Hilliard Council Honors Kay Moore

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their first meeting of December. The first order of business was a Proclamation honoring Keiko 'Kay' Moore for her 49 years of service working for Fuqua's Pharmacy and Hilliard Pharmacy. Ms. Kay was joined by members of family for this special honor. December 1, 2022 was proclaimed Kieko 'Kay' Harada Moore Day in Hilliard. The proclamation also included: Kay's husband, Lester,

served in the US Air Force during the occupation of Japan; in 1951 Lester and Kay were married and moved to Florida in 1952; in 1954 Kay became an American citizen; after retirement from the Air Force, the family moved to Hilliard in 1972; in 1973 Kay began working at Fuqua's Pharmacy where she worked with lifetime friends; in 1984, Mr. Fuqua passed and the store was bought and the name changed to Hilliard Pharmacy where she continued to work until the present, sharing her cheerful demeanor and sweet smile with everyone in town and becoming a favorite of Hilliard residents; Kay has been a welcome, encouraging and bright mainstay of the Fuqua and Hilliard Pharmacy for a half century and has decided to retire at the age of 92; she is beloved by customers, coworkers and residents alike and will be missed greatly in her well-deserved retirement.

The first agenda item was to set a joint workshop of the council with the Planning & Zoning Board to discuss proposed amendments to the Zoning



and Land Development regulations. The workshop was set for Monday, February 27, 2023 at 6 p.m.

The council also set a workshop for Tuesday, December 15 at 6 p.m. to discuss audit findings in the Florida Retirement System.

The council approved a Capital Budget vehicle purchase for the Parks & Recreation Department in the amount of \$36,270. "This is a Fleet 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 1500, 2WD regular cab, 140 work truck," said Parks & Recreation Director Gabe Whittenburg. "This is on a state contract and we will have the truck by March."

The next item concerned approving Brailen Fossick's transition from temporary staff to regular part-time staff. "We currently have 20 regular students in after school care and we need the staff," said Whittenburg.

The council approved the Hilliard Volunteer Fire Department run reimbursement.

The next regular meeting of the council will be December 15 at 7 p.m.

Fentanyl is Infiltrating Our Country

Last month, I was invited to fly to Tucson, Arizona for a visit along the Mexico border. As Vice President of the Florida Sheriffs Association (FSA), I decided to see first-hand how illegal drugs were gaining access into our country and more importantly into our local communities and I can tell you the entire trip was eye-opening. I met with officials from the DEA who told me our greatest threat today is overdoses likely due to fentanyl. Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid similar to morphine but 50 to 100 times more potent and up to 50 times stronger than heroin. As little as 2 milligrams of fentanyl can be enough to kill. That's the equivalent to 10 grains of table salt.

Unfortunately, here in Nassau County we are no stranger to fentanyl. So far this year, NCSO has responded to at least 116 possible drug overdose incidents; 11 of those cases were fatal with 6 more possible drug-related deaths pending the Medical Examiner results. Nearly 70 percent of those people who died had fentanyl in their system. This year NCSO has seized over 4 ½ pounds of fentanyl, which is enough to potentially kill over one million people.

In the U.S. overdose deaths nearly doubled among adolescents in 2020 and rose another 20% in 2021. One of the major reasons for this is social media. Fentanyl is now being massed produced into fake prescription medication and sold via social media platforms like Snapchat, Tik-Tok and Instagram where teens can become an easy target. That's why it is so important to talk to your teenage children about the dangers of counterfeit pills. You never know what you are getting on the street. Remember, just one pill can kill! In fact, last year the DEA seized enough





fentanyl to kill every American. Florida ranks second in the nation in overdose deaths. Through this trip I learned that many of these illegal drugs are funneled from Mexico through Arizona and Texas and eventually to the Atlanta area before making their way into Florida and into our community.

The Mexican Cartels are currently flooding the market with millions of pills and their goal is to get as many people as they can hooked on these dangerous and deadly drugs. Drug trafficking organizations in Mexico are making fentanyl from chemicals coming from China. These chemicals are common ingredients in cleaning supplies so they are legal and hard to track. The cartels use pill presses to make fake pills and smuggle them into the U.S. to sell on the street. These pills can cost anywhere from .30 to .45 cents each wholesale; and on the street sell for \$20-\$30 each. A kilo of fentanyl cost \$75,000 wholesale; with a street value of \$3-\$5 million dollars.

During the trip I met with U.S. Customs and Border Protection personnel, Border Patrol Agents, as well as other sheriffs in Arizona. I learned that in just the month of October they caught 230,000 people trying to illegally cross the Southwest Border of US and Mexico. Two to three years ago they were only averaging around 30,000 people per month. There is also an overwhelming backlog of cases being scheduled 8 years

out. Sadly, many women and children end up trafficked into the sex trade to help pay off their debt to the cartels in return for helping them gain access into the United

States. These crime organizations hold family members hostage until those debts are repaid. Talking to the Sheriffs out of Santa Cruz County and Cochise County (two Arizona counties which border Mexico) I got an opportunity to hear and see just what they deal with every day, with the illegal border crossings, the drugs that they seize and the human trafficking issues. Right before my eyes, I watched Cochise County's security cameras as they caught two separate groups of 25 and 15 attempting to cross the border illegally. I learned that many of the Border Patrol Agents along the border have been pulled away and are in the holding facilities processing those who cross illegally, leaving a reduced number of Border Patrol Agents in the field, causing the vast majority of the enforcement along the border up to the local sheriff, which taxes their personnel who are also dealing with the normal crime issues they have to investigate.

Many of the Border Patrol Agents told me the current situation has gotten out of control. The Mariposa border crossing port of entry in Nogales, Arizona, which is staffed by the US Customs and Border Protection, seized 12 million fentanyl pills last year. The border wall that was being built, was stopped, which means that for miles there is no fence, which allows people to easily illegally cross the border. These illegal drugs that are being smuggled across the border are killing hundreds of thousands of people in our country and destroying families in the process. Whether you are on the left, on the right or somewhere in the middle, the situation along the United States and Mexico border has to be fixed somehow. Anyone in Washington, D.C. who says that our southern border is secure is simply not telling the truth. All you have to do is talk to those on the frontlines and they will tell you it's not. Something else needs to be done because the situation is not only grim...it's getting worse.






