Warrior Football Hires **New Head Coach**

West Nassau High School has recently hired a new Head Coach for the Warrior football team. The new coach is Gunnar Cox. The position was posted through the Nassau County School Board with the qualifications listed. Several applicants applied. The top six applicants were interviewed before a committee, the principal and Athletic Director Richie Knott. Coach Cox met all the criteria and qualifications and was the best fit for the West Nassau football program.

Coach Cox is not new to the coaching scene. He most recently served an assistant coach at Hilliard High School since 2018. Prior to that, following graduation from Jacksonville University and playing football, he was an assistant coach at JU for two years. Coach Cox graduated from Yulee High School and then attended JU where he achieved his Master's Degree. He will finish this school year teaching at Hilliard High School and in the fall begin teaching at West Nassau.

Coach Cox has already begun to meet one-on-one with several of the West Nassau football players. "I am so excited for this great opportunity. I started playing football when I was 7-years-old. It has always been a huge part of my life," said Coach Cox. "This has always been my dream to be a



head coach. I enjoy teaching and I love coaching and sharing my knowledge of the game I love so much. I have been influenced by so many great coaches and I look forward to being the best coach I can be."

Coach Cox has begun to put together his staff, which one new member will be his brother. Waylon Cox. who also is coming from Hilliard. Tree Planting Workshop and Free Tree Event

We are pleased to announce the return of an in-person educational workshop led by Taylor Clem, PhD and Director UF/IFAS Extension Nassau County, Monday, February 27 from 2-3:30 p.m. at 85831 Miner Road, Yulee. The inperson workshop will help residents select the right tree for their planting location and learn how to properly care for new trees. Workshop participants will be able to register for their free trees and will be eligible for a drawing for a specimen tree. Space is limited and registration is required: https://www. eventbrite.com/e/knb-tree-giveawaypresentation-tickets-530662334327.

Keep Nassau Beautiful (KNB) volunteers and partner organizations will be distributing 500 nursery size, free trees during three drive-through events where residents will pick-up one or two free trees to be planted in Nassau County.

Not able to attend the workshop? Individuals, businesses, and organizations may reserve free trees by completing these simple steps; reviewing UF/IFAS tree fact sheets for the available species and viewing an educational video led by UF/IFAS Extension Nassau County Director, Taylor Clem, PhD. After a review of the educational material, residents will be ready to complete the Free Tree Reservation form to select their preferred tree species and pick-up location. Completion of the reservation form is required 72 hours prior to the drive-through event. Nassau County proof of residency is required the day of the event to pick up one or two of our 3-gallon size trees. Residents are also asked to help the tree get its best chance at a healthy long life by following a watering schedule until the tree gets established.

Free tree drive-through events are scheduled as follows: Callahan, Saturday, March 18; Yulee, Saturday, March 25; and Fernandina Beach, Saturday, April 1. All events will be held between 9-11 a.m. Details and reservation form at https:// keepnassaubeautiful.org/news-andevents/. Volunteers are needed to help with traffic flow and to help residents put trees in their vehicles for a safe ride to their new home! In the Kitchen...

Easy Chicken Casserole

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves \(\frac{1}{4} \) cup chopped onion (optional) 1 (10.5 oz.) can condensed cream of chicken soup 1 cup sour cream

1/4 cup chopped mushrooms (optional) 32 buttery round crackers, crumbled

Preheat the oven to 350°. Fill a large pot with water; bring to a boil. Cook chicken in boiling water until no longer pink inside, 20 to 30 minutes. Chop chicken into bitesized pieces and place in a 9x13-inch baking dish. Combine soup, sour cream, onion, and mushrooms in a bowl. Pour mixture over chicken and top with crumbled crackers. Cover and bake in the preheated oven until top is lightly browned, about 30 minutes.

Preparations for 2024 Election Cycle

Thank you to all the Nassau County citizens who participated in the 2022

Elections! Our office is grateful to our election workers who successfully and safely conducted three elections in 2022. Voter turnout for the General Election was 63.23%, one of the highest in the northeast Florida area. St. Johns County's turnout was 64.82%.



We are now looking ahead to 2024, which will feature three elections: the Presidential Preference Primary on March 19, 2024; the Primary Election on August 20, 2024; and the General Election on November 5, 2024. The changing role of technology in elections has become a central focus and is an essential part of our planning process. In 2022, we implemented the first elections mobile app in Florida to help voters stay connected to current election information. Among other features, voters can find their polling place, track their mail ballot and look up early voting wait times from one convenient app.

For the first time in Nassau County, we communicated with voters via customized text messages. Our principal purpose was to ensure voters received relevant, real-time election information. One unexpected benefit were the voters who responded with information to update their voter record. Please let us know if you found these text messages helpful. We are continually looking for new ways to communicate with voters that is both convenient and relevant.

Ensuring our voter rolls are up to date is an important and never-ending

task. List maintenance is the foundation of election security and we are working every day to keep Nassau County

elections secure. One measure of list maintenance is the number of undeliverable vote-by-mail ballots returned in an election. In the November 2022 General Election, 19,290 vote-by-mail ballots were mailed to voters. Of those, 104 (or .005%) were returned to our office as undeliverable. In the November 2020 General

Election, 23,166 vote-by-mail ballots were mailed to voters with 395 (or .017%) returned to our office as undeliverable. We believe this decrease in undeliverable mail is due to the list maintenance efforts implemented in the last two years.

Recognizing the growing demand for real-time information, we have modernized our website to make it more intuitive and user-friendly. We are collaborating with Disability Rights Florida to improve our website accessibility and to increase our staffs' general awareness of polling location accessibility, i.e., understanding the negative impact that signs in the middle of the sidewalk can have on a voter in a wheelchair. Making elections accessible to all voters is an important responsibility of our office.



Hilliard Pauses on Rate Increase

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their final meeting of February. The first order of business was a discussion on the Fiscal Year 2021/2022 & Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Water & Sewer Fund Financial Reports that was requested by the council concerning the water/sewer increase. Town Clerk Lisa Purvis advised the council with the report that Fiscal Year 2021/2022, expenditures were under revenues by \$11,250; and Fiscal Year 2022/2023 expenditures were (over) revenues by \$51,557; Water & Sewer Rates increased by 11.40% effective July 2, 2022. Currently the town is considering an 8.01% increase for this year. The agenda had Resolution 2023-05 to approve or disapprove of increasing the rates however the agenda item was deleted due to the Town Code states the amending the water & sewer rates must be amended by resolution.

After further investigation, Town Attorney Christian Waugh found that the Town Charter states these changes must be done by Ordinance. There was no vote on increasing the water & sewer rates until possibly the next meeting in March.

In other business, the council authorized the delivery of Non-Binding Letters of Intent to purchase the property adjacent to the north end of the Hilliard Airpark.

The council approved a payable of \$7,005 to Court Services for the Oxford Street Park Phase IV of the FRDAP Grant. This is for repairs on the basketball court and add one set of pickleball lines to the court.

The council also approved paying town hall employees and public work employees for 4 hours to work during the Hilliard Town Clean-Up event.

The next meeting of the council will be Thursday, March 2 at 7 p.m.
