# County Road 121 to Close Temporarily



Thankfully the residents who were so affected by the massive closure of County Road 121 for months have somewhat recovered only to see signs going up again concerning another road closure. We have received the information where the actual road will be closed so the residents can plan accordingly.

The closure will begin and detour

enacted on Monday. December 9. It will take place between Sikes Lane (Addison Lane) and Tomlinson Road at County Road 121 in order to replace a failed cross drain culvert system. The 18-mile detour will have northbound and southbound drivers on County Road 121 bypass the closed section via Bay Road and County Road 108.

Electronic message boards are placed on

County Road 121 to notify motorists of the closure in advance.

## Barnabas 'Client Choice' Food Pantry Program

It's a Monday at at Barnabas Center on Jasmine Street in Fernandina Beach. The main door to the Barnabas Food Pantry, located on the west side of the building, is buzzing with activity.



Everyone waiting in the line to enter the pantry has something in common: They are in need of food to feed themselves and their families. The people in this line represent some of the faces of hunger and food insecurity in Nassau County. It is estimated that 1 of 6 adults and 1 of 4 children in our community is hungry or does not know when or how they will get their next meal.

To help alleviate hunger and food insecurity, Barnabas provides an average of 14,000 pounds of nutritious food each month to nearly 400 households through the newly adopted client choice model, which is a growing trend in community food pantries across the country.

The client choice model puts the food selection process directly in the hands of people who are receiving food assistance. The food pantry is now configured as a small grocery store, complete with fullsize grocery carts. Volunteers walk with clients along neatly stacked foods on shelves and a refrigerator and a freezer filled with fresh and frozen items, helping them select only the foods they want.

"We were seeking ways to improve our food pantry program to best meet the nutritional and dietary needs of individual and families who struggle to make ends meet each month," said Wanda Lanier, Barnabas CEO. "Our new client choice program has proven to be beneficial for our clients, who are often reluctant to ask for help in the first

"Barnabas is always there for me," said Stan Jones, a local man who has benefitted from the food pantry other Barnabas and programs. "I've counted on Barnabas

for the past few years. This new way to get my monthly food is much better than receiving pre-selected food."

Joy Riggs and Sarah Hooper are firsttime food pantry participants who were pleased with the client choice setup. Hooper was excited about choosing some lower sodium items and fresh tomatoes,



and Riggs couldn't wait to get home to bake a birthday cake for her daughter.

"This pantry is a lifesaver for me and my children," said Riggs. "I struggle to feed them toward the end of the month, but now I have food support from Barnabas. It's my daughter's birthday today and I will finally be able to bake her a real cake with the cake mix I just selected. Being able to cook a meal with food from the pantry will make a big difference for my family."



### Christmas

What does your family do for Christmas? If your family is anything like mine, you wake up to children jumping on your bed at 7 a.m. (or earlier) yelling "It's Christmas!" This is probably followed by the children running towards the tree and some zombie-like parents right behind them. Presents ripped open, children screaming about the new things they got. Maybe later, enjoy a big dinner with extended family? In our house, all of these things are a great time and create great memories for our family.

But I have to wonder what does any of this have to do with Christmas. Christmas is the celebration of Jesus Christ being born into the world. It's His birthday celebration, shouldn't He get the presents? What do we do that actually celebrates Jesus during Christmas?

Normally, I talk about theological things, but I believe today's article would benefit us most if we thought about the practical side of Christmas. Our family began a tradition a few years back of waking up Christmas morning and reading the Christmas story before we began opening presents. Some years we read Luke 2:1-20. This would be the more traditional Christmas story. Another option is John 1:1-18. This passage would be the more poetic Christmas story. It shows us Jesus in the images of "the true light" and "the word became flesh." One year, we took the kids Jesus Storybook Bible and read the story from there. It is not a translation of the Bible, but it does tell the Christmas story and helps our kids to realize that Christmas is more than the gifts under the tree; it is about Jesus.

In addition to Christmas morning, there are things we can be doing all month long. Churches all over will offer Sunday services, special Christmas celebrations and candlelit night time service. In our church, we even have a cake and sing Jesus Happy Birthday. If you haven't been to church in a while, maybe now (the Christmas season) is the right time to get plugged into a local church. Our community offers so many great choices.

It may also be helpful to do 5 minutes a night, leading up to Christmas Day, to remember a part of the Christmas story. Search Google Images for "Bible verse Advent calendar" and dozens of choices will appear. Print one out and spend time as a family reading the story this month.

Lastly, for Jesus' birthday, what does He want? One church I heard about in Georgia is asking their members to determine how much they will spend on Christmas this year; the gifts, the food, all of it. Then take 10% of that amount and bless someone with it. It could be helping a family in need that will come up short this month. Buying blankets and socks and donating them to a homeless shelter. The options are endless. For us, what would Jesus want us to give Him for His birthday? I know of only two answers: Love God and Love others. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. ... Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these." Mark 12:30-31.

### Callahan Town News

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first and final meeting of December and 2019! The first order of business was the approval of Resolution 2019-R27 which concerned donating \$500 to the Take Stock in Children Program.

Following, Public Works Director Mike Williams advised the council concerning a roof repair on the council building and also a roof replacement on the Water Treatment Plant. "We only received one bid from Jebco Company. The first part is to put a new roof on the water treatment plant here behind town hall for \$3,915; the second part is the repair of the town hall roof," said Williams. "This roof is a flat roof. This will be a constant repair unless you (council) decide to put trusses up and roof over this one. The repair will be \$5,675. There has already been some damage in the attic space and if it is not fixed it will only get worse. If you must choose between the two, I would suggest the repair at this time."

The council approved only to repair the town hall roof at this time at a cost of \$5,675.

Mayor Marty Fontes provided a 2020 calendar for the council to review. "The calendar has all the meeting dates and events that we are aware of," said Fontes. "I see two things that need to be changed. January 1, 2020 is a holiday and the second meeting of December we will not have a meeting. I will have those corrected and sent to you (council) all."

The calendar was approved with the upcoming changes made.

Williams again addressed the council concerning the possibility of the public works department purchasing a new dump truck for the town. "We had an opportunity to purchase one in Hilliard but it went quickly," said Williams. "I am asking the

council for approval to purchase a dump truck for \$30,000 or less if we can find another one."

Mayor Fontes reminded the council that there will not be another meeting for a month. "Chances are good that Mike (Williams) might find another deal and he needs to jump on it if he does," said Fontes. "This approval gives him the chance to purchase if he finds one."

The council approved the purchase of a dump truck for \$30,000 or less.

Mayor Fontes advised the council to be thinking about changes in the Town Charter concerning the offices of Mayor and Town Clerk. If a charter is changed it must go through the residents for approval on the 2020 ballot but first, the council must make a decision if they wish to do so. Currently, the office of mayor, town clerk and treasurer are elected positions. Fontes added that changing to a hired town clerk and town manager is much less cumbersome and having the mayor appointed as one of the council persons but also having a vote; or having a hired town clerk and elected mayor; or elected town clerk and elected mayor as it is now. Fontes advised the council to consider the options and decide what they would like to do.

Town Attorney Jeb Branham advised the council that he could draw up a sample ballot for the council to look over if they wished. The council advised Branham to draw one up for the January meeting.

In closing comments, Mayor Fontes reminded everyone about the Callahan Christmas parade this Saturday at 11 a.m. and the Out with a Boom Fireworks on Sunday, December 29 at 7 p.m. at West Nassau High School and also viewing from Callahan First Baptist Church parking lot.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday, January 6, 2020 at 7 p.m.


lane on SR 200. The front right of the Chevrolet Trailblazer impacted the front of the Silverado.
