Hilliard Recognizes Parks & Recreation Top Teams

The Hilliard Town Council met last Thursday night for their first meeting of March. Days prior to the meeting, Hilliard Parks & Recreation Director Gabe Whittenburg asked the top team members of the Parks recent basketball teams to be at the meeting. Gabe announced the teams and the members present came up and received a certificate from Mayor John Beasley. Many players were unable to attend but every team was recognized. "I want to say thank you to all of these players for a great job this season," said Beasley. "You all played hard and had fun doing it. We hope to see you all next year!"

The first agenda item was the discussion to consider Ordinance 2024-01, which is an ordinance relating to a Public Right-of-Way or Alley; making findings; Vacating Public Right-of-Way or Alley within or surrounded by Block 159; Plat of the West Portion of Hilliard; authorizing recording of a certified copy of this ordinance. The council adopted the ordinance on First

The next item concerned the approval of the Minor Subdivision application No. 20240116 based on the Planning & Zoning Board recommendation to approve. The property owner is Shawn Clark. The council approved the

application.

The following item concerned making a donation to the Nassau County Economic Development Board following the presentation at the February 15 meeting. Councilman Jared Wollitz made a motion to donate \$1,000 to the NCEDB. The council voted unanimously for the \$1,000 donation.

Public Works Assistant Director Cory Hobbs requested approval to transition Public Works employee Phillip Bouchillon from introductory/ probationary to regular full time. The council approved the request. Hobbs also requested approval for the Capital Expenditure for the purchase of road millings for the northwest quadrant streets. The council approved the Capital purchase.

Town Attorney Christian Waugh advised the council regarding Form 6 Compliance and Litigation. "The form is different from what you normally fill out," said Waugh. "I just wanted you to be aware of it."

The next two items were approved which were also Capital funded items: approval of ADAPCO, payable for Project name: Mosquito Sprayer in the amount of \$12,470. The next item was the approval of Battle Armor Designs,

Callahan Soccer Club Finally Gets Permanent Lights!

I am so grateful for the opportunity to speak on the topic of the Callahan Soccer Club. Nassau County Parks & Recreation Director Jay Robertson, along with County Commissioners held the official ribbon cutting of the new LED lights at the Callahan Soccer Club fields last Thursday.

The lights, that are now operational, are a culmination of many moving parts and hardworking people coming together for the benefit of the children and the community. I previously said the soccer club was founded around 1991, starting with roughly 50 players. That is hearsay on my part as I have no physical proof or testimony to rely on. I can speak to the history I have witnessed, when I started playing at the club in 2005. We used to have parents get in their cars and turn on their high beams to complete practices or scheduled games.

My father, David Hood, was president for 10 years from 2005-2015. Leanne Martinez was the next President for 8 years from 2015-2023. So, I have seen the club grow and we are arriving at a finish line. The race David ran culminated in financial stability and a concession stand building from the county. We used to have three giant igloo coolers that we sold canned drinks, water, and Gatorade from. We used four long white tables to set up chips, candy, and a grill to serve hotdogs and hamburgers on. David built a board of people he could trust and spread the love of soccer each year, getting our numbers over 200 for the first time and kept it growing every year.

that had solid footing. She worked to get us the non-profit designation which helped us obtain more sponsorships and donations from businesses. She increased our community outreach to local businesses in our area and hosted our first Vendor Market. She worked alongside the county and is known as the face behind the lights because she fought her entire 8 years to make that improvement. My favorite memory is when she encouraged our parents and children to show up to a County meeting in their uniforms to help cheer her on as she physically showed the county official who was truly asking for the lights. The message was loud and clear: the improvement of the club, the lights, were not for the President and the Board...they were for the children, first and foremost.



In the fall of 2023, I made the controversial choice to cancel the season. We have had the Fall and Spring season for years now. My reason for doing so, was to work with the county to improve the field conditioning by bringing in dirt and spreading it. The county provided seeding and used this off time to get our lights operational. I learned a lot in doing this and will only improve from here on.

The club is celebrating its biggest season yet of 330 players plus their families. The lights and the concession stand building are greatly appreciated by our community and we love our city and county for helping us. Something to think about for the future, the 2026 World Cup is being hosted by the USA, Canada, and Mexico. The last time this occurred soccer exploded in the states.

> The future is bright for CSC because of all the past Board Members, Volunteers, Coaches, and our Players. I look forward to forming partnerships with our County Officials, our sister Clubs, and other sports organizations across the county.

In the Kitchen... Instant Pot Corned Beef

2 cups water

1 (12 fluid oz.) can or bottle beer

4 cloves garlic, minced

1 (3 lb.) corned beef brisket with spice packet

Combine water, beer, and garlic in a multi-functional pressure cooker (such as Instant Pot). Place trivet inside. Place brisket on the trivet and sprinkle spice packet on top. Close and lock the lid. Select high pressure according to manufacturer's instructions; set timer for 90 minutes. Allow 10 minutes for pressure to build. Release pressure carefully using the quick-release method according to manufacturer's instructions, about 5 minutes. Unlock and remove the lid. Transfer brisket to a baking sheet, cover with aluminum foil, and let rest for 10 to 15 minutes.

He Is Risen!

There's plenty of evidence that Jesus died on the cross. The people of Jerusalem saw Jesus on the cross, and they knew where he was buried, and three days later, He arose from the dead. The tomb was empty, which we know to be Resurrection Sunday. The disciples and the Romans knew it, and the Jewish leaders also knew it. Jesus had predicted that this would happen many times to his disciples as he was preparing them to preach the gospel, for God sent him to give his life as a ransom for all humanity, to redeem us back to the Father.

Jesus Christ's resurrection is undoubtedly the Foundation of Christian faith. The resurrection of Jesus Christ has given all Christians a new sense of identity. 




