Spring Lake Residents' HOA Covenant Changes Looming

Spring Estates' Lake Covenants for the Home Owner's Association were filed in 1988 in Nassau County and expired in 2018. In an effort to "Revitalize" the Covenants, the Board of Directors (BOD) hired Property Management Company in August 2020,

a Property Manager and an HOA Attorney. This was to complete the "Revitalization" process taking about one year. A Board member indicated there was a letter sent to all homeowners advising that a Property Management Company was being hired; however some homeowners never received such a letter. On August 24, 2020, Mr. Davis of Premiere Florida was added to our Association in the State of Florida as a Registered Property Management Agent for Spring Lake Estates. His duties include maintaining post office box, all work for Board during "Revitalization", invoicing, correspondence, estoppel letters, and paying bills. He was paid \$3,000, and would do inspections at a cost to our Association of 149 lots x \$3.50/month or \$6,258 a year if he were retained.

The homeowners were told of the "Revitalization" at the Annual Meeting on January 19, 2021; copies of the "Revitalization" were made available and we were told that the process was being handled per the governing documents in the Florida Statutes Chapter 720. At the meeting we were told that suggestions and changes from homeowners would be due by February 7, 2021.

A second meeting was hurriedly called for February 24, 2021 for the BOD to discuss changes. There was no audience participation with the exception of 3 minutes per homeowner.

The Property Manager will be inspecting each lot per its directives. Since many of the Covenants are old and



out of date, it's not known how the older portions can be enforced. The Property Manager used an example at the meeting of a hose left across your driveway on an initial inspection and still across the driveway on a second inspection. He was asked by a homeowner, "What would the punishment would be?"

The answer he gave was, "There are other ways to encourage people to make changes!"

On March 2 Spring Lake residents received an announcement that a meeting will be held, Tuesday, March 9, 2021 via Zoom, (the link can be found on the Spring Lake Estates home page) of the Proposed Changes of the Management Company with the Property Manager along with an attorney.

A meeting to vote on these changes has been rescheduled for Tuesday, March 30. Residents are encouraged to vote "NO" on the Revitalization. It would require a majority (76 votes or 50%+ 1) of "NO" votes for there are other options for the Homeowners without a Property Management person.

however they believe it should remain to be run by the members, NOT a management company. Revitalization should be completed with 2021 rules, not 1988. If there are Board members that cannot fulfill their obligation, for any reason, there are several people willing to step up and volunteer. Let's work towards a solution that we can all agree on without being forced to use 33 year old rules.

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first meeting in April. Mayor Matt Davis read a proclamation proclaiming the month of April as Water Conservation Month in the town of Callahan.

The next item concerned the town joining with the town of Hilliard to have joint fireworks. Councilwoman Jacquelyn Fleming advised the council that she wanted to get the council's thoughts on joining with Hilliard for a fireworks show. The council had a joint workshop with the Hilliard council March 18 in Hilliard to discuss joining together for a fireworks show for the community. "While Hilliard had their entire council at the workshop, we did not. There was a lot of conversation and different ideas being tossed around concerning the fireworks," said

Fleming. "July 3rd was the main date discussed and having the display at the fairgrounds. I feel like everything was just left there. I make motion that we send a letter of intent to join with Hilliard into a half and half agreement. The letter will also include any planning for the event will be jointly."

If yours is one of them, you have one of the earliest recorded surnames: Alder, Banks, Chipp, Dodson, Edwin, Frost, Gerald, Horne, Long, Mantle, Peret, Skipper, Starling, Still, Talbot, Tison and Warden, just to mention a few.



Fishing is Great...Get Out There!

Trout seems to be a hot subject as of right now. Top water early and late, then throw subsurface once the sun peaks. Move on to the typical grubs late to midday. If live bait is your thing, a fresh live shrimp on balsa rigs are the most consistent live bait tactics at the moment. Mud minnows on a jig head pitched into docks are bringing out some mighty fine fish as well. As mentioned above, early morning and late evenings are producing best.

Next, where's the red fish? I guess the better question would be where aren't they? All of our Intracoastal waters are holding good numbers of these fish. Quartered crab, fresh shrimp and mud minnows won't steer you wrong. Pinch point's in creeks and oyster beds are really holding great quality reds. Wait for the water to recede the grass and focus on natural funnels. Simpson Creek and Saw Pit are fantastic locations to start.

Lastly Sheepshead are still stealing the spotlight. They're stacked up around docks and bridge pilings and at times loaded at the jetties. Look for a consistency with clean water and moving tides. Before you go, check out the awesome catches made by these fine young fishermen and fisherwoman. As always, we look forward to seeing you on the water!



In chapters 12 and 14 of 1 Corinthians, Paul addresses Spiritual gifts. He talks about everything from hospitality and administration to prophecy and speaking in tongues. But in between these two chapters, he gets to the passage you most likely hear at weddings: 1 Corinthians 13. Here is most quoted part: "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all

things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." 1 Corinthians 13:4-8a, ESV

Paul makes it a point to say, "You can have all the gifts in the world, but without love they are useless." Today in our society, we are given the impression that love is something that you feel; it just happens to you. I would argue based on this passage and others, that love is something you do.

Let's run through some of the things mentioned above and see if they are more of something we feel or something we do. Do we choose to act patiently and act kindly toward someone, or do we feel patient or kind toward them? Do we choose not to be jealous of others, not to boast about others in arrogance or do we feel those things? Do we not insist on getting our own way not act irritable, not resent others or feel those things? Do I choose to rejoice or not or is it a feeling I have? Do I bear all things, believe all things, hope all things and endure all things or do I feel those.

The idea of love as an action is true in ministry, in friendship and especially in marriage. We stand at an altar, in front of our friends, our family and God and promise to have and to hold, from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death do us part. And then a few years later we discover that what we once felt doesn't feel the same and we decide this "isn't working" and we have "grown a part." And we get a divorce. Marriage isn't easy and it's not for the faint of heart. But when we view love as a feeling, it becomes something that we feel, something that happens to us, something that comes and goes. 



They say, "You can't do that, you're in a wheelchair."

"Oh yeah? WATCH THIS!" said Tim

Hilliard resident Tim Conner starting riding dirt bikes when he was just 3-years-old. By the time he was 11, it was time to go motocross racing. After years of successful local racing and lots of late nights in Ernie Millan's shop fixing what broke; it was time to go get the pro license. The year was 2000, and things were rolling right along for Tim. The following year, on what seemed to be a normal autumn morning everything changed. It was Tuesday morning... September 11th.

Thirteen months later, feeling the need to serve his country, Tim Conner enlisted in the United States Marine Corps. After 6 years of service to our country, including a 2007 tour in Iraq; it was time for this proud Marine to come home.

Back home meant back racing. So after shaking off the dust, it was time to get back into the thick of it. There was a big race in Texas in mid-March 2010. Off they went. During practice, Tim came off a big jump and something went wrong. He crashed... he crashed hard. Before the paramedics arrived, Tim already knew something wasn't right. He had no feeling in his lower extremities. Tim Conner had suffered a major spinal injury which cost him the use of his legs. You might be thinking, oh my, what a sad story. Well, to some degree it is. Bear with me, it's about to get much better.

A few years back during a radio interview, Tim said, "While I was lying there, I thought to myself, oh well...here's another challenge. I'm alive and I'll get through it."

Tim's getting through it alright. He's doing a lot more than just getting through it...ATTITUDE: Unchanged. Ask anyone



who knows Tim Conner; this guy is loaded with piles of smiles. He's always good company and has a love for life that's through the roof. Just like before, PHYSICAL Health: Unchanged. Since his injury, the long workouts have continued right where they left off. He's even competed in several International Paralympics cycling events with great success.

About 4 years ago Tim's daughter, Jada, had a little 50cc Yamaha and she wanted to go motocross racing. Tim had now become what we commonly refer to in the motocross world as a PEE-WEE Parent. When the gate drops, they scatter like ants and run all around the track picking up the kids, brushing the dirt off, and cranking their bikes. It's hilarious! Tim did the same with Jada, but he rode around on an ATV. One day, he thought to himself: Since I'm riding all over the track on this thing, I might as well race it. After several "eventful" races. Tim realized it was not for him. There are just too many obstacles on a motocross track. Turning the ATV was easy. Jumping it? Not so much.

Meanwhile, there's this race announcer guy that had been, and continues to be; all over Facebook posting pictures and videos of motorcycle and ATV flat track racing. This unnamed person, kept posting and posting ...flat track racing. Now I'm not saying that all those flat track FB posts caught Tim's eye but one day he showed up for a race at the Bullring in Ocala. The Southern Dirt Track Association and all its competitors welcomed Tim with open arms. Tim's racing void was filled...or was it? While he was having a

blast racing his ATV he wanted more. His past racing career was on a motorcycle, not an ATV. How could he possibly get back on a motorcycle without the use of his



the mock up, they wanted to build a system that would keep Tim's legs in place while he raced. I thought about Tim's request for the use of my bike for a long time... maybe 2 seconds. The next day he showed up, we load the bike up, and it was off to NASCAR land. Tim had also been speaking with Jeremy Lanier, one of the owners of the Southern Dirt Track Association. After hearing Tim's plans Jeremy decided to donate a bike and build an engine for it. The list of people that have helped Tim on



legs? Was Tim finally faced with a challenge he couldn't overcome? It sure seemed that way.

The other day, out of the blue, Tim called me and wanted to borrow my flat tracker. It seems as though

he had been talking with a cat named Jason Griffin. Jason is an adaptive sport pro. He has no right arm yet he races flat track motorcycles...on the professional level. They wanted to take my bike up to a fab shop in North Carolina that was known for its work with NASCAR. Using my bike for

this project is long, very long. The flat track racing family can't wait to see Tim Conner out on the track again. I can't wait to see that ear to ear smile! Tim Conner will make Flat Track history as he returns to racing in March 2021! We'll keep you updated!




