NassauTRANSIT Offers Same-day Paratransit Service for Seniors, Disabled





Fish Talk Fishing is Hot!

Yep, it's that time of year again! We have bluefish in our inlets along with whiting and pompano on the beach. Just about anywhere you go you will find "bluefish." Although they aren't the best table fare, bluefish can put up a heck of a fight on light tackle. If you've ever targeted them, you'll probably remember hooking bait by the tail. Bluefish are known for leaving you stripped from rigging due to their sharp teeth and feisty nature. They make a decent smoked fish dip to some but I'd rather pass ha!

Next, whiting are running the beaches and are stacked up in the rivers. They can be caught on the first of the outgoing tide. You can target them with fresh dead shrimp in the river or sand fleas on the beach. Use a standard fish finder rig or a double tandem rig with 2/0 or 3/0 circle hooks. Clean water will be the key so make sure to keep that in mind.

Moving on, big female gator trout are slowly making their way into our creeks. The key to those bigger fish will be to catch them early as they come off the flat. Trout will go into a daytime pattern that involves deeper water. If I'm fishing early morning, I will always throw my top water skitter-walks and subsurface baits such as the shadow rap. This allows me to cover a lot more water and gives greater chances of a trophy fish. Later in the day, I'm throwing plastics on a jig head covering deeper structure.

Redfish are still schooled up and even after all the pressure from the recent tournaments. They can be found on cut baits in the shallow creeks. Seeing is believing and I've seen some nice sheepshead being caught from the jetties in the St. Johns and St. Mary's inlets. There's also a great bite going on offshore. Lock down some bait, stay away from the crowds and get after them.

Lastly, pompano are being caught in great numbers. Hit the beach on the high outgoing tide and focus on clean water. Use fresh dead shrimp or sand fleas on a pompano rig and size your weight to your current. Many people are using the new sputnik weights to help stay on bottom. With that said, look for a good bite this weekend on an early outgoing tide. Our high will be around 6:30 a.m.

Be safe guys and I hope to see you on the water!

WARNING of Scams, Price Gouging

With Floridians hunkered down to prevent the spread of the coronavirus, Attorney General Ashley Moody and Agriculture Commissioner Nikki Fried are trying to focus attention on scams and price gouging that stem from the crisis. Scams include text messages claiming to offer victims yet-to-be-approved stimulus package money, crooks going door-to-door in lab coats posing as federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention employees and

seniors being offered free COVID-19 test kits in exchange for personal information. Also, as of Monday night, Moody's office had received 628 complaints about price gouging related to products such as cleaning supplies, hand sanitizer and face masks. "At a time like this, to charge them exorbitant prices for the things they will need to keep their families safe is disgusting and unlawful," Moody said. "We will continue to pursue them throughout the duration of this crisis."



The Callahan Council meeting will be held, as normal, on Monday, April 6 at 7 p.m. Social distancing will be practiced during the meeting.





Here Comes the Bus!

School meals are coming to a bus stop near you starting this Wednesday April 1! FREE meals (for 2 days) for any child 18 and under will be delivered every Monday, Wednesday & Friday at a stop right outside your door!

Visit our website at: (www.nassau. k12.fl.us/Page/3217) to find routes and download the 'Here Comes the bus app' to track your meals to your stop!

We will still have our 2 drive thru sites (Callahan Elementary & Hilliard Middle-Senior High School) open Monday – Friday and will be serving some of our students' favorites, including hot meals. So please continue to visit us there if you have transportation. We will be reducing hours to 11 a.m. - 1p.m. to accommodate these new routes.

Please review these important reminders:

Any child 18 and under can receive meals for FREE. They do not have to live in that area or attend that area school.

Parents will be allowed to pick up meals for children at the bus stop. Just verify their students name and school for us to confirm on our roster. We encourage parents to do this to allow less children congregating at the stop.

We must practice social distancing at the bus stops. Please no congregating at the stops.

A food service worker or bus driver will open the door and greet you and determine how many children's meals



are needed.

All food will be bagged together... you will need to take everything that is packed in the bags.

The number of bags needed will be placed on the bus step for the parent or child to grab.

Keep Food Safe!

All meals served on the bus routes will be cold. Sandwiches are intended to be eaten that day. Please refrigerate all food immediately and discard any leftovers within 3 days. Keep foods safe by keeping cold foods cold. Most importantly, sandwiches, milk, cheese and yogurt should be kept at 41 degrees or below.

Some items may be served in a slightly frozen state; this will help us to maintain temperature sensitive items at proper cold temperatures during the bus route. Always wash your hands with soap and water before eating anything!

Sharing Smiles at Life Care Center







Traders Hill Farm's vision began in 2013 with landowner Dick Blaudow's backing to experiment with aquaponics and educate others. It quickly turned into so much more. Located in Hilliard, Florida, Traders Hill Farm started as a beta system housed in an abandoned chicken barn and evolved into commercial production with one food-safe greenhouse that opened in 2015, followed by another in 2017. Using aquaponics, Traders Hill Farm produces more crops by growing year-round, all while using 90% less water than traditional farming and

utilizing sustainable processes resulting in fewer negative outputs like water pollution and soil loss. Traders Hill Farm's products are free of chemical pesticides, herbicides, and fungicides.

The farm produces more than 500,000 pounds of food annually, and with upcoming onpremise expansion, plans to soon be able to produce

1 million pounds annually. Under Nazarro's direction, the company launched VeggieBoxx, a way for consumers to enjoy Traders Hill Farm's romaine lettuce and other leafy greens. Customers can place their orders online at www.veggieboxx.com.

"It's a great option for people who like to know where food comes from

and to support local businesses," Nazzaro said.

Traders Hill Farm currently maintains 32,000 square feet for growing plants. The farm has 54,000 square feet under a roof covering for the packhouse, seed rooms, and aquaculture operation, and employs 23 people. Traders Hill Farm earned the SQF3, the highest food safety rating a food industry business can achieve.

Ensuring consumers' safety and

employees' education, the company requires all employees to take the ServSafe food handling course, which restaurants also require. It covers facility and product cleanliness, hygiene, proper food handling, and food safety guidelines.

It's an asset, as Traders Hill Farm provides leafy green veggies to popular restaurants in Southeast Florida, Central Florida, and Southern Georgia. More than 95 restaurants and more than 30 institutions including schools get their food from Traders Hill Farm.

The Amelia Island-Fernandina Beach-Yulee Chamber of Commerce recognized the company as its Medium Business of the Year and the Farm Bureau recognized it as a sustainable company.



JAMES 'KEITH' MERREY




