
# It's Onion Planting Time!



# Crawford Road Ribbon Cutting Held

A ribbon cutting was held recently in celebration the Crawford Road improvements project which consisted of paving the existing 6.5 mile-long, two lane dirt road connecting County Road 121 with the existing paved portion of Crawford Road, just west of US 301.

This \$6.95 million project is critical to improving mobility, promoting job growth and attracting industry to western Nassau County. The project is strategically located to become a future industrial and technological epicenter supported logistically by a robust roadway and railway transportation

hub. The Board entered agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation in March 2014 for Small County Outreach Program (SCOP) grant funding to assist with project costs.

While we were hopeful the project would be completed by today's Ribbon Cutting, the contractor had a few more items left to complete. However, we anticipate it being fully opened late next

## Callahan Town News

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their final meeting of November. Sherri Mitchell, Executive Director of the Nassau County Economic Development Board addressed the council. "The NCEDB is a non-profit made up of a 28 person board of people throughout all of Nassau County," said Mitchell. "We have a strategic plan

focusing on four goals that we are working on: Business Recruitment, Business Expansion and Incentives and Services. We would appreciate our support on Rural Counties Day January 26 & 27 which will be focusing on Callahan/Hilliard."

The only business completed was the election of Council President for Fiscal Year 2021-2022. The council chose Ken Bass to continue as Council President and Fire Commissioner. The assignment of departments didn't change either as all council persons chose to keep their current positions which are: Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming, Water Wastewater Commissioner; Councilwoman Ashton Bishop Vargas, Street Commissioner; Councilwoman Janet Shaw, Town Promotions and

Parks & Recreation Commissioner; and Councilman David Mellecker, Zoning Department Commissioner.

In closing comments, Town Manager Mike Williams updated the council on the approved paving projects on Page, Booth and Dixie Streets. "I've talked with Duval Asphalt and it looks like it will be January before they get up here to do the paving," said Williams.

"I've also talked with the Zoning Board about the possibility of closing Page Street from SR 200 and making the entry through the new entry beside Popeye's. That's just a thought right now."

Also, Council President Ken Bass advised the council that the Callahan Volunteer Fire Department are moving forward with showing a 'Movie at the Park – Remember the Magic' on Saturday, December 4 starting at 6 p.m. with food (to purchase) and a bounce house. The movie will begin at 7 p.m. Bass also added that the CVFD will be having the Santa Run on December 18 and they could use help purchasing toys to give out on that day.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday. December 6 at 7 p.m.





Marvin Ezell Rowell, 86, of Hilliard, passed away Wednesday, November 10, 2021, at the Community Hospice Warner Center for


