Tuscan Rose Vineyards offers delicious muscadine juice, cider, jelly, and jam made right from their vineyards. Bobbie remembers as a small child, standing in her grandfather's muscadine vineyard

eating grapes. "That was the moment it all

began. Loving the taste of the sweet grapes and being surrounded by the warmth of the vines is an everlasting memory,"

said Bobbie. Tuscan Rose Vineyards has been recently approved to sell wine. The two-year long process of working with Nassau County, attending public hearings, rezoning, meetings and much more, they have finally been approved. Friday, a groundbreaking ceremony was held at Tuscan Rose Vineyards to start the building process for the extension of their onsite winery. County Commissioners

Klynt Farmer, Hupp Huppman and John Martin were all on hand along with Nassau Economic County Development Board Executive Director Sherri Mitchell for the

groundbreaking.

Callahan Town News

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their final meeting of 2023. The first order of business was for the council to choose a couple of dates to have their joint meeting with the Nassau County School Board. The council meets with the school board each year to discuss any school related issues, such as the Callahan Elementary traffic, and come up with solutions. The council chose February 5 or February 20 at 6 p.m. prior to the town's normal meeting at 7 p.m.

The council also approved the 2024 calendar with only one correction - to take the Monday, July 1 meeting off, due to the July 4th holiday.

In closing comments, Mayor Randy Knagge advised the council that this Saturday, December 9, the Callahan Volunteer Fire Department will sponsor the Movie at Ewing Park at 5 p.m. Movie attendees can receive a hot dog and cookie and enjoy the movie. There will also be food vendors on site for food purchases. Next Saturday, December 16, the Fire Department will hold their Annual Santa Run. The firetrucks will be driving slowly through Callahan neighborhoods, giving out candy and presents to children! People are requested to bring an unwrapped present to town hall for the Santa Run!

Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming advised the council that the parade was great and the town float was amazing! "Thank you to the town works department for all their hard work!" said Fleming. "I was happy to see that the town won First Place in the Best Overall Decoration/Creativity Float!"

Councilwoman Janet Shaw asked Town Manager Mike Williams if FPL had been contacted about the seven Christmas lights that are not working?

"I have contacted FPL four times today. I will contact another representative tomorrow," Williams.

The next meeting of the council will be Tuesday, January 2, 2024 due to the Monday New Year's Day holiday, at 7







Part of me wanted us to do "A Charlie Brown Christmas." But, that's really more of a TV special than a 'story book.' Then someone suggested Narnia. I mean, it had everything we were looking for: it's a series of books, it's a Christmas story (you may recall the character Father Christmas gives the four children gifts), C.S. Lewis, its author is regarded as one of the most influential

Christian apologists of his time, and most importantly, it tells the most important story of all time. It was a lot of work by many people to build the float, but it was an incredible experience. We ended up winning Second Place in the Best Themed Float category.

What I enjoyed most was the reactions of people as our float approached them. I was driving the truck towing the float, so I got to hear people's first reactions: "Oh my gosh, it's Narnia", "I love that movie", and "Look at the cute little beaver costumes." Poinsettias do best on a porch or in a window with indirect sunlight for at least 6 hours per day.

If indoors, a room temperature of 65-70 degrees are best; keep them away from cold drafts and excessive heat.

Water thoroughly only when the surface of the soil is dry to the touch; do not water too frequently.

Indoors, fertilize lightly only every 4-6 weeks.

In April, when the leaves begin to deteriorate and fall off, cut the plant back and give it sun, water and fertilizer regularly.






Jeffery "Jeff" Thomas Howard, 54, of Hilliard, passed away peacefully December 3, 2023 at his home with his loving family by his side. He




