
## **Fatal Accident Takes Two Lives**


Friday morning the sound of sirens filled the Callahan area. Sirens are heard often but this time there were several sirens. A horrible accident happened south of Callahan near Ratliff Road, off of Wind Chime Lane. Residents living near the area noticed the fencing and signs destroyed near the retention pond and immediately called 9-1-1. According to Florida Highway Patrol reports, the call came in to dispatch around 8:30 a.m. Friday morning. A wrecker was called to the scene and began the process of retrieving a vehicle that was submerged in the small pond.

According to the reports, a Silver

23, from Hilliard, and his passenger Mara Sullivan, 17, from Jacksonville, was traveling southbound on Wind Chime Lane from the intersection of US 1. As the pavement ended on the dead end roadway, the mustang continued straight and struck various sign posts of reflective signage and then a fence. After the vehicle went through the

fence, it entered into the small retention pond and submerged. Both occupants were unable to exit the vehicle after

## Captain Bruton Remembered

#### Kim Hoffecker, Chaplain, Kirby-Smith Camp 1209

On Saturday, December 3, 2022, Kirby-Smith Camp 1209 joined with other Sons of Confederate Veterans camps from Florida and Georgia to unveil a headstone for the previously unmarked grave of Thomas Jefferson Bruton.

Following a year at West Point, Bruton returned to Florida to defend the South. In the latter part of the War for Southern Independence, Captain Bruton commanded a group known as "Bruton's



Light Artillery" and rode with Captain J.J. Dickinson, defending lives and property in northeast Florida. Bruton died January 6, 1876 at age 33. He was laid to rest in Oak City Cemetery in Bainbridge, Georgia, where the marker ceremony took place.

The event began with prayer, presentation of flags, remarks about Captain Bruton with the unveiling of the marker and the placing of a single red rose. It ended with the firing of muskets and an artillery piece as a salute and the playing of "Taps."





Recently, Nassau County 4-H and Emergency Management celebrated the graduation of their 5th Youth Emergency Team (YET) cadre. Far too often in life youth are expected to follow an adult's lead, especially in emergency situations. However, these organizations recognize the importance of empowering our youth with life-saving measures now. In YET, graduates must pass a written test and practical drill where they demonstrate their abilities to work both independently and as a team by: extinguishing fires, assessing/searching disaster scenes and rescuing trapped victims, administering first aid, calmly providing professional communication to victims and first responders, setting up & manning animal shelters, and managing animals in disaster scenarios including first-aid and low-stress handling. On top of these requirements, each cadre member completes a capstone public communication outreach project, additional homework, creating their family animal and human disaster kits/plans, and over 25 of afterschool instruction. #### NOMINATION PERIOD FOR THE CURRENT CYCLE ENDS ON JANUARY 31, 2023

Nominations are accepted on a rolling basis.

The Nassau County Conservation Land Acquisition and Management (CLAM) program was created to preserve and conserve the county's natural, historic, and working lands resources by identifying, ranking, and assessing conservation lands for acquisition and management.

During the initial CLAM nomination period, July 24, 2021 through January 31, 2022, over 750 parcels were nominated for inclusion in the CLAM program. Staff completed its evaluation of the nominations and presented its top 25 ranking recommendations to the CLAM Committee. The Committee's final ranking was approved by the Board of County Commissioners on September 26, 2022.

Nominations of properties may be submitted from any person or organization, including the County, nonprofit organizations, and local, regional, state, or federal governmental entities. To nominate a property for potential acquisition, the nominator shall submit an application to the Nassau County Planning Department. Nominators may nominate an entire parcel for acquisition in fee simple or only a specific portion thereof or interest therein. In nominating properties, nominators should consider, at a minimum, the information contained in the Conservation Plan, the CLAM Resource Rankings Map, and the CLAM Manual.

Previously submitted parcels do not need to be resubmitted. All previously submitted nominations remain eligible for consideration.

Nominations must be received by the Nassau County Planning Department no later than 5:00 pm on Tuesday, January 31, 2023. Nominations received after the nomination period will not be considered for the 2023 cycle. Five Juniors and two Seniors in West Nassau's AFJROTC Program have received a scholarship to attend an accredited aviation university participating in a Private Pilot Certificate training program in the summer of 2023.

Alanah Dohm, Brandon Miller (alternate), Rick Miller, Caydee Pine, Allen Price, Arianna Rosen and Ryland Weyburn are part of 200 Air Force Junior ROTC cadets around the world to receive the scholarship from Headquarters Air Force Junior ROTC, Maxwell Air Force Base, Montgomery, AL. More than 1300 cadets applied for one of the 200 scholarships. There are almost 120,000 high school students enrolled in Air Force Junior ROTC programs at approximately 870 high schools in the U.S. and overseas. The scholarship covers transportation, room and board, academics and flight hours required to potentially earn a Private Pilot Certificate. The scholarship is valued at approximately \$22,500.

The Air Force Junior ROTC Flight Academy Scholarship Program is an Air Force-level initiative in collaboration with the commercial aviation industry to address the national civilian and military pilot shortage. The Flight Academy allows aspiring young aviators to get their Private Pilot's Certification, at no cost, during an eight-week summer course at partner universities. Those who participate in the program will earn a college transcript but do not incur a military commitment to the Air Force or other branch of service, nor does completing the program guarantee acceptance into one of the military's commissioning

## First Coast Honor Flight Visits Veterans Council


