Fatal Shooting in Callahan

Wednesday morning, the Spring Lake Estates neighborhood in Callahan was awaken by a heavy police presence. According to a briefing from Nassau County Sheriff Bill Leeper, a man is in custody after allegedly killing three individuals in a Spring Lake Estates home on Deer Run Road. NCSO was dispatched around 7 a.m. Wednesday.

Leeper said, "We do have the suspect in custody at this time so there is no concern for safety in the neighborhood."

Sheriff Leeper confirmed that two adult females and one adult male were fatally shot. He could not confirm if they were related to one another and said they are still working the case. The investigation is ongoing.



1 finely chopped onion


2 cups milk

Each year at our church, on some Sunday toward the end of November or mid-December, I give my "take it back" speech. It's where I disappoint each child and make parents think about February. You see, as Christmas approached and Black Friday comes around, we begin to buy things. We buy stuff for ourselves and we buy things for others. We are told if we buy now we will save. But, I have to be honest with you. That's not how saving works. When we buy stuff, we aren't

saving. In fact, spending money (even if it's less money) is the opposite of saving

Also, just like November and December rolled around, January and February will soon roll around. And with those latter two, comes a reckoning. It's called the credit card bill. We were so fast to whip out that card and swipe (or now-aday "insert chip"). But soon, all our new debt will catch up to us. It's OK though, because if we can't afford the whole bill this month, the bank will be glad to forward the remainder to next month; for a hefty interest charge of course.

So, I make it a point each year to encourage our church attenders to "Take It Back." Your loved ones will not love you more if you spend more. Let me repeat: Your love for others is not measured by how much you spend on them.

Instead, let me recommend you make a much larger sacrifice. We are in the middle of a Christmas sermon series from 12 Stones Church called One Christmas. In it we have been looking at the Christmas story through the perspective of Joseph. We recognized that Joseph was Present, Active, and Vocal for the first Christmas. He chose to Engage with God, with Mary and with Jesus at His birth. I want to encourage you this Christmas season to be present. Be present with God (spend time with Him). Be present with your family (physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually). Be active (don't be a by-stander, get involved). And be vocal (share with your loved ones your thoughts, feelings, and ideas). This Christmas, Engage. Because our enemy would love nothing less than for us to disengage from God and our family and to simply smooth it all over with big spending.

Engage this Christmas as Christ has modeled for us. Christ was present here on the earth. He took an active role in saving us from our sin. His words are the full expression of God's voice. When we Engage with God and our loved ones, we are imitating Christ. I love the way Paul put it: "And you should imitate me, just as I imitate Christ." 1 Corinthians 11:1 NLT

How to Save \$300 A Month

- Invest in a good coffee maker. We purchased the Keurig Duo that makes a pot of coffee and a single cup. We use both daily!
- Use delicious coffee and good creamer. This way you are not shorting yourself on flavor.
- Use a cute travel mug. I know it is just a mental thing, but a pretty travel mug makes me smile in the mornings! On the average, a cup of coffee out costs \$5. That could equate up to \$100 a month.

Using these two areas for savings will help you put \$300 back into your account at the end of the month, not to mention help you set aside funds for your much needed emergency fund. (We will go deep in this topic next month). I pray that you'll be encouraged to begin your journey of saving today!





Shooting Still Under Investigation

Last Tuesday, November 23 at 5:24 p.m., the Nassau County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call in reference to a report of two people being shot at 96358 Otter Run Drive in the Otter Run Subdivision.

When deputies arrived they saw a male suspect on the front porch of the residence with a fatal gunshot wound to the head. Inside the home, a female victim had two gunshot wounds to her right arm and shoulder area. She was transported to UF Health Downtown Jacksonville with non-life threatening injuries.

The preliminary investigation revealed there had been an ongoing

quarrel between the suspect and the victim's family. The suspect, who lived across the street, approached the front door of the victim's residence and observed through the window the female homeowner (victim) sitting in a front office area. As the victim looked up she saw the suspect point a handgun at her and opened fire through the window striking her in the right arm. She got up to run and was shot a second time in the right arm area. She went into another room and hid and called 911. The suspect took his own life by fatally shooting himself on the front porch. The shooting is still under investigation at this time.






