showed that she was below 1st grade peers, so there were gaps that needed to be closed. To truly reach Madisyn, I sat with her at lunch, we chatted walking down the halls, and I praised her over every accomplishment she made in my classroom. I feel that these actions made her feel loved, supported, and encouraged. Flash forward to the end of our year together and Madisyn was reading above grade level, making all A honor roll, receiving perfect attendance, meeting her AR goals, and was selected to be a member of the school safety patrol team for 2nd grade. I feel that the safe and loving classroom environment I created helped Madisyn become the amazing student she is today.

Drag Strip Approved for Callahan Speedway

After 3 long years, David and Lisa Hicken, owners of Callahan Speedway, received approval from Nassau County to move forward with their Drag Strip. In a few months, the speedway will celebrate 10 years of operation. It will also celebrate being a top Go Kart Track among racers. Three years ago, David shared his dream of building a Drag Strip on his property with county officials. Through countless hours of drawings, surveys and lots more paperwork, their dream was finally approved by Nassau County to move forward with building the drag strip. “I am beyond excited and ready to start building,” said David.

“This has been a long process however I want everything to be right. We hope to have a groundbreaking in the next few weeks to get started.”

The drag strip will be a 50’ wide, two-lane drag strip with jersey walls, which are concrete barriers. The track will have a concrete ‘burn-out’ area and a concrete starting line on the 1/8-mile strip. “The project will cost nearly \$1 million. But it’s going to be worth every penny to see people do wheelies, burnouts, and feel the g-forces going down the drag strip seeing how fast they can go down the

1/8 mile strip,” added Hicken. “It is the only place you can legally put your foot to the pedal.”



Callahan Speedway has Go Kart racing every Saturday night. David has recently placed new clay on the track, making even better racing each week. Through the years, the track has drawn in Wing Karts; Grand National races; Kids Clinic on Racing; Juice Box and Lil Bandits for children racing; and one of the largest Flat Track Motorcycle Races in the country. Callahan Speedway also has a Remote Control (RC) car track that

runs almost every weekend including Sundays. These racers are all about racing and showing off what there RC cars can do.

This weekend, the speedway will host the first of six races called the Battle in the South. This is a race of go kart teams that race weekly at their respective tracks in Callahan and Alma, Georgia (Hurricane Creek Raceway). This Saturday, the Georgia teams will travel to Florida and race. This should be a fun one to watch!

Preheat a smoker to 250° according to manufacturer's directions. Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Place cabbage wedges on prepared baking sheet. In a small bowl, whisk olive oil, steak seasoning, salt, and pepper until evenly combined. Brush mixture over the cabbage wedges. Place baking sheet on the grate of the preheated smoker and smoke for 1 1/2 hours. Transfer to a serving dish and top with bacon pieces. Serve immediately.

- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

As always...that's just my opinion!



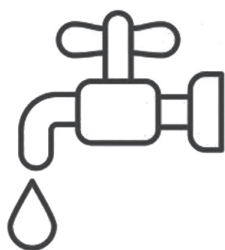

Who Are You Praying For?

I think most people would find it easy to love lovable people. Easy to serve people who are kind or friendly. But, when Jesus spoke on loving others, he said, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have?" Mathew 5:43-46a, ESV. To paraphrase, Jesus says, anyone can love the lovable, but will you love the unlovable? Jesus is calling us to love and pray for those that we consider enemies.

Paul continues this thought in 1 Timothy 2:1, "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people." Our instructions are to pray for all people. We can ask God to meet needs, we can go to God on other's behalf, we can thank God, but the group we are praying for is "all people." Our friends, our enemies, everyone.

Paul then gives us a specific example and a model, and this is where it gets more difficult. He says, Pray "...for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way." 1 Timothy 2:2.

I know what you're thinking "Pastor, are you saying I have to pray for the people in leadership roles in our country?" And the answer is no, I'm not saying that, God's word is. God instructs us to pray for every member of every branch of our government. Whether you preferred the previous president or the current one, we are instructed to pray for all of them.

Two reasons: 1) 1 Timothy 2:3 - 4, "This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." And 2) so we "...may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way."

Could it be that we are where we are in this country today because Christ-followers have failed to pray for our leaders? How different would our country, state, and community be if we prayed for the salvation of those in high positions? Who is God calling you to pray for?

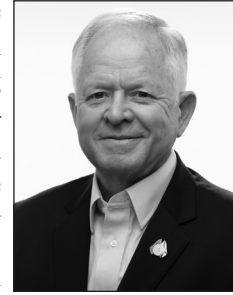

Clerk of Court Warns of Phone Scams

Across the state there has been a recent increase in telephone scams regarding court dates and jury duty—including right here in Nassau County. The scammers have been impersonating law enforcement officers, judges, and clerks---demanding payment for missed court dates or jury duty. The scammers seem legitimate. They have citizen's correct names and addresses. They give realistic sounding case numbers. They often use the names of actual judges or officers to sound even more convincing. Sometimes they are even spoofing the correct phone number of the sheriff's office or the courthouse.

Please be aware that law enforcement officers, judges and clerk employees WILL NOT call anyone to demand payment for any fines or fees. Law enforcement officers, judges, and clerk employees WILL NOT call anyone to tell them they have an arrest warrant. Law enforcement officers, judges, and clerk employees WILL NOT ask you to make a payment at a secondary location. Please DO NOT make a payment to these thieves.

They are threatening citizens with imminent arrest if a fee is not paid immediately. They instruct the citizen to stay on the phone with them while they make a payment at a secondary location—most often a retail store

If you receive such a call, hang up the phone. If you are at all unsure that the call may be legitimate, hang up and call the Sheriff's office (904-548-4009), or the Clerk's office (904-548-4600) to inquire.

Please pass along the warning to those around you—especially to those within vulnerable populations.

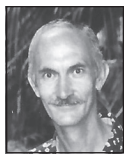

Callahan Garden Club News

The Callahan Garden Club would like to remind everyone that there may still be some cold nights ahead in February and March. Make sure to cover your vulnerable plants that are not in a protected area. The coverings can be old cloth sheets, quilts, packing blankets, and commercial frost cloths. If using plastic, try not to touch the plant because the plastic takes heat away from it possibly causing injury. Be sure to remove the plastic during a sunny day to provide air movement. All coverings should touch the ground trapping in warmth from the earth. An incandescent light bulb under the cover can keep plants warm; keep bulb from touching plants or anything flammable. Mulching around your plants helps trap in heat, protecting the roots. Perennials only require root system to be protected. If the weather has been dry, water the plants before a freeze. Wet soil absorbs heat in the day and continues to radiate at night, providing warmth for

roots and covered plant.

Some of your plants, bushes and trees that are not cold tolerant and have died off during the winter months may come back. Be patient and don't do serious pruning or yank the plant out of the ground. Wait until the weather gets warmer and new growth appears. This will show where the plant is still growing and the dead areas that can be removed. Look for new growth coming up out of the ground close to the injured plant. Sometimes the top of the plant has died off, but the roots are very much alive producing new growth. A pleasant surprise!
