Communities Honor Fallen Soldier, Sergeant Kennedy Sanders







On Wednesday, February 14, a day set aside for love, the communities of Hilliard and Callahan came out to show respect for the ultimate gift of love. "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13. Specialist Kennedy Ladon Sanders, 24 years old of Waycross, Georgia, was one of the soldiers killed January 28 in a drone attack on her base in Jordan. She served with the 718th Engineer Company, the 926th Engineer Battalion and the 926th Engineer Brigate out of Fort Moore, Georgia.

The body of Sanders, who was posthumously promoted to Sergeant, was returned home on Wednesday. Streets from Jacksonville International Airport to Waycross, Georgia were lined with American flags and purple ribbons (Sanders' favorite color) to honor the fallen soldier. Sgt. Sanders





was laid to rest Saturday, February 17 at Oakland Cemetery in Waycross.

Sergeant Sanders' service to our our nation will never be forgotten. As she made her final journey home, it was humbling to see the eternal gratitude and prayers displayed by our communities.

Crawford Diamond project in Callahan off of US 301. The infrastructure is finally coming along. We (NCEDB) are asking for the town's support of \$2,000."

The following agenda concerned the council's approval to award the DEP agreement No. LPA0302 Hilliard Oxford Street Force Main Routing Project, contingent upon approval by the Department of environmental Protection and the Town Attorney, as well as the receipt of proper bonds and insurance certificates, to the low bidder, T.B. Landmark Construction, Inc. with a total amount of \$562,270.00. The council approved the bid winner and cost.

The next item concerned the approval of the Engineering Services Agreement from Mittauer & Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$100,300.00, to prepare construction drawings and specification, for the Water Main Replacements Project. The council approved Mittauer & Associates, Inc.

The following item concerned the approval of the Administrative Services Agreement from Fred Fox Enterprises, Inc. in the amount of \$52,000, to provide the general administration aspects of the Water Main Replacements Project. The council approved Fred Fox Enterprises,

The next two items concerned IT upgrades for the town's systems per IT Director Guy Riner. The first item, a Capital Purchase of an IT Refresh Project in the amount of \$42,095.78, which the council approved. The second item was the Expansion of Technology to Town Hall Park in the amount of \$25,512 that will be paid by the Municipal Grant received from Nassau County. "We will be running fiber to the park and the room inside of Continued from page 1

the building," said Riner. The council approved the expansion project.

Public Works Director Joel Hall P.E. advised the council concerning a budgeted Capital Purchase of the Ingham Road area drainage improvements. "The estimated cost of this project is \$39,940, in which we will be replacing culverts in that area," said Hall. "We are trying to take care of the areas in most need for improvements and replacements." The council approved the purchase.

Hall also requested approval of a Capital expenditure for Well #5 Pump repair. "This pump is at the Waste Water Plant close to the Fire Department," said Hall. "The well is 9-10 years old and needs to be repaired now. Complete Services was the sole source vendor for this job with a cost of \$46,540.00." The council approved the repair.

The next item was a very long discussion concerning resident Jon Hart's petition to open a right of way on his property, originally heard October 5, 2023. Land Use Administrator Lee Anne Wollitz did an amazing presentation concerning new maps of the area, old maps, and even older maps from way back when, explaining that from the beginning, the property was not platted correctly. The council gave Mr. Hart the option to look for the cheapest way to help him achieve what he wants. Mr. Hart is to respond to Mrs. Wollitz when he makes a decision.

The council approved moving Joel Hall from introductory/probationary status to regular fulltime. The council approved the status but Councilman Jared Wollitz also approved giving him a one-step increase. The council approved.

The next meeting of the council will be Thursday, March 7 at 7 p.m.

Lost and Found

Lost: Strangely, a copy of a letter written in April of 1898 recently found its way to the edge of the parking lot of a business here in Callahan. The finder discovered it by chance, picked it up, and inquired inside. They were hoping to find the lost letter's owner, but no one at the company knew anything about this unusual find. It was as if this lost letter had suddenly fallen from the sky and landed randomly in our town. The lost letter is written on the letterhead of Fairfield Seminary and Military Academy, a prominent New York college long since shuttered. The handwriting is cursive, a style of writing that is fast becoming hard to find in use in our daily lives. The headmaster, Lt. George R. Burnett, is the author of this lost letter. He has written a one-page recommendation full of high praise for Josiah W. Clark, the College's cadet captain and military veteran who is seeking to return to the US Army. Josiah, Lt. Burnett writes, wants to fight for the "Cause of Cuba," better known as the Spanish-American War that started just days after this lost letter was written.

Found: A glimpse into the life of our Josiah W. Clark, who was born in 1871 in Montgomery County in upstate New York to Horatio and Maggie Clark. He served with distinction in the US Army for several years before being discharged with "excellent character" in 1894. In this letter, Lt. Burnett writes

of Josiah's "Christian character, his military qualifications, and aptitude and his earnestness." Burnett finishes the letter by predicting that our Josiah would return with "shoulder straps gloriously won on the field of battle." The Spanish American War was one of the shortest conflicts in American History: fighting between Spain and the US only lasted 16 weeks. The War claimed 3,000 American lives, but most died of yellow fever and typhoid. Sadly, our Josiah succumbed to the latter on September 12, 1898. Since Florida was a major training and staging area for the War, it is possible that our Josiah was in the area before his scheduled departure for Cuba. We can't say with certainty if our Josiah trained in Fort Clinch or passed by our Callahan Depot via train on his way to Tampa. What is certain is that our Josiah W. Clark was an American Army soldier and war veteran. Hopefully we can find the owner of this found copy of Lt Burnett's letter about our Josiah. The West Nassau Historical Society would be honored to have a copy of this found letter in our archives.

Understanding the Bible: Part #2

In the last article, I stated my plan for writing the articles for the entire year. In January, I gave an overview of the Bible as it all relates to Christ. Everything that I am going to write in the next 11 articles is written with the assumption that the entire Bible is about Jesus. Every story connects to Jesus. For us to see how the whole Bible connects to Christ, we have to understand the contents of the individual books. In today's article, the first five books of the Bible will be considered. Space limitations will keep all of this extremely brief. My desire is that these articles

and outlines would serve as a companion to help you walk through the Bible.

Genesis, means origin. Genesis a book of origins. The book of Genesis can be summarized as the origin of the human race (Genesis 1-11) and the origin of the Hebrew race (12-50). A simple outline of the book of Genesis is as follows:

- The Origin of the Human Race (4 Great Events): 1-11: Creation, Fall, Flood, Babel
- The Origin of the Hebrew Race (4 Great Men): 12-50: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Jospeh. These chapters give the promise of a nation (Abraham), the creation of the nation (Isaac), the formation of the nation (Jabo/Israel), and the preservation of the nation (Jospeh).

The book of Exodus picks up where Genesis stops. The people of God are now in Egyptian bondage. Exodus means departure. The book of Exodus tells us how God got his people out of bondage through redemption. Exodus can be summarized by two movements.

- Chapters 1-18: Deliverance: redemption from bondage
- Chapters 19-40: Duty: response to redemption

Leviticus means pertaining to the Levites. The dominate theme in the book of Leviticus is holiness. Leviticus shows us how God's redeemed people relate to him in holiness.

- The way to God: 1-10: sacrifice and priesthood
- The way to holiness: 11-20: laws
- The worship of God: 21-27: festivals and covenant

Numbers doesn't have a very original title. Numbers means Numbers. People matter to God. The book of Numbers tells the story of the 40-year wilderness journey because of unbelief. The book is divided into two census' (thus the name Numbers). The contents are divided as follows:

- Generation #1: Faithless: 1-25: die in the wilderness
- Generation #2: Faithful (not perfect, but they do get into the land): 26-36


Deuteronomy means second law. This makes perfect sense because the generation that received the law initially died in the wilderness. The book of contains Moses' final three speeches before he dies and the people enter the land.

- Sermon #1: What God has done: 1-3
- Sermon #2: What God expects: 4-26
- Sermon #3: What God will do: 27-30
- The end of an era: 31-34: Transition to Joshua
