WNHS AFJROTC Needs Your Support

Last Friday, I learned that the West Nassau High School Air Force JROTC was in need of financial assistance. Every year, the group takes approximately 33 cadets to The Citadel in South Carolina to attend the premier Cadet Leadership Training Course in the country. This is a 6-day course filled with physical training (PT), team building, communication, discipline and leadership training. Every day starts at 5:30 a.m. with PT and a 3-5 mile run. They finish the evening with

team sports and lights out at 10:30 p.m. It is a grueling schedule for the cadets, but they learn more about themselves during these six days than they do all year in the classroom environment. Each year, the cadets excel

in all aspects winning awards for the fastest runners, best marchers, top cadets in their flight and top flight commanders.

The cost is \$450 per cadet and in past years the Air Force has covered \$250 per cadet. The cadets normally hold fundraisers to cover the remaining amount. Due to the COVID crisis, the cadets were unable to hold fundraisers (fair booth, car washes, etc.).

This past week, our JROTC unit learned the Air Force will not be able

to provide any funding this year. That leaves the WNHS JROTC with a shortfall of \$8,250. Unfortunately, they did not give any unit an extension for registration, which is in March. The unit has an incredible parent booster club that supports the cadets, but this amount and short time is not supported in their budget and schedule.

The unit, which is the only JROTC in Nassau County, needs assistance so all the deserving cadets can attend The Citadel Leadership Training Course; otherwise attendees will have to be

cut in half. I have spoken to several local veteran and fraternal organizations that will be donating approximately \$2,000 combined, but additional donations are needed to cover the shortfall. Let's all

remember that these cadets are available at the drop of hat to help any time our towns (Callahan, Hilliard) need them. This is a time for not only the towns to help but also the businesses to help out, if possible. Every little bit helps!

E-Notify Offers Court Date Text and Email Alerts

Never miss a hearing with E-Notify, a statewide program that notifies registered users about court events!

Whether you are an attorney, a defendant, a bail bondsman, or a citizen with an interest in a criminal court case, E-Notify is available statewide to send text or email reminders of hearings for the cases that you designate, at no cost to you.

Similar programs elsewhere have shown the notification system is effective. Studies in jurisdictions where electronic alerts have been implemented show significant reductions in "failures to appear," or instances in which defendants miss their court events.

Failure to appear for a court event can result in a warrant being issued for the arrest of a defendant. Fewer defendants with missed court dates will reduce

individuals and associated costs to the justice system.

E-Notify was designed specifically to fulfill the legislature's direction to provide alerts to defendants in criminal cases. The system, however, is not limited to defendants and offers a valuable resource to others who may wish to be notified of case events.

Users who sign up for the service choose how they will get alerts: by email, text, or both. Users are able to sign up to get notifications on multiple cases. E-Notify allows users to manage their alert subscriptions and make changes to which cases they follow or the frequency of alerts.

Users can go to: www.enotify.flcourts. org to sign up for alerts. The program was developed collaboratively by the state's clerks of court and the state courts system.

Fish Talk

Sheepshead is the Word!

Sheepshead has been the word on the water. If and when you can get out, they are chewing good. With that said, our weather hasn't been very cooperative. This weekend is not looking any different, with fingers crossed that may change should you do decide to give these pesky convicts a shot. A Sparky Jig has been very productive or just your favorite Carolina Rig.

Look for sheepshead to be stacked up in the river and offshore. Vertical jigging with fiddler crabs over deep structure has been the key. One of the most common practices over the years has been setting up parallel with the jetties and dropping down on top of the rocks. The biggest thing will be to find the safest spot to anchor. Chumming legally can give you a huge advantage. Medium weight rod and reels with 20 to 30 pound power pro as your main line will provide you the best sensitivity. If you are tying straight to a jig head, tie straight to your fluorocarbon leader.

Leader size can depend on water clarity. For instance, if the water is cloudy, I'm using a minimum of 20 pound leader line. If the water is very clean, I'm downsizing my tackle by five or 10 pounds to keep the fish from spooking. Weigh sizes are determined by tidal flow and water depth. Keep in mind to use the lightest weight possible as long as you can feel bottom or the structure being fished.

In addition, black drum and whiting migrate in with our sheepshead. They're starting to show up all over our region. It's best to target deeper troughs along our beaches on the falling tides. While targeting whiting, use fresh clams and fresh shrimp. Again, tip them on your favorite fish finder rig or the newer improved sputnik

Weather permitting, offshore reefs such as KBY are going to be the absolute most productive areas to target sheepshead. If you choose to go offshore this weekend, please pay very attention to the forecast. It really can turn a calm ocean into dangerous situation.

Good luck everyone, I hope you all have a great weekend. Remember, take a kid fishing! Tight lines...

Where you are looking will determine the direction you are going. We all know that when driving and we look to the back seat, at our phone or search for something that has fallen, often the car will drift out of the lane. This sometimes causes an accident. It is because our focus has turned away from the

I remember flying into Magoda, a small jungle airstrip in the mountains of Papua, Indonesia. There was a cliff at both ends of the airstrip. The big problem, when landing there, was

always a downdraft just before the airstrip. The skilled Mission Aviation Fellowship pilots would keep focused on the end of airstrip because when that downdraft hit, suddenly you could be looking up at the top of the cliff. Their focus had to be firm so as soon as they saw the airstrip go from below the plane to above, they added power thus allowing a safe landing.

There are many examples in life of keeping our focus on things around us. There is also the focus we must have in our studies, career path and daily work. These are mental focuses of the mind to help us accomplish every day needs and wants.

However, there is another focus that each person must have. It is the spiritual focus that keeps the eyes of our heart and mind focused on God and His will for our lives. It is so easy for us to focus on what I want, what will make me happy, or be so inner focused that we exclude God.

The pain, shame and guilt can be overwhelming, yet survivors often feel as if there is no one to talk to who will understand. A new Family Support Group offered by Starting Point Behavioral Healthcare, in association with the Vinson Foundation, provides a safe and comforting opportunity to spend time with others who have similar experiences. The groups are open to anyone and will be facilitated by mental health professionals. "Since the start of the coronavirus pandemic, suicide and overdose rates have risen," said CEO Dr. Laureen Pagel. "Promoting emotional wellness through community education and awareness is one of the most important pillars to our mission

at Starting Point. I believe it is our responsibility to address what's going on right here in our community. It is my hope that The Family Support Group will provide a home to anyone that needs to talk, understand, and grieve."

The groups will be offered twice each month in Nassau County. 

Bob Zortea Celebrates 100th Birthday

Nello 'Bob' Zortea celebrated his 100th birthday February 14. He was born February 14, 1921 in Johnson City, Illinois. He is a WWII Veteran proudly serving in the US Navy. He served in the Navy for 5 ½ years. In the 50s, he moved his family to Jacksonville (Dinsmore area) where he worked for General Motors, working in the Electric Motor Division building traction motors for locomotives. 

BEHIND THE BADGE: Deputy T.C. Edwards

Believe it or not, I chose law enforcement when I joined the service, the United States Army. I was flipping through a recruiter's magazine that showed all these different glorified job titles. There were pictures of the job description. The one that drew me to it was a



military policeman kneeling next to the Jeep with a canine. He had a German shepherd with him, and I've loved animals since I was a kid, so that was what drew me to it. 

Callahan Approves Site Plan for New FBC Food Ministry

The Town of Callahan met Tuesday night, due to the Monday holiday, for their final meeting of February. The first order of business was a Public Hearing and First Reading on the Site Plan Review for Callahan First Baptist Church's new Food Distribution Ministry. "The Lord had placed on our (members) hearts the


need for a Food Ministry prior to the pandemic. However, with the pandemic we started with a food distribution of about 20 families," said Pastor Lynn Hyatt. "Now we are serving around 400 families every other week. Our vision is to have this building as a permanent home for our food ministry. It is a metal building but it will look much better, as you can see." (drawings were provided)

Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming asked, "Where on the property will the building sit?"

"It will be in the parking lot directly across from our chapel at the rear of the building across from the county building," added Pastor Hyatt. "We feel like that also may be an easy access from people visiting the county clinic."

The council approved the site plan on first reading. There will be one more public hearing on the issue.

The council approved resolutions: Resolution 2021-R02 which concerned donating \$500 to the Episcopal Children's Services; and Resolution 2021-R02 which concerned donating \$1,000 to the West Nassau Historical Society for the 2021 Railroad



Day Festival that will be held Saturday, April 17.

In other business, a request for an ordinance change (Chapter 152) was discussed concerning placing a billboard within the city limits on the north side of town. "This request would require and Ordinance change as the Sign Code allows no billboards in the town limits," said Town Manager Mike Williams. "The only way you (council) can allow this is to change the code. That is up to you (council)."

A consensus of the council agreed that they do not want any billboards within the town limits and the request will not move forward.

The next item concerned a traffic study on US Highway 1. "There was a traffic study in January on US 1," said Williams. "In an 8-day period 96,000 trips were made on US 1. That was vehicles passing over the strip for the study. Not much was learned from the study other than the road is in good shape."

"I feel like the traffic lights need to be re-scheduled for the traffic," said Councilwoman Ashton Bishop-Vargas.

"When the lights were maintained the last time it was noted that the Wavetronix (the magnetic strips under the asphalt) for the main light and the Brandies intersection need to be replaced," added Williams. "That is scheduled to be done."

The next item concerned the review of persons for the attorney position. The town received only two applications from: Christian Waugh, P.A.; and Robert J. Grimaldi, P.A., both from the Orlando area. The council agreed to have a workshop set up so both applicants can talk with the council and they will make the decision. Waugh is acting as Interim Attorney for now.

In closing comments, Mayor Matthew Davis read a proclamation stating the month of March as Problem Gambling Awareness Month. The mayor also encouraged the council to attend a workshop Thursday night at 7 p.m. with the Town of Hilliard concerning fireworks.

Councilwoman Janet Shaw updated the council on the proceedings with security at Ewing Park. "We have got several quotes on cameras and received more donations. I received another \$500 from Callahan resident Eddie Flynn," said Shaw. "Currently we are adding more lighting to the inside of the park with LED lights and also have purchased some cameras."

"We have gotten some prices on iPads for the council as requested," added Williams. "The cost will be approximately \$325 each, for 8 people a total of \$2,600. This follows a purchase under what the mayor can authorize if you (council) choose and the mayor agrees."

Davis authorized Mayor purchase of 8 iPads for the town.

The next meeting of the council will be Monday, March 1 at 7 p.m.




late Richard McCullough.


