses may participate in the reimbursement program by submitting a receipt for a disinfectant fogger. For more information and restrictions, please contact the Chamber of Commerce.
