

Local Company and Churches Share Hurricane Relief



What to do While We Wait on God

We have all experienced bitter times in our life. We will all experience future tribulations as well. When we are in the deepest part of the bitter valley what do we place our trust in to get us through? The first and most honest answer many of us would give is that our first reaction is to rely on our own abilities. Think of the adage, "If you want something done right, do it yourself." This does not leave much room for faith. In fact, God does not want us to rely on any source or ability other than

Him. Not only does God want us to call out to him in the good times and bad, but God also wants us to wait on Him as well.

Calling out to God is but the first step in placing our faith in Him. When we do call out in distress during these bitter times, what are we expecting? One often misquoted verse comes to mind. The first is Psalm 37:4. It reads, "Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart."

Do Not Be Afraid of the **Current Interest Rates**

Do not allow the inflated interest rates to paralyze your plans. When rates are high it affects your buying power. You will need to do a little more pre-budgeting or planning to achieve your goal of a house purchase or build but it is possible!

I know it can seem scary when just 6 months ago you could afford a \$300,000.00 home but now you can only afford a \$230,000.00 home. Interest rates dictate your payment when getting a mortgage for either building or buying a house.

Example numbers:

Edward Jones

The payment for a home with total cost of \$350,000.00 at 6 percent for 30 years is \$2,098.43.

The payment for a home with total cost of \$300,000.00 at 6 percent for 30 years is \$1,798.65.

The payment for a home with total cost \$230,000.00 at 6 percent for 30 years is \$1,378.97.

Ideas to help you modify your current plan:

- 1. Shrink your building plan by two hundred square feet. If the cost to build is \$150.00 per square foot you would be saving \$30,000.00. To show you the pricing difference to consider; \$300,000.00 principal mortgage payment for 30 years is \$1,798.65 but if you shave off two hundred square feet off your building plan, then your principal mortgage payment comes down to \$1,618.79.

- 6. Save more money to put towards your down payment. If your loan requires twenty percent, then try to save twenty-five to thirty percent. The more down payment you have the less your monthly payment will be for you.



golfers and volunteers.


But the real beneficiaries of OREMC's day of fun, fellowship and fundraising are friends and neighbors in the community battling cancer. When Carolyn Carter of Hoboken was diagnosed with breast cancer back in 2008 gas prices were high, and she traveled to Brunswick for five weeks of chemotherapy followed by 30 days of radiation. Henderson reached out to her and asked her what she needed. Carter noted, "I knew about the Southeast Cancer Unit, but I would never ask for anything. Then Linda offered and the money was so helpful. I had people

driving me because I couldn't. I really admire Linda and the others for what they are doing. It is a wonderful thing."

Joe Shear of Waycross agrees, but unlike Carter he was not familiar with SECU. "I was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor in my colon in June 2020. My first colonoscopy was at age 67 after a Cologuard test put up a red flag. Let that be a lesson, don't wait to have a colonoscopy," said Joe. "Between travel for treatment and medications, those extra costs add up. My pharmacy told me about the Southeast Cancer Unit and I called Linda. The money for medications and gas cards have been a godsend. It took a lot of worry off of me."

Shear has ongoing treatment, and his surgeon is in Savannah. He says he is indebted to the Southeast Cancer Unit and encourages anyone undergoing cancer treatment who needs help to reach out: "Don't hesitate. They are wonderful people and eager to help."
