
viewers can cancel at anytime.



The Callahan Town council met last Tuesday night due to the Monday President's Day holiday. The first agenda item was the consensus of the council for the road closure of Mickler Street Saturday. March 16 from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. for The Old Farmhouse Springtime Market. The council approved the closure.

The next item was Resolution 2024-R02 which concerned a donation for the West Nassau High School Women of Influence. Taylor Bass and Abigail Cartrette, representatives from the Women of Influence organization, gave a presentation to the council at the February 5 meeting. The council approved a donation of \$500 to the Women of Influence from

In closing comments, Callahan Mayor Randy Knagge advised the council that the Economic Development Board held a Business Retention Expansion meeting here in our Fire Station conference room. "It was a packed house with approximately 20 people in attendance. There was an opportunity for networking together and a full agenda," said Knagge. "It is always good to see the cities and county come together and collaborate. There was also a meeting last week about the upcoming fireworks. This year's Fireworks show will be held on Thursday, July 4 from 4 - 9:30p.m. with lots of local bands performing."

Council President Ken Bass advised the council on February 17, Stations 4 and 5 held CPR classes here at the Fire Station. "We have also had 9 more people who have joined and five of those are already qualified," said Bass. "We are looking to send our outdated equipment to the Dominican Republic."

The next council meeting will be held Monday, March 4 at 7 p.m.

Dear Taxpayers:

Did you know that you can pay your annual property tax bill in four quarterly installment payments? Breaking the tax bill into installments can make the payment of taxes easier to manage. It is important to note that if your taxes are paid by a mortgage company or through escrow, you should <u>not</u> apply to pay by installments. Mortgage companies are required to pay taxes in full during the November discount period.

The installment process, as outlined in Florida Statute 197.222, requires that the total amount of estimated taxes be greater than \$100. Similar to the regular tax billing process, the installment plan includes discounts on each quarterly bill paid on time. The combined discounts for the installment plan calculate to just over 3%. This is a great savings if you typically pay your taxes between December and March each year! If you prefer to take advantage of the full 4% discount for November payments, then you may decide that the installment method does not work best for you. Once you are enrolled in the installment plan and make the first payment you are only entitled to the discounts set forth in the plan.

The deadline to apply for the installment payment plan is April 30, 2024. Applications are for the  $\underline{\text{upcoming } 2024}$  tax bills.

You can submit your application electronically on the Tax Collector's website: www. nassautaxes.com. No paper form required! Search for your property and click the link "Apply for the 2024 Installment Payment Plan". If you prefer to print an application, they are available on our website. You can submit paper applications by mail or drop off at any of our four office locations listed below.

- First Installment Payment: One quarter of the total estimated taxes discounted at 6%. Payment is due by June 30th. Failure to pay the first installment will result in automatic cancellation of the installment plan.
- **Second Installment Payment:** One quarter of the total estimated taxes discounted at 4.5%. Payment is due by September 30th.
- Third Installment Payment: One quarter of the total estimated taxes, plus one half of any adjustment based on actual taxes due, discounted at 3%. Payment is due by December 31st.
- Fourth Installment Payment: One quarter of the total estimated taxes, plus one half of any adjustment based on actual taxes due, no discount. Payment is due by March 31st.

It is believed by most biblical scholars that the book of Galatians was the first book written by Paul the apostle. I mention that fact because that means that in the very first book, Paul writes he is trying to drive home to us a cardinal truth. Death is inevitable. Unless the rapture takes place, our lives will end at our appointed hour on this side of eternity. The separation of death is hard on loved ones. What goes inside a love box:

- 1. Your Will

  - 3. Investment Information.
- 4. Life Insurance Policy Who to call and their number.
  - 5. Car and/or other titles.
- 6. Banking information list your banks, account numbers, safe deposit box number and location.



other any information that your loved ones will need to know. For example: Do you own another house somewhere? Are you part owner of something? Have you co-signed a loan for someone?

8. A list of all your debts.

As things change make sure you update the information in your box. Put your box inside your fireproof safe. If vou do not have a safe, consider getting a safe deposit box at your local bank. Tell a couple of your loved ones the location of the key, and the bank it is at.

My mom, prior to her death, hand wrote a list of her belongings and the contents of the rooms of her house that she bequeathed to each of us six kids. We appreciated the love and care she put into it for us. Because she decided, we did not have to.

Your love box is another way to finish well. It will be your final. tangible, "I love you."
