"Follow the Water Program" Wins Excellence Award

The UF/IFAS Extension Northeast District which includes Nassau, Baker & Duval Counties, has earned an Award of Excellence in Environmental Stewardship from the Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC) for its "Follow the Water Program." All three Districts were recognized during the NEFRC's Annual Awards Luncheon.

The "Follow the Water Program" was created and launched by Extension Agents, including Nassau County's Extension Director Dr. Taylor Clem, in the Northeast Extension District to educate residents on watersheds and protecting Florida's water resources. The program includes a 4-day educational tour that "follows a drop of water from southern Georgia to the Gulf of Mexico". Each step along the tour allows participants to explore nature, develop a deeper understanding of relationships to watersheds, and explore the efforts to enhance and protect Florida's water resources. Participants begin their tour in the headwaters of the Suwannee River – the Okefenokee Swamp. The Suwannee River basin is one of the least developed watersheds in Florida and is the largest undammed river in the Southeastern U.S. However, watersheds, including the Suwannee

River watershed, and their water resources are threatened by increased urbanization and consumption.

Participants learn about the swamp and its vital role in shaping and maintaining watershed health. The second day explores Florida's unique karst geology and its influence on the Suwannee River. Additionally, participants meet with agricultural researchers and water management district representatives to learn about the strategies to protect the watershed. During the third day, participants step outside the Suwannee River watershed to explore an urban watershed -Branch. Sweetwater **Participants** explore innovative projects that help restore watershed health, including manufactured wetlands, brownfield site redevelopment, and low-impact design principles, which help mitigate nonpoint source pollutants associated with urbanization. On the final day, participants meet at the Nature Coast Page 2 of 2 Biological Station in Cedar Key, to learn about coastal ecosystems and the impacts upstream water quality has on our vital fisheries in the state.

FTW has been offered six times since 2020 with 58 participants completing the training, including alumni events.

This year's team has five seniors, Kevin Thomas, Brandyn Seldomridge, Malcom Warthen, Braydon Holley and Nate Vroman. Top scorer for the season was junior, CJ Hall with a total of 372 points followed by senior Warthen with 321. The team also includes DJ Alderman, James Foster, Ethan Garland, Javone Lee, King McMillian, Anthony Neu, Justin Bennett, and Christopher Church with Head Coach Myron Saunders and Assistant Coaches Carlous Hall, Dennis Alderman and Holden Whiten.

Congratulations Flashes!

The program provides approximately 32 hours of education per person valued at \$92,000. Participant surveys showed a sustained increase in connectedness to water, and after one year, 13 of the 14 respondents reported changes in environmental-related behaviors, including one participant who began a career in water resource communication. Collectively, participants reported sharing FTW information with 2,209 individuals. The FTW team will host 2024 training and alumni events, but also plans on providing training programs to other extension agents and communities interested in adopting $similar \, programs. ``The \, Follow \, the \, Water$ Program unveils the role we all play

within our watersheds. By improving connectedness Floridians have with water through this program, we know they'll increase their likelihood of adopting water conservation practices and sharing that information with others. This is important because every decision, every action, no matter where we live, is linked directly to water; the driver of Florida's social, economic, and environmental well-being," stated Dr. Taylor Clem.



In the Kitchen...

1 lb. chopped fresh broccoli

1 ½ cups cubed, cooked chicken meat 1 (10.5 oz.) can condensed cream of broccoli soup

Broccoli Chicken Divan

⅓ cup milk

½ cup shredded Cheddar cheese

2 tablespoons dried bread crumbs 1 tablespoon butter, melted

Preheat the oven to 450°. Place broccoli in a saucepan with enough water to cover. Bring to a boil and cook until tender, about 5 minutes. Drain. Place the cooked broccoli in a 9 inch pie plate. Top with the chicken. In a bowl, mix the soup and milk, and pour over the chicken. Sprinkle with Cheddar cheese. Mix the melted butter with the bread crumbs, and sprinkle over the cheese. Bake in the preheated oven until casserole is bubbly and the top is golden brown, about 15 minutes.







The Disconnect

Sometimes it seems like there is a disconnect between what we believe and how we behave. Sometimes we say we believe the Word of God, but our actions don't match up with what we profess. Why is that? Why do we confess one thing and do another?

Paul articulated this feeling so well in Romans 7:19-25a., "For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no

longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. So, I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?"

Paul presents the problem, but then shows us the solution: "Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" Praise God that He has chosen to deliver us from ourselves.

So how do we apply it? The New Testament is loaded with verses instructing us in following God. But I think the first step is to believe Him and trust Him. "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:19. What greater need do we have than to be rescued from ourselves? "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7. The God we serve can be trusted. And the place He wants us most is dependent on Him. "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." 2 Corinthians

This is the place where it all comes together. When we are fully dependent on Him, when we look the weakest from the outside. He is stronger. That is when we follow Him with all of our self. 



In my case, the truck is almost one thousand miles past due for an oil change, I need to do some spring planting at the house, and then, there's my hair. I need a haircut...badly. My current hairdresser couldn't find an opening in her schedule, so I got an appointment where my mom used to get her hair done – a bona fide, Steel Magnolias-style beauty shop.

I'm not talking about a fancy hair salon or the corner barber shop, I'm talking about the classic southern beauty shop. The kind where hair is teased, bee-hive 'dos are created, but most importantly, the place where the very fabric of a community is woven.

As soon as I entered the shop, I experienced a rush of memories from my younger days. First, the jingle of a small set of bells sounded when I walked in, letting everyone know someone new had entered. The sticky sweet smell of hairspray mixed with the slightly chemical scent of hair color met my nose. I heard scissors clicking and the drone of a game show on the television. I saw cut hair in various colors carpeting

the floor, foil strip on ladies' heads, and felt warm drafts from bowl-style hair dryers. But the friendly banter amongst everyone is what stood out most to me.

"Hey, Hon, can we help you?" one of the hairdressers asked when she noticed me waiting at the front counter.

"Just a quick trim," I replied.

"We can do that! Just hold tight, and we will be with you in a few minutes."

Excited and relieved, I found a seat. A stack of magazines sat on the table beside me. This is Nassau County for crying out loud, so I expected to see publications like "Woods and Wetlands" or "Life on the Land" maybe even an issue of "Progressive Farmer." Instead, I observed stacks of old issues of "Southern Living" and "House Beautiful."

Soon, one of the hairdressers walked to the seating area and waved at one of the older ladies there. "Mrs. Pearl?" the beautician said, "How are you today?"

Then it hit me, Mrs. Pearl! She was my third-grade teacher. She had to be in her late 80's, and neither of us had recognized the other. After a few later, another beautician called for "Mr. Jack" who was Mrs. Pearl's husband. Apparently, he got a haircut every six months whether he needed it or not. Seemed to me he enjoyed the beauty shop ladies doting over him.

I glanced at my watch and realized "just a couple minutes" had already turned into 25! I wasn't even in the chair yet! I asked how much longer it would be. "There were just a few ahead of you in line, Hon," was the reply I received. If



I had only known.

My thoughts raced as I mentally listed all the things I needed to do... had I picked up Brianna's band uniform from the dry cleaners, when was Jacob's Reading Fair project due, when was my husband's art show with his students, would we go to Chicago to see John's father for Spring Break this year, and on and on. I thumbed through one of the magazines to calm myself. As I did, there were pages, or parts of pages, missing. I looked at the Table of Contents and figured out all the recipes were missing. Almost without fail, every recipe had been ripped out. Now I knew where all those secret sauces came from!

"Bethany, dear, how have you been?" I heard someone say. I saw she was one of our neighbors when I was a child. Then, I actually stopped and looked at the other people in the shop. I knew them all! One lady babysat me when I was little. Embarrassed I had focused only on myself since entering the shop, I greeted all of them.

Eventually, Brenda told me I was next. Turns out, she and I went to high school together. I hadn't seen her in

oh, so many years. After we graduated high school, she worked in the beauty shop along with her aunt, who owned it. Years later, she purchased the shop and had been running it for some time. As she cut my hair, I listened to the different ladies talking about their lives. Some talked about their medical problems, or what their grandkids were up to. I learned the local gossip about who just got married, how the food tasted at the new restaurant, and who would be making (sugar) cane syrup this year. Before long, my haircut was finished. I paid Brenda and said goodbye to the others in the shop. It had been an hour and a half since I had heard, "We will be with you in just a few minutes".

I paused with the realization. When I had taken my eyes off myself, the time had flown by. As I headed for the door, I thought about a quote from Eleanor Roosevelt. She said, "Great minds discuss ideas; average minds discuss events; small minds discuss people." While there may be some truth in her statement, there was also much wisdom and value in what I had just experienced.

I know those folks could have discussed ideas and events, but they were choosing to share information about themselves. For the good or the bad, beauty shop talk is one ingredient that flavors small town life.

Until next time and until I need my hair trimmed again, we will be learning and living our Naturally Nassau life.

Early Voting Now Through March 16

Early voting for the Presidential Preference Primary Election started Wednesday, March 6 and will run through Saturday, March 16, from 9 a.m. - 6 p.m. Nassau County voters can vote early at five conveniently located early voting sites throughout the county. Pursuant to section 103.101(4), Florida Statutes, please note that since the Florida Democratic Party only provided one candidate nominee, the Presidential Preference Primary ballot for the Florida Democratic Party is not needed to determine party voters' preferred party candidate nominee. Florida is a closed primary state. Only



voters registered with the Republican Party of Florida have a ballot in this election. Available Westside Locations Include:

Hilliard Community Center – 37177 Pecan Street, Hilliard Walter Junior Boatright County Building - 45401 N Mickler Street, Callahan

"Voters may choose to vote at any of the five early voting sites, regardless of where they live in the county.", states Janet H. Adkins, Nassau County Supervisor of Elections. Voters are encouraged to bring their current and valid photo and signature I.D. to vote. Each early voting site has a Secure Ballot Intake Station for voters to return their vote-by-mail ballot during voting hours. Mail ballots deposited in each Secure Ballot Intake Station are returned daily to the Supervisor of Elections office for processing. State law does not allow Secure Ballot Intake Stations to be available on Election Day.

To view wait times for each early voting site, download the Vote Nassau FL elections mobile app. Android and iPhone users can now download this app on their app store, free of charge.
