### Callahan Charter Changes Discussion Continues

The Callahan Town Council met Monday night for their first meeting of March and it was a long one with a lot of discussion on one subject. The first order of business was a proclamation read by Mayor Marty Fontes. The proclamation was for the Take Stock in Children Program, which has been in Nassau County for 23 years. Through those years, they have given scholarships to 611 students from the program. This innovative and transformative program is a life-changing opportunity for students who would likely not graduate from high school and go to higher education. Currently, the organization is mentoring 114 Nassau County students that are enrolled in the program. Each student must sign a contract committing to abide by the program's fundamental rules: stay in school, maintain good grades, attend weekly mentor meetings, remain drug and crime free and exhibit good citizenship. Mayor Fontes presented the proclamation to TSIC be considered on each in hopes that we

Business items discussed were the approval of Resolution 2020-R03 which concerned signing and completing the State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loan preparation. This is a portion of a grant the town received in the form of a loan.

Councilwoman Janet Shaw advised the council that she would like to see Mahoney Lane, Brown Street and also Robinwood Circle be paved.

Mayor Fontes advised Shaw to get RFP bids (3) and include each street to

The next agenda item concerned setting their joint meeting with the Nassau County School Board. The council agreed to meet Monday, March 30 at 7 p.m. at the Fire Station conference room.

The discussion concerning Town Charter changes continued. discussion concerns two issues: hiring a Town Manager and not having a mayor; and changing the Town Clerk position to a hired employee versus and elected official. Mayor Fontes began the discussion by asking the council if they were all in to do this or not? "If you are not 100% wanting to make the changes then we need to move on and forget it," said Fontes.

The Charter currently includes the town with an elected Mayor and elected Town Clerk. The council and mayor are considering stripping the Mayor of his title (Chief Executive Officer and Chief Administrative Officer) and relinquishing those titles and duties to the Town Manager, which is currently Mike Williams. The council would still remain with five council persons; within those five persons a (ceremonial) mayor can be voted on to serve. A ceremonial mayor would present awards, read proclamations, represent the town at functions, appearances at different places, etc. However, the mayor in this position would also have a vote, whereas the current mayor cannot vote.

The other charter change the council is considering is the Town Clerk positon which is now elected. They propose to change it to a hired employee position. Any Charter changes that are proposed must be voted on by the Callahan city limit residents.

After much conversation, Town Attorney Jeb Branham advised the council and mayor that he would draft a few different examples of ordinances for the council to review.

The next meeting of the council will

#### WILD WEST TRAIN RIDES


Since the launch of the St. Marys Express in 2013, one of the most popular train excursions has been the Wild West Express which returns to St. Marys on March 7 and 14. Each Saturday, the first train rolls out at 10 a.m. with other departures at noon, 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. Both Saturdays feature Wild West characters aboard each train and a showdown shoot-out at Frontier Land.

Before and after the train rides, passengers will be able to tour the St. Marys Railroad Museum and watch model trains make their way around the landscape.

The Wild West Express is the first St. Marys Express excursions of 2020, and entertainment director Barbara Ryan said the Wild West theme was brought back by popular demand.

"This is our 7th year running the Wild West Express, and every year, tickets sell out earlier," Ryan said. "All ages enjoy the excitement of the Wild West. It's a real adventure and a great escape from the stresses of modern day life."

For the March 7 and 14 events, St. Marys Express continues to offer the popular "At The Throttle" experience whereby people (16 or older) get to



actually run the diesel locomotive.

To ride the Wild West Express open air cars, tickets are \$20 for adults and \$14 for children 12 and under; children 2 and under ride free on laps. Rides in the diesel locomotive are available for \$50 per person, and the At The Throttle experience is \$150 per person.



# Fish Talk

### Sheepshead and the El' Cheapo

Sheepshead have been very spotty over the last two weeks. With that said, no one has really been able to get out due to the weather. This weekend is not looking any different at the moment but that can quickly change. If you do decide to give these pesky convicts a shot. Grab yourself a few Reel Habit Sheepshead Jigs or just use your favorite Carolina rig and get out there. If you're interested, the El' Cheapo Sheepshead Tournament out of Mayport is this weekend. Hopefully by now if you're participating, you have secured your bait. It's been a nasty year with all this crazy weather and our bait shops haven't been able to keep fiddlers with any consistency. As most of you know, the El' Cheapo is the largest family-oriented sheepshead tournament in the world and it's not too late to get registered. Sign up to fish at the meeting this Friday or just show up for the raffles and enjoy the family atmosphere.

Look for sheepshead to be spread out inshore as the warm winter has kept them scattered out. Try quartered crab near oyster beds as well as vertical jigging with fiddler crabs over deep structure. One of the most common practices over the years have been setting up parallel with the jetties and dropping down on top of the rocks. Both the river and even the ocean side at times can be very productive. The biggest thing will be to find the safest spot to anchor. Chum when you can to give yourself a huge advantage. Medium weight rod and reels with 20 to 30 pound power pro as your main line will provide you the best sensitivity in my opinion. If you are tying straight to a jig head, use a 20 pound fluorocarbon leader. Up size or downsizing leaders will depend on water clarity. For instance, if the water is cloudy, I'm using a minimum of 20 pound leader line. If the water is very clean, I'm downsizing my tackle to keep the fish from spotting my line. Weighs will be determined by tidal flow and water depth. Keep in mind you want the lightest weight that can be used, as long as I can feel bottom or the structure I'm fishing.

With sheepshead come the black drum and whiting. They're all starting to show up all over our region. Look for the deeper holes on the falling tides to be holding our bigger fish. You can use a variety of cut baits and tackle. To be more productive, use the quartered blue crab, fresh clams and fresh shrimp. Tip them on your favorite fish finder rig or jig head. Again, sheepshead is still spread out inshore so keep that in mind for this weekend. If the weather permits, offshore reefs are probably going to be the absolute most productive areas to target. If you choose to do so, please pay attention to the wind. It really can turn a lake into a nasty washboard. Good luck and I hope you all have a great weekend. Remember, take a kid fishing! Tight lines everyone...

### **Genealogy Tidbits**

Claude Arpen

In 1834 a young David Ogilvie (1819-1881) came to Northeast Florida from Edinburgh, Scotland. He married Elizabeth Braddock in 1845 and had two sons David and William. After Elizabeth's death, he married Louranah Geiger in 1857. They had nine children: David Jr., William, Edwin, Steven, Morgan, Thomas, Margaret, Janet and Elizabeth.

The Ogilvies were in the timber and cattle business in northern Duval County. The original homestead was located near the present day Jacksonville Airport. David is buried in the Ogilvie Cemetery located at the end of Hargett Road off Lannie Road in northern Duval County. Lannie Road is named after Lannie Oglivie (1880-1961) a grandson of David. Many descendants of this family still live in the area today.





#### Q: What can you tell me about the star magnolia? SD

A: Star magnolia, Magnolia kobus var. stellate, is the hardiest of the magnolias. It is a small tree or large shrub, 15 to 20 feet tall with a 10 to 15-foot spread. This tree commonly forms multi-stems like a crape myrtle. Star Magnolia makes a wonderful patio, lawn specimen or accent tree. Lower foliage can be removed to show off the trunk and to create more of a tree-form. I believe it would be beautiful as a smaller

tree. Otherwise, the persistent lower branches and oval to round form lend a "large bush" look to the plant. The white to cream colored flowers are produced in spring before the leaves appear, even on young plants. Flowers



are usually not as sensitive to cold as Saucer Magnolia, but they can still be injured if cold weather arrives during flowering. It should be grown in cold-hardiness zones 5-8b (Callahan, Hilliard and Bryceville areas).

It requires little pruning except for removing some lower limbs if turning it into a more tree shape. Star magnolia tolerates most any type of soil and light conditions. There are a few cultivars: Centennial - some pink in petals: Jane Platt - new, superior type with many pink petals when opening; Keiskei' - flowers purplish on the outside; Rosea (Pink Star Magnolia) - pale pink flowers; Rubra (Red Star Magnolia) - purplish flowers, darker than Rosea; Waterlily - pink flower buds, white flowers, flowers larger with narrower petals. The "Little Girl Hybrids" have an upright habit and flower later than the species, thus avoiding frost injury in most

years. They include Ann, Betty, Jane, Judy Randy, Ricki and Susan.

#### Q: What are some good fig varieties for our area?

A: Common types are recommended for Florida because they do not require pollinators to produce fruit. Desirable characteristics include a closed eye to prevent insect and water entry, a long fruit stem allowing fruit droop which prevents moisture entering through eye, green skin color results in less bird damage and nematode-resistant rootstocks.

Some potential choices are: 'Celeste', 'Brown Turkey' and Green Ischia. "Celeste' is also called Celestial, Blue Celeste, Little Brown, or Sugar. This variety is widely grown in the South. Celeste produces small, purplish-bronze to light brown fruit with closed eye, which ripening from mid-July to mid-August. 'Brown Turkey' is often sold as Everbearing, Harrison, Ramsey, Lee's Perpetual, Eastern Brown Turkey, or Brunswick. 'Brown Turkey' rivals 'Celeste' in popularity. It produces moderate size fruit

of bronze color with medium eye opening, which ripens in late July until late fall and will fruit following severe



freeze damage. 'Green Ischia' is sold as Ischia Green, White Ischia, Ischia Verte. 'Green Ischia' is not widely grown but green color and closed eye make it desirable. Fruit ripens late July to early August, but it does not fruit following a severe freeze. #### Q: I see this large, scary, thorny plant all over Northside beach here in Fernandina Beach. What is it? JK

A: It is blooming now, so it is easier to identify. It is probably the yellow thistle, Cirsium horridulum. The genus Cirsium means prickly herb in the composite family, in Latin, horridulum means rough or unadorned. These definitions certainly tell you the yellow thistle is not the most attractive of plants, but I was fascinated with it as I went out to Northside beach to see it. Yellow thistle is quite large, probably 1 foot or more across and at least as tall. It had several native pollinators visiting it although I am not sure my phone photos did justice to it. Yellow thistle is a native wildflower for most of the Southeastern United States. It can be problematic in pastures and for this reason, it is considered a weed to farmers and ranchers. There are some states where

it is listed as an endangered or threatened species: Connecticut, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, and Rhode Island, There are three varieties of the species in the United States - vars. horridulum, vittatum, and megacanthum. Variety horridulum is



the only one with yellow flowers, but it can also have red to purple flowers. If you look closely. you can see a slight

purple color around the edges of the white flower. The other remarkable thing about this thistle is it hosts the little Metalmark butterfly. I will have to visit occasionally to see if I can discover this caterpillar and maybe the adult butterfly. We take so much for granted, we just need to stop and look at the flowers more often – I think it will bring a smile to your face.
