NCSO Develops Community Crime Map

The Nassau County Sheriff's Office and LexisNexis Risk Solutions have partnered together to provide a new way for our citizens to stay informed about crime in Nassau County.

"NCSO now has a free online crime map called Community Crime Map that maps and analyzes crime data, alerts citizens about crime in their area, and allows our agency to quickly alert the public about crimes as they occur." said Sheriff Bill Leeper.

Nassau County citizens can visit the website directly at www. communitycrimemap.com or www.nassauso.com to find the link, then search for Nassau County and view a map and grid with all of the crimes in their area, sign up for neighborhood watch reports that automatically email a breakdown of recent crime activity, and

submit an anonymous tip about a crime directly to law enforcement.

Information that will be provided includes: the type of crime, location type, block-level address, date and time. This means you'll be able to check your own neighborhood to see what is actually occurring so you can take the necessary precautions to reduce your chances of becoming a victim of crime.

"We all must work together and its partnerships that make our county safer, so please let us know if you see anything suspicious," added Leeper.

Fish Talk

Let's get our Sheepshead on!

The bite is heating up and you don't want to miss out! Great reports have come in from all over our region. For many, sheepshead season starts in October and runs through March. I can tell you from recent trips; it looks like it's going to be a banner season. Normally by the beginning of October, fiddler crabs become scarce. So far, with the warmer weather, our bait stores are staying stocked up. That being said, the sheepshead bite inshore is on fire. There are numerous docks that seem to be holding decent size fish along with all types of inshore structure.

I've received several pictures of quality fish! Yes, most are coming from our local rivers located from Jekvll Island to Mayport. It shouldn't be long before we see the jetties firing off as well. Keep a check on the marine forecast and find the best days to suit your equipment. When you do get out, you're sure to have success. As far as myself, I like fishing the last of the incoming and the first part of the outgoing. Focus on breaks in the current around rock piles, trees, docks and bridge pilings. You will find that the current will vary from one location to another. All of this is due to the moon phases and many other larger variables that nature throws at us.

That being said, keep a few larger weights handy in case you need more lead to stay in the strike zone which many times is just off the bottom. Once you find the fish, be patient and cover the area well. If you want to improve your chances, chum legally when you can. So what kind of tackle and bait to use? A standard fish finder rig with a 10-inch leader or simply use a jig head tied to your main line. Tip them with a live fiddler and slowly, vertically jig them over submerged structure. A jig will allow you to feel the fish immediately and many times improves your hook up ratio. The idea in most cases are to snag the fish before he steals your bait, sounds fun right? If you don't hang up more than you catch fish, there's a possibility that you aren't in the right area. Sheepshead love heavy structure both for hiding and food sources so always keep that the main focus.

Here's my tip of the day: Sometimes sheepshead can be leader shy in slower moving currents. So a basic 2/0 live bait kahle hook with a 15-20 pound fluorocarbon leader may work best. It's not always best to downsize leaders because you lose more fish but, it will help you get more bites! Hope you all have a safe weekend on the water!

In the Kitchen...

1/4 cup honey

2 tablespoons prepared yellow mustard 1 tablespoon butter

1/2-inch thick garlic powder, or to taste

Mix honey and mustard together in a bowl until thoroughly combined.

Honey Mustard Pork Chops

1 1/2 lbs. center-cut boneless pork chops -

Heat butter in a skillet over medium-high heat and lay pork chops into the hot butter. Sprinkle chops with half the garlic powder and cook until browned, about 3 minutes. Turn chops over, sprinkle with remaining garlic powder, and pan-fry chops for 3 more minutes.

Brush honey mustard sauce over chops, turn them over, and cook for 5 minutes; turn chops onto other side and brush with honey mustard sauce. Cook until chops are no longer pink inside and an instant-read meat thermometer inserted into the thickest part of a chop reads 165°, about 5 more minutes





With a missed extra point, the Flashes sprung out to an early 6-0 lead. And they were just getting started. After forcing a defensive stop, the Flashes got the ball back. Picking up where they left off from the previous game, the Bennett-to-Coston connection showed up and showed out as the pair connected 37 yards for the touchdown. After an extra point made by Cody Bright, the Flashes extended the lead to 13-0 at the end of the 1st quarter.

The offense kept the momentum rolling when Lyle Bennett found Tywuan Lee who took the pass 37 yards for a touchdown. The extra point was good extending the lead to 20-0. Bennett connected with Coston again, this time from 41 yards. After another missed extra point, the Flashes went into halftime leading the Eagles 26-0.

In the third quarter, things started to shift the wrong way. After forcing a threeand-out, the Eagles got the ball back. The Eagles went down the field finding the end zone with a 3-yard touchdown run. After a successful 2-point conversion, the Eagles cut the lead down to 26-8. The Flashes responded with a drive that ended the 3rd quarter.

The Flashes defense stood tall when Cameron Chavarria recovered the fumble. The Flashes capitalized when Lee scampered for a 20-yard touchdown. The Flashes continued to add to the score when Kale Corbitt returned a fumble recovery 12 yards for a score. After successful extra points, the Flashes grew their lead 40-8. The Flashes defense added another turnover when Nathan Wilson caused a fumble and then recovered it. After a ceremonial kneel down, this performance was just what the Flashes needed to get back on track,

scoring on all three phases of the game on their way to an emphatic 40-8 victory over the Bronson Eagles and improve to 5-4, guaranteeing the Flashes their first winning season since 2016.

The Flashes offense picked up where they left off from their last game, putting up 326 yards of total offense with 124 of them coming on the ground off 21 carries, and 4 touchdowns. Leading the charge on the ground was Cody Bright who racked up 40 vards off of 8 carries: Tywuan Lee with 6 carries for 18 yards and a touchdown; D.J. Coston had 1 carry for 15 yards; Seth O'Neil had 2 carries for 10 yards; Lyle Bennett had 2 carries for 6 yards; and Brandon Matthews had 2 carries for 5 yards.

Bennett had another productive game in the air, going 7/16 for 202 yards, 3 touchdowns, and an interception. On the receiving end of Bennett's passes were Lee with 3 receptions for 90 yards and a touchdown; D.J. Coston had 2 receptions for 78 yards and 2 touchdowns; and Dylan Coston had 2 receptions for 34 yards.

Defensively, the Flashes rebounded tremendously, forcing 3 turnovers and holding the Eagles offense to 8 points and 80 yards of total offense off 45 plays, and 40 of the yards on the ground. Leading the charge on defense was O'Neil, who totaled 7 tackles: Carson Newkirk who had 6 tackles: Corbitt with 5 tackles and a fumble recovery for a touchdown: Wilson had 5 tackles, a forced fumble, and a fumble recovery; Tristin Moody and D.J. Coston both had 4 tackles; Tanner Morgan and Anthony Conner had 3 tackles; Josh Yancey had 2 tackles; Chavarria had 2 tackles, a sack, and fumble recovery; Lee and Josh Johnson each had a tackle a piece.

The Flashes close out the regular season on the road against North Florida Educational Institute Eagles at 6 p.m. Come out and support your hometown team. Keep calm and go Flashes! #Nathanstrong



Warriors Win on Senior Night!



Clerk Employees Review **Domestic Violence Training**




The Nassau County Clerk of Court and Comptroller employees spent the day, Thursday, October 24, with officials from Micah's Place, learning about domestic violence prevention and how to help citizens seeking relief.

Florida Statue 741.30 requires Clerk of Court employees to receive training in the effective assistance of petitioners seeking shelter from domestic abuse. That's where Micah's Place staff comes in. Micah's Place is the certified domestic violence center that serves survivors of domestic violence in Nassau County. The center offers services including an emergency shelter, 24/7 hotline, legal assistance, court advocacy, as well as outreach program and supportive services.

"Our partnership with the court system is extremely important in making a smooth transition for victims of abuse into a place of safety," said Cassie Ott, Micah's Place Outreach Director. "One of the biggest legal protections a survivor can gain is an injunction for protection – a restraining order - against their abuser."

Court employees help file protection orders, offer information for protections under the law, and provide assistance connecting to services provided by state and county providers like Micah's Place.
