Callahan Discusses Fireworks

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first meeting of March. Hilliard Town Council President John Beasley approached the podium to discuss the July fireworks. "I just wanted to come tonight and see if you (Callahan council) are still okay with sharing the July fireworks show with us (Hilliard council) at the fairgrounds again? "The fireworks show will be on Saturday, July 2, if that's okay with you all," said Beasley. "As with everything else, the prices have increased, however, they would cost even more if we chose to have the show on July 4th. The cost of the same show we had last year is \$30,000, which is \$15,000 for both towns. We hope to have some food trucks to come and join in as well as opening up the fairgrounds for seating and restrooms."

The Callahan council was on board with all the plans thus far and will pay their share of \$15,000. The councils (Callahan & Hilliard) plan to have a joint meeting in April or early May to get the final plans ironed out.

Town Manager Mike Williams advised the council that the town attorney has looked over the Meridian

Waste contract and it all seems to be in order. "The contract is for another 3 years with no increase in the first year," said Williams. "If you (council) are in agreeance with the contract, the item will be placed on the next agenda to move forward with signing the contract."

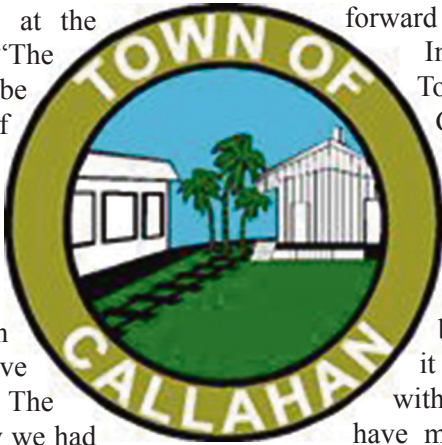
The council agreed with moving forward with Meridian.

In closing comments, Town Clerk Shawna Gugliuzza, advised the council that she had been contacted by a group that would like to start up a vendor market at the rail bed. "They would like it to be a daily event with vendors and also have music and food trucks on Fridays," said Gugliuzza. "I just wanted to get the council's take on something like this."

After much conversation, Councilwoman Ashton Vargus requested that the item be put on the agenda for the next meeting with a spokesperson from the group to come and speak to the council about this.

Gugliuzza will have the item added to the agenda for the next meeting.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, March 21 at 7 p.m.

The Hilliard Town Council met Thursday night for their first regular meeting of March. The first order of business was a question from a Hilliard resident. "I just have a question and I've received mixed answers to the question. So I thought it best to come to the meeting and ask the council," said Hilliard resident, Earnie Wine. "I need to know if I can build a mother-in-law suite on my property. I have an

aging father and would like to have it for him."

The council referred the question to Land Administrator Janis Fleet. "I have emailed Mr. Wine several times. This is a case of asking the question in a different way," said Fleet. "Our code states an accessory structure or dwelling unit is acceptable. I think the code needs to be updated to make it more clear as these types of additions are becoming customary and very common, and a

great idea."

Wine was directed to move forward on his plans by the council.

The council set a workshop with Tim Norman of Mittauer & Associates, Inc., the town's engineering firm, to discuss Infrastructure Requirements for Individual Lots. The workshop will be held Monday, March 28 at 7 p.m.

The next item concerned the council approval to make the first payment to Utility Service Company for the Meter

Maintenance contract, as the work is completed. "We are in a 5-year payment plan with them, with the first payment now, and another in October," said Town Clerk Lisa Purvis. "The next payment will be October 2023."

The following item concerned a Capital Budget item for the Parks & Recreation Department. "The pool is in really bad shape and needs new mar site sooner rather than later," said PR

Repent for the Kingdom of God is at Hand

Greetings brothers and sisters of the west side. We need to look over our lives and make sure that we're asking God for forgiveness. We are repenting for not obeying God's word and the things we've done wrong. We often overlook the seriousness of the offenses that we commit. Sometimes we hurt others and ourselves by our actions. John The Baptist preached the Kingdom of Heaven and taught us to repent. He was the forerunner for Jesus Christ; he came preaching God's word preparing the way for the Savior. He preached what the Jews had never heard, not even from the Prophets; it was a cry for change. We are standing in the shadows of John with the same message today that Jesus is soon to come, and we must repent and be ready.

Our minds change when repentance is from the heart and behavior follows. Jesus' central message was to preach repentance for the kingdom of God is at hand. The word repent simply means to turn around. We have seen military movies where soldiers march in one direction and then preformed an about-face and marched in the opposite direction. Repentance can be viewed as having a change of mind, which then changes your path in life. So, repentance is a perfect example of what happens when you come to Christ. You no longer reject Christ but believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of the living God. You do a spiritual about-face, which changes everything in your life. Not only do you change your mind about Christ, but you change your mind about sin, discovering what it means to honor God. You begin to develop that faith in the Lord God almighty. It's about a heart confessing Christ and seeking to honor Him in everyday life, preparing for everlasting life with God.

The Apostle Peter shares God's word in Acts 2:37-39 in a way that compels our hearts to change. *"When they heard his message, they were pricked in their heart and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men, and brethren, what shall we do? To be saved. Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. For the promise is unto you, and to your children and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call."*

God told Jonah to preach unto Nineveh a word that would compel them to change their mind and repent, and that's just what happened. Nineveh heard the word, and they prayed, asking for forgiveness. God granted mercy from the evil he would do upon the city. Jonah's message may have included conditions whereby the word of God could be rescinded. As evidence of His mercy to the Ninevites, God sent Jonah with a message to proclaim, to open the hearts of the people. Also, seeing their repentant actions, God repented of His threat of destruction. He had spared Jonah (Chapter 2); now He spared Nineveh. God's mercies are always unmerited; His grace is never earned. Repentance is never a work to be rewarded. But this is not to say that God does not respond to such repentance.

Today's a fantastic day; it's your day to repent and be born again. If we are willing to ask God to forgive us for our sins, he will forgive us. Grace and peace from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

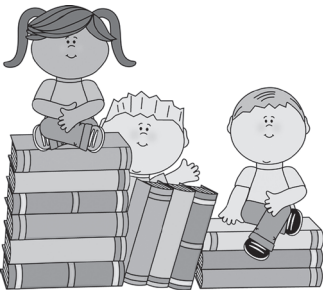

Sylvester Ross Celebrates 96th Birthday

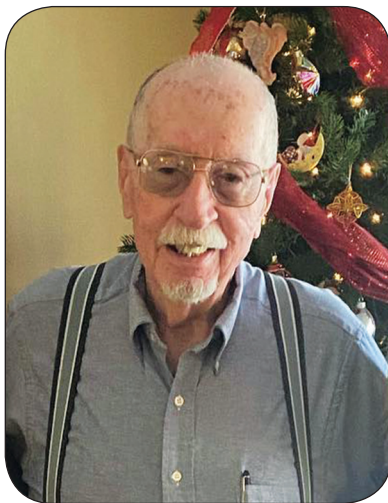

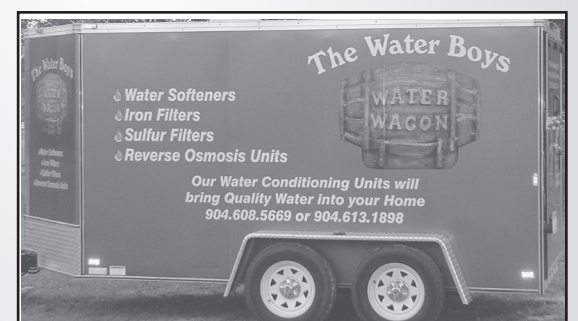
