

The Crews are currently staying at Tammy's house in Yulee. This is the last thing anyone needs to be worried about at 76 years old. Mr. Crews' health is failing and I'm sure the added stress isn't helping the situation.

Wendall retired from the Nassau County Sheriff's Office, where he

worked as a deputy. Donnie Jean worked at Aunt Bee's Daycare in Hilliard for over 20 years. "On a positive note, about 6 months ago, Daddy lost his wedding ring that Mama gave him 57 years ago. We searched and searched and could never find it," posted Tammy. "Mama found it today. To see her excitement today brought joy to my heart and Daddy was beyond happy. To see them both smiling considering what they've been through was such a blessing. My family has been so amazing throughout

this process."

Mayo Chicken

1 teaspoon salt freshly ground black pepper to taste ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese

Preheat the oven to 350°. Place chicken pieces into a 9x13-inch baking dish. Stir together mayonnaise, garlic, rosemary, salt, and black pepper in a bowl. Spread mayonnaise mixture over chicken; top with Parmesan cheese. Bake in the preheated oven until no longer pink in the center and the juices run clear, about 1 hour and 10 minutes. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 165°.

Green Signs with Troy University







All Star Youth Showman 4-H Club Shine at the Fair!

This year the Northeast Florida Fair put together a fantastic agricultural experience for fairgoers, 4-H and FFA youth. One new 4-H Club rose to the challenge. All Stock Youth Showman club members participated in several of the fair's livestock shows and events. They even earned some of the top awards. Many of the members of All Stock Youth Showman are new to 4-H and agriculture. They spent many hours training and studying cattle, goats, poultry, rabbits and livestock judging. The club members will be attending livestock shows across the states of Florida and Georgia with the goals of showing animals and learning new life skills.

"This was the first year that I started branching out into different species of livestock. I remember watching the cattle show at last year's fair and I thought I could do this," stated Garrett Bennett, a senior in 4-H. "I decided to start learning and I knew I wanted to show both dairy and beef cattle. Thanks to my contacts in 4-H, I was able to lease a Jersey calf from Jessica Maynard and



a Charolais heifer from Saydie Price to show at this year's fair. It was a truly amazing experience."

4-H is all about "Learn by Doing." This is a very true statement for the All Stock Youth Showman 4-H club members. Most of the members do not own livestock and never had the opportunity to work with these kinds of animals. The club leaders Sarah Bennett and Renee Shannon aim to allow all youth the learn by doing experience. Members are provided with animals to lease and the training to go along with them. "I want to allow youth



to learn new skills in an uplifting and supportive environment. It is very important to me to give back to the very same community that has supported my son for many years and this is one way for me to do just that," said Sarah Bennett, Club Leader.

New 4-H members Emma and Brooklyn

Hansford both senior 4-H'ers joined the club and expressed interest in working with beef cows. Leader Renee Shannon and her husband Lee found two heifers for the girls to show. Emma and Brooklyn spent many hours breaking and training the heifers to get them ready to show at the NEFL Fair. Wouldn't you know that on the day of the show, the heifers were less than cooperative, but Emma and Brooklyn relied on their training and handled the situation like true showman! "I was so proud of the girls. Their first show didn't quite go as planned, but they worked hard and put on a good show," added Renee.

The Mclay girls Brynn, Carys and Delaney, who are also new to All Stock Youth Showman, joined in the fair activities by showing poultry, rabbits, and goats. Carys a junior 4-H member won first place in rabbit showmanship earning her first-ever belt buckle. Brynn and Delaney also placed well in their shows and judging competitions.

All Stock Youth Showman Club is your adventure waiting



to happen. The club meets on the first Saturday of each month in Hilliard and is open to ages 5-18. You do not need to own livestock to join. This club travels to several agricultural events each year.

The club needs round pens to provide a safe and secure place to train large animals, a livestock trailer, clippers for shaving animals, and stanchions for cattle and goats. The club is seeking sponsors and/or donations to help with supplies and costs.



This fictional column features an inside look into the lives of John and Bethany McNair, a couple who live and work in Nassau County. The McNairs have three children, John Jr., 19, Brianna, 15, and Jacob, 5. Mr. McNair is a transplant from Chicago, Illinois, who teaches art. Mrs. McNair is a Nassau County native who works as a forester and has deep roots here.

I love my daddy. I'm his "little girl," and always will be, even though I'm in my forties with three kids of my own. Recently, we moved Daddy into an assisted living facility (ALF). Like most other people, my father has an opinion. Unlike others, my father has no trouble letting his opinion be known. We try to take Daddy on a field trip from the facility every month or so. We might take him to watch sunrise at the beach and eat breakfast somewhere. Dad needs a wheelchair, so the whole process is a production, but we manage. Daddy insists on naming restaurants he and Mom used to visit. Unfortunately, most of them closed years ago. So now, we give him a list of restaurants that are actually open. He finds fault in almost every one of them! The food is undercooked or overcooked, too raw or too stale, too crisp or too wilted.

A new breakfast and lunch place opened recently. John and I took Daddy there. We didn't discuss it with him first, we just went. Basically, if he wanted to eat, he needed to get in the wheelchair or else he could stay hungry in the car. "This car is so tiny! What is it? A Hot Wheels car?" he yelled, starting everyone's day with a complaining

spirit. "Can't you get any closer to the door?" he asked, after we parked in the first handicapped spot. Had Daddy always been this grumpy?

Once we were seated, the waitress gave us menus and took our drink order. I went to the ladies' room once she left. Well, not exactly. I actually followed her and begged her to forgive my dad for anything he had said or would say.

She didn't bat an eye and told me she knew how to handle senior citizens. John ordered French toast with maple syrup, while I ordered grits, eggs and bacon. I cringed when the sweet waitress turned to Dad to take his order. He wanted traditional oatmeal, not the

microwaved junk, two strips of bacon... extra crispy, and some strawberries. Oh, and a whole pot of hot coffee. I guess he planned to stay a while.

While we waited, Dad complained about crying children and banging sounds from the kitchen. But he didn't complain about the waitress, which was unusual. A few minutes later, the waitress returned with our food and coffee. She brought plenty of creamers and sugar packs, she said, because she wasn't sure how Daddy drank his coffee. We all enjoyed our meal, but Daddy was quiet. His oatmeal, bacon, and strawberries must have been perfect since his complaining ceased. Maybe he had just been hungry. Our waitress came by multiple times, but Daddy the only thing Daddy ordered was another pot of coffee. "I see the 'liars corner' table over there," Daddy said a few minutes later. Some of his friends sat a few tables away from us, but they had not seen him. I offered to roll him over to say hi, but he didn't want his friends to see him in his wheelchair.

> Daddy insisted on paying the check, even though protested. We rolled his chair to the cash register, and then we remembered just how old school my dad is. He doesn't use a credit card...ever. He counts out each bill and coin from his billfold or pocket.

After he paid, he held out his hands for the change, which totaled something like \$1.50. He handed me the money and asked me to go back and leave it on the table as a tip. I did what Daddy asked, except I added more to the tip.

The restaurant was short-staffed that day, so our waitress was cleaning the table when I got there. I handed her the money and thanked her for being patient with Daddy. She wouldn't take it. She explained how her grandfather and my dad were alike. Then, she shared how she had lost her grandfather a few months earlier. Their demeanor, their look, and their way of speaking were very similar, she said. It was her privilege to serve us, and have her 'grandfather' back in a way.

"That waitress sure knew how to take care of customers and keep my coffee cup full," Dad said as we pulled into the ALF. Pretty high praise from my curmudgeonly dad! I hope that waitress is working at the restaurant the next time we go. She was a blessing to us that day. Until next time, and until our next outing for breakfast, we'll be living our Naturally Nassau life.


