the former Fuqua Pharmacy, for about 49 years. Surprisingly to me, she is a young 92 years old. She is very humble and gives all the credit to having a good job and a great boss. "I have made so many friends through the years," said Ms. Kay. "I have worked with some good people that turned out to be such special friends. I love working with flowers and people so this has been the perfect job for me."



Ms. Kay is planning for her last day at work to be Friday, December 9. Hopefully, this will give people plenty of time to come by the store and share well wishes for her. This Thursday, December 1, there will be a drop-in reception held at Hilliard Pharmacy from 2-6 p.m. to honor Ms. Kay for her years of service. Anyone is encouraged to come by and see her.

Keiko, Kay to her friends, Harada Moore was born in Yokohama, Japan, to Chihiro and Hanae Harada in 1930. But before her parents met, her father was a merchant seaman and came to the United States as a young man. He stayed in New York for several years, working in the restaurant business. When he returned and married, he knew farming was no longer for him, so he opened up a cafe called New York.

Before the end of World War II, the family moved to Tokyo, where Kay's dad opened another restaurant and met Lester L. Moore who was in the United States Air Force and eventually, introduced him to his middle daughter, Kay. With her parents' blessings, she and Lester, whose family was from Florida and had lived in Jacksonville, married in 1951. In 1952, they moved to Florida and started their family. Their first two daughters were born, Rachel in 1952 and Marie 1953. In 1954, Kay became a naturalized American Citizen, and Lester was transferred to Morocco, where their last two children were born. Carolyn in 1955 and Lester Jr. in 1956. Kay's husband served 30 years in the US Air Force.

Over the years, Kay and her four children followed her husband to different duty stations. Once more, he See 'Ms. Kay' on page 2

returned to Japan. While there, Kay became a Certified Instructor of OHara Reyu Ikebana floral arrangement in 1960. They then lived in Kansas and Spain. In Kansas, Kay worked part time in a floral shop while raising teens alone as her husband served in Vietnam and in cold North Dakota.

Finally, in 1972, Lester and Kay returned to Florida, settling in Hilliard. With the last of her children leaving home, Kay applied for a job at Fuqua's Pharmacy. Mrs. Kay began working at Fugua's Pharmacy in 1973 for Mr. Cole Fugua. She joined Mrs. Evelyn Grooms in working the soda fountain and the front of the store. They were later joined by Mrs. Twila Higginbotham. Mr. Fuqua passed away in 1984 and the store was purchased by Marion and Dianne Wainright and Karen and Terry Thigpen.



Hilliard Pharmacy was established April 2, 1984 and Mrs. Kay began working there with the new owners that day. Mrs. Kay continued to work at the fountain and at the front of the store but soon added working with Karen in the pharmacy to her duties. She wrote receipts, helped to count pills, and did whatever was necessary. Her cheerful countenance and sweet smile made her a favorite with the customers.

In 1989, Hilliard Pharmacy built a new building and the location lent itself to a larger out-front area with more selling space. In 1991, the drug store started selling fresh and silk flowers. In 1994, at the age of 64, Mrs. Kay went back to school attaining an Associates Degree in Floral Design from Jacksonville Junior College and eventually became the Chief Floral Designer for the pharmacy.

Mrs. Kay has been a mainstay at Fuqua's and Hilliard Pharmacy for approximately 49 years. She is loved by her coworkers and customers.



Christmas Is All About Jesus!

In 1963, Andy Williams sang to us that "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year." And Christmas time can most certainly feel quite wonderful. However, it can also feel quite busy. Some of the things we have to do could include: taking down Thanksgiving décor, putting up Christmas décor inside and lights outside, buying presents for maybe 20 or more people (including the pressure to find that incredible Black Friday/Cyber Monday deal), buying a Secret Santa gift for a co-worker who we may not know what they

want, driving the kids around to look at lights, cleaning up our house in preparation for family that will visit, or figuring out food for gatherings. It seems like the list never ends.

And although many or all of these things are important, they all fall short of what Christmas is really about. The truth is CHRISTMAS IS ALL ABOUT JESUS! Christmas is nothing more and nothing less than the celebration of Jesus coming to the world.

Our church is doing a series this Christmas by that title (Christmas Is All About Jesus). Each week we are looking at verses about Jesus. Our first one was Colossians 1:15-20, "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross." There are so many truths about Jesus in these verses. Theologian Andrew Herbert points out that this text shows us that Jesus is Lord of Creation and Lord of the Church.

In this passage, we see Jesus as Lord of creation because he is the Creator, the Priority over all things and the Sustainer of all things. We also see Him as the Lord of the church because of His resurrection, His Deity (He is God), and His Saving Work. If you would like to spend sometime today on Who Christmas is really all about, take the capitalized words in this paragraph and see if you can find them referenced in the Bible passage above.

On a side note, Christmas falls on a Sunday this year. What will you do? If your church is offering services, will you go? What message about our priorities does worshipping Jesus on the celebration of His birthday send to our children? We all want to open presents (and that could be done before or after), but what better birthday present is there for Jesus that your presence to worship Him? Sonshine Christian Holds Art Contest






