Help to Sponsor a 4-H Student Farmer

Garrett Bennett, 13, of Yulee, was the recipient of a goat back in 2020 with help from the Nassau County 4-H and Nassau County Farm Bureau. In January 2022, Garrett met with the Farm Bureau Board of Directors and presented them with a book of his accomplishments with his goat and now many other animals. Garrett has special needs and being in the 4-H program and receiving his first goat, has made a huge impact on his life. Garrett has recently opened his own farm called Half-Pint Dairies, Quality Goats & Products. "We are a small operation now but have great potential for growth," said Garrett. "I have grown my herd to 6 goats, 20 ducks and 5 geese. Two years ago, I would not have thought this would be possible for me to achieve. I've found a new joy with my animals and I've learned so much."

He recently attended the Florida State Fair in Tampa and showed his goat, ducks and geese. The expense was difficult but with donations Garrett was able to attend. Another thing Garrett has learned through the study of learning about his goats is that goat milk is great for Garrett. He milks his goat, Nala, each morning and shares that it is a new skill for him. "We get my food from Nala every 12 hours. She is my primary source of nutrition as I live on a feeding tube," continued Garrett. "I





am basically allergic to most food and require special medications to be able to digest foods such as carbohydrates, starch and sugars."

Before he got Nala, he was struggling to gain weight and keep his metabolic conditions under control. He provides the best nutrition possible to Nala because everything she consumes eventually comes back to Garrett in her milk. For the first time in many years, Garrett is now thriving.

What a great story of encouragement. Garrett was dwindling away health wise and now he has such a desire to learn more and do more. Garrett could still use our support as he continues to grow his business. Farming is not a cheap business. To find out more about

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their final meeting of February. The first order of business was the final reading on Ordinance 2022-01. The ordinance, which concerns an ordinance relating to public right-of-way; making findings; vacating public right-of-way within the proposed Greenbrier PUD with the

Town of Hilliard; and authorizing recording of a certified copy of this ordinance. The council approved the ordinance. The Greenbrier PUD is the property located off of US 1 south of Winn Dixie and also borders Henry Smith Road in Hilliard. The property

is a total of 161.25 acres. The total build out will be 350 single family homes.


There was public comment from two persons. Jason Bergendahl, an employee with the Hilliard Public Works Department, approached the podium to just thank the council for the compensation that he (& the department) recently received from the town. "This is a great help for my family and I just wanted to personally say thank you!"

Mike Cole, who wears many hats throughout the county, first spoke as a board member of the Nassau County Economic Development Board. "There are some really good prospects looking all around Nassau County and several on the westside," said Cole. Second, Cole reminded the council that he is also a Commissioner on the Nassau County Ocean Highway and Port Authority. "I wanted to remind the council that the OHPA does bonds if you need help with any projects," added Cole. Final word, Cole also is Chair at Keep Nassau Beautiful. "Keep Nassau Beautiful will be hosting a Free Tree Giveaway on March 12. I believe people can get up to

your upcoming Town Clean Up."

"We will be having a Hilliard Action Committee meeting February 28th, if you would like to come," said Council President John Beasley.

"I'll be there," answered Cole.



The next agenda item was the approval of the Public School Concurrency Proportionate Share Mitigation agreement between the Nassau County School District (NCSD), the Town of Hilliard and Hilliard Equity's Resources, LLC, for the Greenbrier PUD. The site plans for the Greenbrier PUD have been sent to the NCSD, showing the district how many homes there will be and an estimate of how many children (students) will be living there. This way the NCSD can begin to plan where they need to build new schools to accommodate for more students. And in turn, the Greenbrier owners will have to pay a certain amount of money per student.

Hilliard Parks & Recreation Director Gabe Whittenberg requested approval to hire a part-time worker, Terry Gardner, to assist with the after school care. The council approved the request.


Public Works Director Ritchie Rowe advised the council that the town had received two bids for the mowing contract for the town: 1. No Weeds Landscaping, \$88,880; and Dixon Tree & Lawn Service, \$70,000. "Both

provided necessary documentation. I recommend Dixon Tree & Lawn with the quote of \$70,000.00," said Rowe. The council approved the recommendation.

The council approved change order #5 in the amount of \$1600. "This is the project ongoing under Georgia Street," said Councilman Kenny Sims. "This is why the sidewalks haven't been repaired in that area yet, as the work is not complete."

Council President John Beasley requested permission to talk to Callahan about the July 4th fireworks. The council agreed.

During public comment, Hilliard resident Brent Newton advised the council that there has been a large amount of fast cars on Lee Street. "I live on Lee Street and have three small children. My children enjoy playing outside," said Brent. "I'm really concerned about the speeding on our road. Could we maybe put speed bumps down, signs, flashing lights, anything?"

Town Clerk Lisa Purvis advised the council that so far the town has received approval on two of the projects that were sent to the legislature: Oxford Street Force Main; and the 6th Street Paving Project.

The next meeting will be held Thursday, March 3 at 7 p.m.

As always...that's just my opinion!










The Big Story of the Bible

If you buy commercially produced eggs (grocery store) then store eggs in your refrigerator. If you have hens and do not wash the eggs, then store eggs at room temperature. If storing these eggs in the refrigerator, wash them first.



Why the difference? Eggs have a natural protective coating – cuticle. It prevents bacteria from entering the egg. This natural protective coating is removed when eggs are washed. In the United States all commercial eggs are washed and sanitized and must be refrigerated. Refrigerated temperatures at or below 40 degrees Fahrenheit

slows the growth of bacteria and helps prevent bacteria from penetrating the shell. Eggs can be stored in the refrigerator for up to 5 weeks.

Unwashed eggs can be stored at room temperature for up to 21 days.







It is the end of February and income tax filing season is going on. By now, you should have received your W-2 forms. Keep on the lookout for additional documents such as 1099-INT (reports interest from bank accounts

or other investments); 1099-DIV (reports dividends earned from investments); 1098-T (issued by qualified educational institutions to report tuition paid, scholarships, grants);

There are three other important letters/

forms that will be mailed to you. Two are from the IRS, and one is from the Marketplace - Healthcare.gov.

The IRS is sending Letter 6475 to recipients of the Third Stimulus Payment. Please read it! This letter will help you determine if you need to claim the third economic impact recovery rebate credit on your 2021 tax returns.

The IRS will also send Letter 6419, 2021 advance CTC (Child Tax Credit). The letter will include the total amount of advance Child Tax Credit payments

taxpayers received in 2021 and the number of qualifying children used to calculate the advance payments. Keep this and any other IRS letters about advance Child Tax Credit payments with your tax records.

> Families who received advance payments will need to file a 2021 tax return and compare the advance Child Tax Credit payments they received in 2021 with the amount of the Child Tax Credit they can properly claim on their 2021 tax return.

Form 1095-A will be mailed to you if you received health insurance from the Marketplace. You must have this form to file your income






